Dear Parishioner

My paternal grandparents lived on a large farm in Smithmill, Pennsylvania. As a city girl, I enjoyed my visits to the country to see my grandparents as well as take part in the daily country chores. The day began by carrying heavy buckets of coal from the barn to the house. Soon thereafter, the smell of homemade bread baking in the coal stove permeated the house! Walking down the winding staircase to the root cellar to collect vegetables for dinner was also an intriguing adventure.

Although I loved the furry farm animals and massive garden, my favorite place on my grandparents' farm was the huge barn. It was no wonder I enjoyed conversing with Grandpa about this unique structure. Grandpa responded to my simple questions with lengthy answers, which always included Bible stories. Since I heard Grandpa's personal reflection on today's gospel many times over the years, his words are forever etched in my mind and heart.

"The rich man in this parable talks only about himself. 'What should I do? I have no place to store my crops. I shall tear down my barn to store all my grain. Then I can rest, eat, drink, and be merry.' Like the rich farmer, we are tempted to think that having large amounts of money and possessions will make us happy. However, no amount of money can protect us from illness, natural disasters, or accidents. Most importantly, no amount of wealth can secure our lives with God. It is not that God doesn't want us to save for retirement or future needs. It is all about our priorities; it should be about putting God first in our lives. It is about how we use the gifts God has given to us. Our lives and possessions are not our own. They belong to God. We are merely stewards of them for the time God has given us on this earth. The more we are willing to put God first in our lives, the more likely it is that we will begin to SEE God everywhere, especially those most in need. In the case of the rich man, he lost sight, not only of God but also of the needs of his neighbor."

Estimado Feligrés

Mis abuelos paternos vivían en una gran granja en Smithmill, Pensilvania. Como chica de ciudad, disfrutaba de mis visitas al campo para ver a mis abuelos y participar en las tareas cotidianas del campo. El día empezaba cargando pesados cubos de carbón del granero a la casa. ¡Poco después, el olor a pan casero horneándose en la estufa de carbón inundaba la casa! Bajar por la escalera de caracol hasta el sótano para recoger verduras para la cena también era una aventura fascinante.

Aunque me encantaban los peludos animales de la granja y el enorme jardín, mi lugar favorito en la granja de mis abuelos era el enorme granero. No me extrañaba que disfrutara conversando con mi abuelo sobre esta singular estructura. Mi abuelo respondía a mis sencillas preguntas con largas respuestas, que siempre incluían historias bíblicas. Como escuché la reflexión personal de mi abuelo sobre el evangelio de hoy muchas veces a lo largo de los años, sus palabras están grabadas para siempre en mi mente y mi corazón.

"El hombre rico de esta parábola solo habla de sí mismo. '¿Qué debo hacer? No tengo dónde almacenar mis cosechas. Derribaré mi granero para guardar todo mi grano. Así podré descansar, comer, beber y divertirme.' Al igual que el granjero rico, nos sentimos tentados a pensar que tener grandes cantidades de dinero y posesiones nos hará felices. Sin embargo, ninguna cantidad de dinero puede protegernos de enfermedades, desastres naturales o accidentes. Y lo que es más importante, ninguna cantidad de riqueza puede asegurar nuestra vida con Dios. No es que Dios no quiera que ahorremos para la jubilación o para necesidades futuras. Se trata de nuestras prioridades; debería tratarse de poner a Dios en primer lugar en nuestras vidas. Se trata de cómo usamos los dones que Dios nos ha dado. Nuestras vidas y posesiones no son nuestras. Pertenecen a Dios. Somos simplemente administradores de ellas durante el tiempo que Dios nos ha dado en esta tierra. Cuanto más dispuestos estemos a poner a Dios en primer lugar en nuestras vidas, más probable será que comencemos a VER a Dios en todas partes, especialmente en los más necesitados. En el caso de los ricos... "El hombre perdió de vista, no sólo a Dios, sino también las necesidades del prójimo."

TUESDAY, AUGUST 6TH

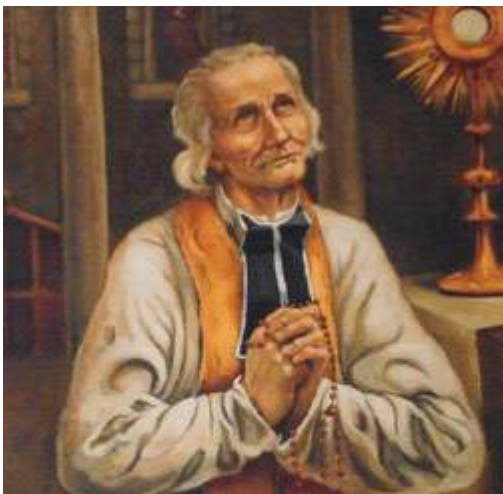

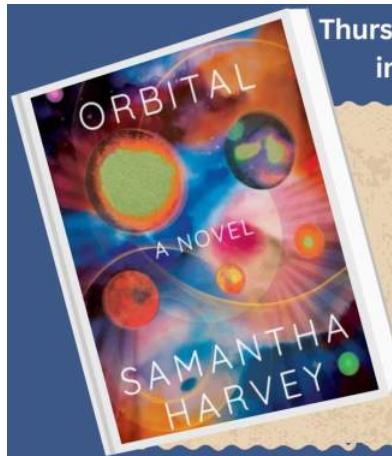

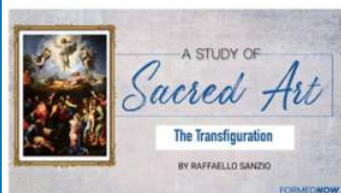
CAN YOU ADOPT A CHILD?

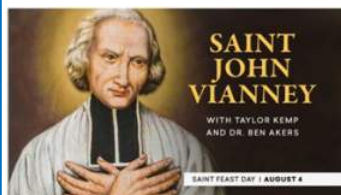
The Transfiguration | Sacred Art

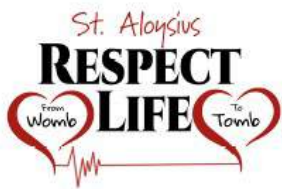

The Gospel message is contrary to modern culture, which continually tries to convince us that our joy comes from the material things we possess; that the more we acquire, the happier we will be. Jesus shows us that our true joy comes from our “invisible” gifts like love, mercy, and forgiveness. True joy comes from “emptying” ourselves, giving of ourselves rather than always taking. We are called not to hoard but to share. True joy comes from living a grateful and generous lifestyle; become more “God-centered” and less “self-centered.”
