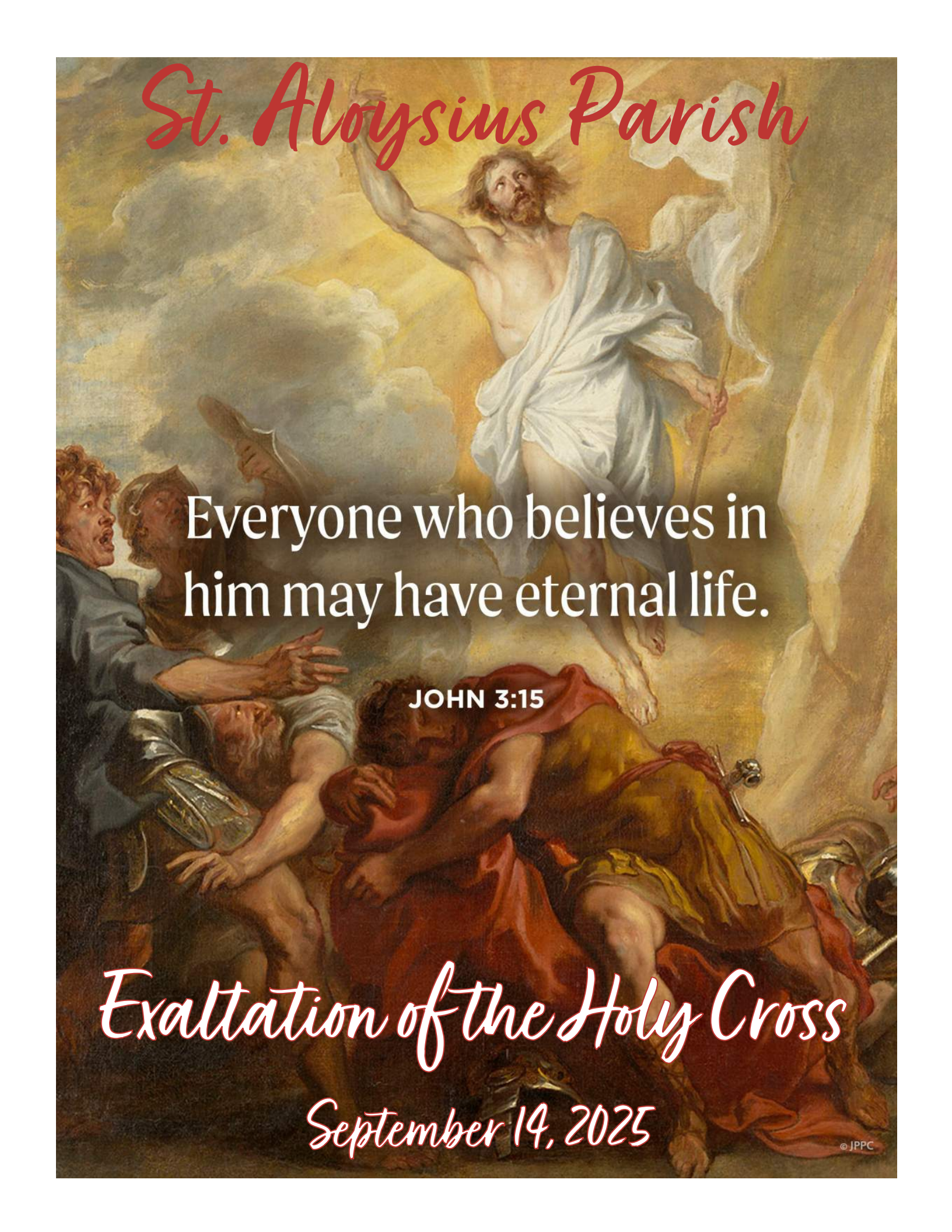

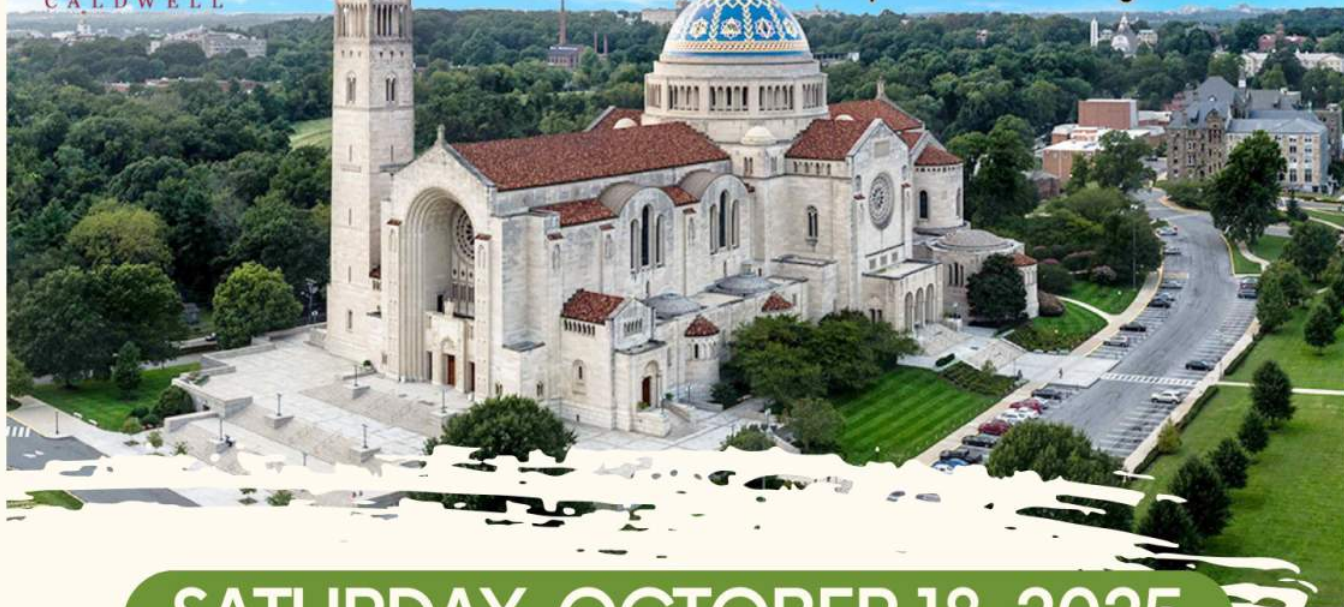

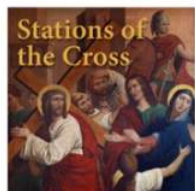

Stations of the Cross by Saint Alphonsus Liguori

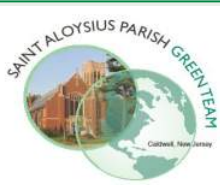

THINK GREEN

St. Francis of Assisi praised God for all creation in his Canticum of Creation, composed 800 years ago. Included in his prayer is:

"Be praised, my Lord,
for our Brothers Wind and Air
and every kind of weather
by which you, Lord
uphold life in all your creatures."

Today, greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide and methane pollute the air, which in turn contributes to global warming. Steps to reduce these harmful gases in the air are:

- Carbon dioxide: Reduce the amount of time you run your electronic appliances powered by fossil fuels and unplug electronics (TV, computers, printers, etc.) when not in use.
- Methane: Since food scraps thrown into landfills generate methane, compost food scraps to protect the environment and provide the resulting nutrient-rich soil for your plants.
