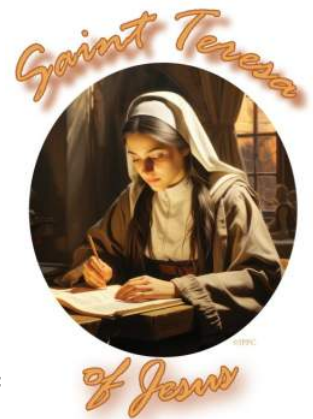

Saint Teresa of Jesus



St. Teresa of Jesus (also known as St. Teresa of Avila) lived in the golden age of Spain in the latter half of the 16th century. She is the foundress of the Discalced Carmelites, both the female and male branch. In fact, she is the only woman founder of an order of men.

St. Teresa is the patron of Spain, chess players, and those suffering from headaches.

Teresa is the author of significant spiritual works, most notably The Interior Castle, a guide to the mystical union with God. Her writings are known for their clarity and depth in describing the journey of the soul toward God.

In 1970, she was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Paul VI, a title recognizing her theological authority and profound understanding of the spiritual life. She was the first woman to receive this honor, which acknowledges the importance of her mystical experiences and writings.

Her Feast Day is celebrated on October 15th.

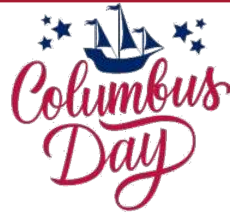



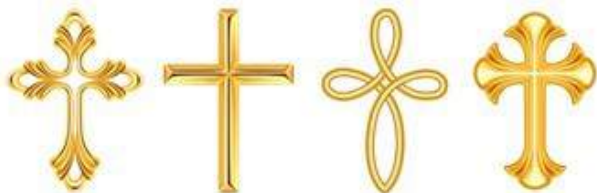

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults



As Baptized Catholics, we are called to share our faith and invite others to become fully initiated Catholics. The OCIA process is a spiritual journey and the formation process for welcoming adults to become part of our Catholic Church.

Who participates in OCIA?

- Unbaptized adults who would like to explore becoming Catholic or adults baptized in another Christian faith who desire to become Catholic.
- Baptized Catholics who want to receive the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and/or Confirmation.
- Catholics interested in deepening their relationship with Jesus.
