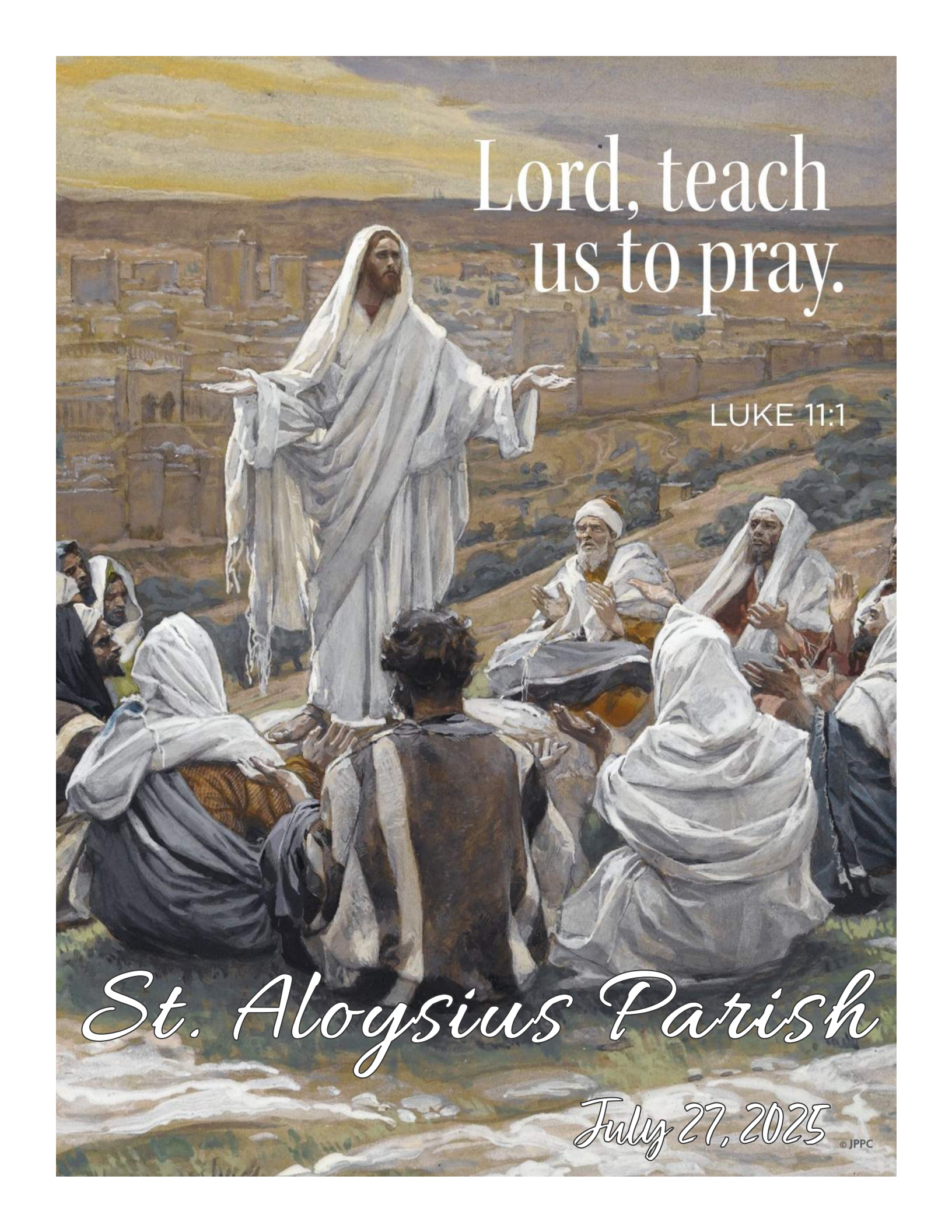

Dear Parishioner

"Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples'" (Luke 11:1).

There are methods of prayer, and many authorities offering to teach how to pray. Thus, we can readily identify with the disciple who asked, after watching Jesus at prayer, "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1). They wanted to know how Jesus set about prayer, in his own heart. Like them, there are times when we ask ourselves, "Is God really listening to our prayers?" or "Things have turned out so wrong for me, where was God when I was pounding on the door of heaven with my prayers?"

St Luke's Gospel is notable for its prayerful focus. More than the other Evangelists, he draws attention to Jesus praying, whether alone, on the hills, or in the garden of olives. Yet, it seems that Jesus' disciples had a problem with prayer. What were they talking about among themselves that day? We do not know. They had seen Jesus pray so often and noticed the confidence and fervor with which he prayed. Perhaps they wanted to know what they had to do to ensure that their prayers were answered. Maybe there was a special way of speaking, a special way of pleading one's case. Sometimes they saw Jesus kneeling, other times looking up to heaven. Was there a special posture that helped in saying the right prayer and getting the right answer? And so, they come to Jesus with the request, "Lord, teach us to pray."

Today, for us and for the disciples then, Jesus in His prayer teaches us how to pray. Pay great attention to what his attitude teaches us. Quite often, our Lord feels the need to meet face-to-face with his Father in prayer. St. Luke emphasizes this point when writing the Gospel. Somewhere else, we find a piece of a conversation between his Father and Jesus. It was when He was being baptized in the Jordan River, and as Jesus was in prayer, "a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased'" (Luke 3:22). It is an intermission in a lovingly affectionate dialogue.

Because one of the disciples, unnamed, which could mean any of us, realizing His attitude in prayer, he begs him to teach them how to speak with God. Jesus replies tenderly: "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name..." (Luke 11:2). The prayer consists of a son's conversation with his Father, who loves us so much.

It is notable that, today, the prayer Jesus Christ taught us may well be encapsulated in these two single words: "Our Father." The Christian prayer is eminently filial. And the Divine Liturgy of the Mass puts this prayer upon our lips when we are about to receive the Body and Blood of Christ. The seven petitions that it entails, and their own sequence, give us an idea of the kind of behavior we have to take on when we receive Holy Communion.

Tierra 101

¿Sabías que... Los huracanes son más fuertes cuando los océanos están más calientes.

El cambio climático está provocando temperaturas oceánicas más cálidas. La temperatura de los océanos proporciona más energía a los huracanes, lo que conlleva vientos más rápidos y categorías más altas. Una atmósfera más cálida puede retener más humedad, lo que resulta en lluvias más intensas y un mayor riesgo de inundaciones.

El cambio climático también puede estar aumentando la probabilidad de que los huracanes se intensifiquen rápidamente antes de tocar tierra, dando a las comunidades menos tiempo para prepararse.

Los efectos combinados del aumento de la intensidad, las precipitaciones y las marejadas ciclónicas contribuyen a que los huracanes sean más destructivos y costosos. La temporada atlántica de 2024 causó daños por valor de 182 000 millones de dólares y cerca de 500 muertes. Según la NOAA, 2024 también registró la temperatura media global más alta.

REFLEXIONES

“Así que Yo les digo: pidan, y se les dará; busquen, y hallarán; llamen a la puerta, y se les abrirá.” -Lucas 11:9

Jesús nos asegura que, si le pedimos, Dios se ocupará de lo que necesitamos. El problema es que nuestra cultura a veces confunde lo que realmente necesitamos con lo que simplemente queremos. La verdad es que muchos de nosotros necesitamos muy poco. Sin embargo, ¡usualmente queremos mucho más! La corresponsabilidad es simplemente ser agradecidos por todo lo que somos y tenemos, y compartir generosamente con los demás los dones que hemos recibido de Dios. La gratitud y la generosidad son dones que abren puertas a nuevas relaciones con los demás y con Dios.

Estimado Feligrés

“Un día, Jesús estaba orando y cuando terminó, uno de sus discípulos le dijo: ‘Señor, enséñanos a orar, como Juan enseñó a sus discípulos’”. (Lucas 11, 1).

Existen métodos de oración y muchas autoridades se ofrecen a enseñar cómo orar. Por eso, podemos identificarnos fácilmente con el discípulo que, tras ver a Jesús orar, pidió: “Señor, enséñanos a orar” (Lucas 11, 1). Querían saber cómo Jesús oraba en su corazón. Al igual que ellos, a veces nos preguntamos: “¿De verdad escucha Dios nuestras oraciones?” o “Las cosas me han salido tan mal, ¿dónde estaba Dios cuando yo llamaba a la puerta del cielo con mis oraciones?”.

El Evangelio de San Lucas destaca por su enfoque orante. Más que los demás evangelistas, él destaca a Jesús orando, ya fuera solo, en las colinas o en el huerto de los olivos. Sin embargo, parece que los discípulos de Jesús tenían un problema con la oración. ¿De qué hablaban entre ellos ese día? No lo sabemos. Habían visto a Jesús orar muchas veces y notaban la confianza y el fervor con que oraba. Quizás querían saber qué debían hacer para asegurarse de que sus oraciones fueran respondidas. Quizás había una forma especial de hablar; una manera especial de defender su causa. A veces veían a Jesús arrodillado, otras veces mirando al cielo. ¿Había una postura especial que les ayudaba a decir la oración correcta y obtener la respuesta correcta? Y así, acudieron a Jesús con la petición: “Señor, enséñanos a orar”.

Hoy, para nosotros y para los discípulos, Jesús en su oración nos enseña a orar. Presten mucha atención a lo que su actitud nos enseña. Con frecuencia, nuestro Señor siente la necesidad de encontrarse cara a cara con su Padre en oración. San Lucas enfatiza este punto al escribir el Evangelio. En otro pasaje, encontramos un fragmento de una conversación entre su Padre y Jesús. Fue cuando lo bautizaban en el río Jordán, y mientras Jesús oraba, “una voz del cielo dijo: ‘Tú eres mi Hijo amado; en ti me complazco’” (Lucas 3, 22). Es un intermedio en un diálogo lleno de amor y cariño.

Porque uno de los discípulos, cuyo nombre no se menciona, podría ser cualquiera de nosotros, al darse cuenta de su actitud en la oración, le ruega que les enseñe a hablar con Dios. Jesús responde con ternura: “Cuando oren, digan: Padre, santificado sea tu nombre...” (Lucas 11, 2). La oración consiste en la conversación de un hijo con su Padre, que tanto nos ama.

Es notable que, hoy en día, la oración que Jesucristo nos enseñó bien pueda resumirse en estas dos palabras: “Padre Nuestro”. La oración cristiana es eminentemente filial. Y la Divina Liturgia de la Misa pone esta oración en nuestros labios cuando estamos a punto de recibir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Las siete peticiones que conlleva, y su propia secuencia, nos dan una idea del comportamiento que debemos adoptar al recibir la Sagrada Comunión.

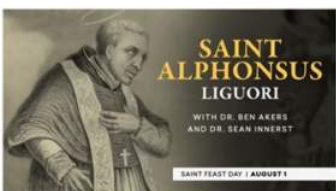
The Violinist: Stories of Solanus Casey

Did you know...

Hurricanes are stronger when oceans are warmer.

Climate change is causing warmer ocean temperatures. Warmer oceans provide more energy for hurricanes, leading to increased wind speeds and higher categories. A warmer atmosphere can hold more moisture, resulting in more intense rainfall and an increased risk of flooding.

Climate change may also be increasing the likelihood of hurricanes rapidly intensifying before landfall, giving communities less time to prepare.

The combined effects of increased intensity, rainfall, and storm surge contribute to more destructive and costly hurricanes. The 2024 Atlantic season resulted in \$182 billion in damages and close to 500 lives lost and 2024 is also recorded as having the highest average global temperature according to NOAA.

Our Father in Heaven, through the intercession of Our Lady of Prompt Succor, spare us during this hurricane season from all harm. Protect us and our homes from all disasters of nature. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

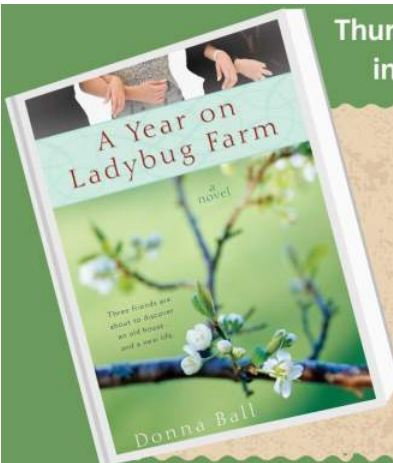

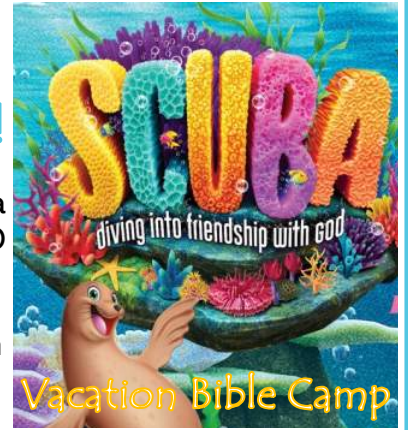


DIVE INTO GENEROSITY:
