





Dear Parishioner

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers us the puzzling parable of the dishonest steward - a story that, at first glance, seems to reward cunning over virtue. But look deeper, and you'll find a challenge issued to all disciples - be wise, be intentional, and above all, be faithful in the small things.

The steward is not praised for his dishonesty, but for his shrewdness - his ability to act decisively in a moment of crisis. Jesus contrasts this with the children of light, who often hesitate, who sometimes fail to act with urgency when it comes to matters of faith. And so, we are invited to ask ourselves: Are we proactive in living the Gospel? Do we use our time, talents, and resources to build the Kingdom of God with the same energy the world uses to chase wealth?

The prophet Amos warns against injustice and exploitation, reminding us that God hears the cries of the poor. In our own lives, are we attentive to those on the margins? Do we speak up when silence would be easier?

St. Paul urges us to pray for all people, especially those in authority. In a world fractured by division, prayer becomes our bridge - uniting us in hope, in humility, and in the pursuit of peace.

This Sunday, let us recommit to being faithful stewards - not of worldly gain, but of grace. Let us be bold in our witness to our Lord, generous in our compassion, and wise in our choices. For in the end, we cannot serve both God and wealth. But we can serve God with everything we have.

May we be found trustworthy in the little things, so that we may be entrusted with the great.



Estimado Feligrés

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos ofrece la desconcertante parábola del administrador deshonesto, una historia que, a primera vista, parece premiar la astucia por encima de la virtud. Pero si profundizamos, encontraremos un reto para todos los discípulos: ser sabios, ser intencionales y, sobre todo, ser fieles en las cosas pequeñas.

El administrador no es elogiado por su deshonestidad, sino por su astucia: su capacidad de actuar con decisión en momentos de crisis. Jesús contrasta esto con los hijos de la luz, quienes a menudo dudan, quienes a veces no actúan con urgencia cuando se trata de asuntos de fe. Por lo tanto, se nos invita a preguntarnos: ¿Somos proactivos al vivir el Evangelio? ¿Usamos nuestro tiempo, talentos y recursos para construir el Reino de Dios con la misma energía que el mundo usa para buscar riquezas?

El profeta Amós nos advierte contra la injusticia y la explotación, recordándonos que Dios escucha el clamor de los pobres. En nuestra vida, ¿estamos atentos a quienes viven al margen? ¿Alzamos la voz cuando el silencio sería más fácil?

San Pablo nos insta a orar por todas las personas, especialmente por quienes ostentan autoridad. En un mundo fracturado por la división, la oración se convierte en nuestro puente, uniéndonos en la esperanza, la humildad y la búsqueda de la paz.

Este domingo, renovemos nuestro compromiso de ser fieles administradores, no de las ganancias mundanas, sino de la gracia. Seamos valientes en nuestro testimonio de nuestro Señor, generosos en nuestra compasión y sabios en nuestras decisiones. Porque, al final, no podemos servir a Dios y a las riquezas a la vez. Pero sí podemos servir a Dios con todo lo que tenemos.

Que seamos dignos de confianza en lo pequeño, para que se nos confíen las cosas grandes.







St. Padre Pio

St. Padre Pio was an Italian priest who was known for his piety and charity, as well as the gift of the stigmata, which has never been explained. Padre Pio became internationally famous. He was known for his piety, charity and the quality of

his preaching. He famously advised, "Pray, hope and don't worry." Pope John Paul II recognized Padre Pio as a saint on June 16, 2002. His feast day is September 23. He is the patron of civil defense volunteers, adolescents, and the village of Pietrelcina.


"Be praised, my Lord, for Sister Water who is very useful to us, and humble and precious and pure."
