Dear Parishioner

In the Church's calendar, the Feast of All Saints and the next day, called the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed or All Souls' Day, are linked together and celebrated a day apart. This year, All Saints Day falls on a Saturday and therefore is not a Holy Day of Obligation. All Souls' Day is celebrated this Sunday.

The Feast of All Saints Day was instituted by Pope Boniface IV in 609 A.D. Pope St. John Paul II and Pope Francis added more canonized Saints than their predecessors. Each of the canonized Saints or group of Saints are given a special date in the Church's Liturgical Calendar. The day is usually determined by the day of the Saint's death, signifying their birth into eternal life. Just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

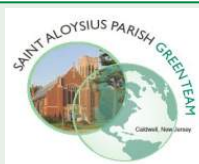
In the Liturgy of All Saints Day, the readings are taken from the prescribed readings from the Funeral Mass, consisting of 16 Readings and 12 Gospels. There is a close connection between All Saints, All Souls, and Funeral Liturgies. This closeness shows that the call to sainthood is not for a select group but is a call to all humanity to strive for holiness. This same closeness shows up in the suggestions of music being almost the same for all three days. This will be shown in our opening Hymn today, "For All the Saints" as a call to all of us to sainthood, which can be wrapped up in a familiar saying, "do ordinary things in an extraordinary way".

Tierra 101 ¿Sabías que...?

Las Naciones Unidas celebrarán su 30.^a Conferencia de las Partes (COP) del 10 al 21 de noviembre. Esta conferencia es una cumbre climática global que se celebrará en Brasil este año. Es uno de los eventos más importantes del calendario de la ONU para líderes mundiales y ambientales. Cada año, se centra en implementar medidas para reducir las emisiones de carbono mediante una transición justa hacia energías limpias y esfuerzos para limitar el aumento de la temperatura global a 1,5 °C.

El Papa León habló recientemente directamente sobre este tema en un discurso pronunciado para conmemorar el décimo aniversario de la encíclica "Laudato Si" del Papa Francisco.

Espero que las próximas cumbres internacionales de las Naciones Unidas, como la Conferencia sobre el Cambio Climático de 2025 (COP 30), escuchen el clamor de la Tierra. Animo a todos, especialmente a los jóvenes, padres y madres, y a quienes trabajan en las administraciones e instituciones locales y nacionales, a contribuir a la búsqueda de soluciones para los "desafíos culturales, espirituales y educativos" actuales (Laudato Si', 202), trabajando siempre con tenacidad por el bien común. No hay lugar para la indiferencia ni la resignación.

El Papa León concluye con una pregunta que nos concierne a cada uno de nosotros: "Dios nos preguntará si hemos cultivado y cuidado el mundo que él creó (cf. Gn 2,15), para el bien de todos y de las generaciones futuras, y si hemos cuidado de nuestros hermanos y hermanas (cf. Gn 4,9; Jn 13,34). ¿Cuál será nuestra respuesta?"

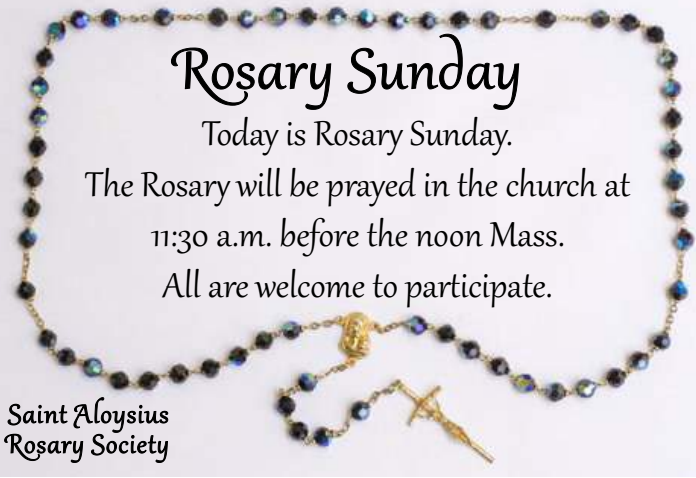

Earth 101 Did you know...

The United Nations will run its 30th Conference of the Parties (COP) from November 10-21. The conference is a global climate summit that will take place in Brazil this year. It is one of the biggest events on the UN calendar for world and environmental leaders. Each year, the focus is on implementing action to reduce carbon emissions with a just transition to clean energy and efforts to limit global temperature increase to 1.5 °C.

Pope Leo recently spoke directly to this topic in a speech given to commemorate the tenth anniversary of Pope Francis's Encyclical Laudato Si'.

"It is my hope that the upcoming international summits of the United Nations — the 2025 Climate Change Conference (COP 30), will listen to the cry of the Earth. I encourage everyone, especially young people, parents and those who work in local and national administrations and institutions, to play their part in finding solutions for today's "cultural, spiritual and educational challenges" (Laudato Si', 202), always striving tenaciously for the common good. There is no room for indifference or resignation."

Pope Leo concludes with a question that concerns each of us. "God will ask us if we have cultivated and cared for the world that he created (cf. Gen 2:15), for the benefit of all and for future generations, and if we have taken care of our brothers and sisters (cf. Gen 4:9; Jn 13:34). What will be our answer?"

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults



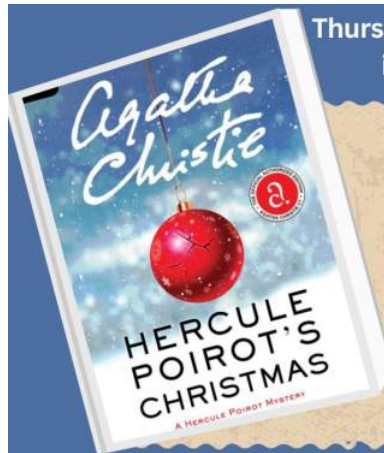
