## OUR MISSION STATEMENT

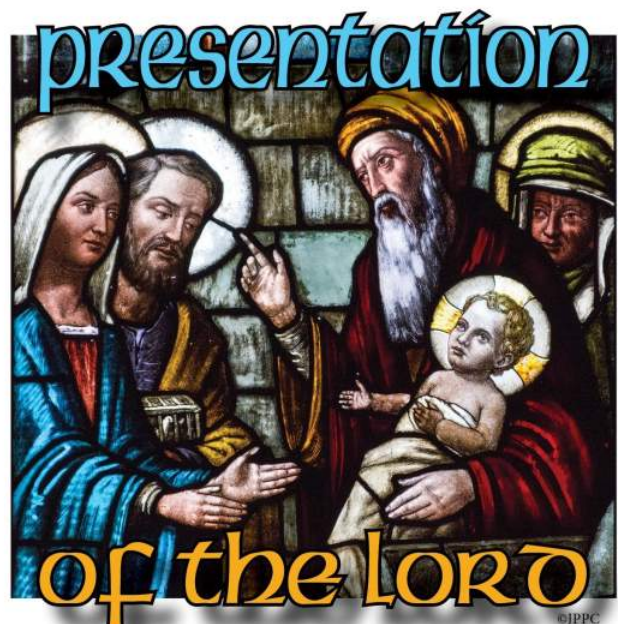

## Dear Parishioner

Today, we can picture ourselves standing with the crowd on the hillside listening to our Lord Jesus—the *New Moses who leads Israel, and all of us, to a New Promised Land*—proclaiming the Beatitudes. As He speaks, His loving, merciful eyes, full of compassion, are looking directly at those who are poor in spirit, who are meek, merciful, just, and whose hearts burn with longing to be filled with these great virtues. Our Lord calls them blessed.

In the first reading, the prophet Zephaniah tells us that God always had a special love and tenderness for the humble and the lowly. Zephaniah lived in a time when most of Israel had willfully turned away from the Living God. They broke their covenantal relationship by becoming sinful and depraved: idolatrous, sensuous, corrupt, unjust, self-seeking, and shaping their desires to transitory things that satisfied only for a moment. Doesn't this sound like modern times? In the United States, 76% of Catholics have stopped attending weekly Mass!

But wait—Zephaniah speaks of a small number of "humble and lowly," faith-filled people that he calls the "remnant"—the *anawim*—who stayed the course with God as their Divine Head, refusing to follow the ways of the world and the backsliders. All of us who cling to our Lord and to His Church in good times and bad, refusing to give in to the world and all that it has to offer, are part of that 24% ragtag group of modern-day remnants: the Catholic *anawim*.

As St. Paul says, we are the chosen ones that God chose to be fools in the eyes of the world to shame the wise, to be weak to shame the strong, and to be lowly and despised to shame the proud and arrogant. We may count for nothing in the world's eyes, but we can boast that our Lord finds us eminently worthy in His sight.

Today, let us ask for the grace of our Lord's Beatitudes to take deeper root in us. With our Lord's strength and His Holy Spirit, we can taste the joys of the Kingdom when, Christ-like, we choose love over hatred, mercy over resentment, humility over pride, trust over fear, and righteousness over recognition. If we stay the course, our Lord promises us a reward that will be great in Heaven. Our true happiness is found in loving more—and loving like Christ!

Entra en el templo como entró en el mundo: como un niño, en silencio, en la pobreza y en compañía de los pobres y los sabios.” —Papa Juan Pablo II

## Estimado Feligrés

Hoy podemos imaginarnos de pie entre la multitud en la ladera de la montaña, escuchando a nuestro Señor Jesús, el Nuevo Moisés que guía a Israel y a todos nosotros hacia una Nueva Tierra Prometida, proclamando las Bienaventuranzas. Mientras habla, sus ojos amorosos y misericordiosos, llenos de compasión, miran directamente a aquellos que son pobres de espíritu, mansos, misericordiosos, justos y cuyos corazones arden de anhelo por ser colmados de estas grandes virtudes. Nuestro Señor los llama bienaventurados.

En la primera lectura, el profeta Sofonías nos dice que Dios siempre ha sentido un amor y una ternura especiales por los humildes y los sencillos. Sofonías vivió en una época en que la mayor parte de Israel se había alejado deliberadamente del Dios vivo. Rompieron su pacto con Dios al caer en el pecado y la depravación: la idolatría, la sensualidad, la corrupción, la injusticia, el egoísmo, y al centrar sus deseos en cosas pasajeras que solo les brindaban satisfacción momentánea. ¿Acaso no se parece esto a los tiempos actuales? En Estados Unidos, el 76% de los católicos ha dejado de asistir a misa semanalmente.

Pero esperen: Sofonías habla de un pequeño número de personas “humildes y sencillas”, llenas de fe, a quienes llama el “remanente” —los anawim— que permanecieron fieles a Dios como su Cabeza divina, negándose a seguir los caminos del mundo y de los que se apartaron de la fe. Todos los que nos aferramos a nuestro Señor y a su Iglesia en los buenos y en los malos tiempos, negándonos a ceder ante el mundo y todo lo que ofrece, formamos parte de ese pequeño grupo del 24% de remanentes de hoy en día: los anawim católicos.

Como dice San Pablo, somos los elegidos que Dios escogió para ser necios a los ojos del mundo, para avergonzar a los sabios; para ser débiles, para avergonzar a los fuertes; y para ser humildes y despreciados, para avergonzar a los orgullosos y arrogantes. Quizás no valemos nada a los ojos del mundo, pero podemos enorgullecernos de que nuestro Señor nos considera sumamente dignos ante sus ojos.

Hoy, pidamos la gracia de que las Bienaventuranzas de nuestro Señor echen raíces profundas en nosotros. Con la fuerza de nuestro Señor y la guía de su Espíritu Santo, podemos experimentar las alegrías del Reino cuando, a imitación de Cristo, elegimos el amor en lugar del odio, la misericordia en lugar del resentimiento, la humildad en lugar del orgullo, la confianza en lugar del miedo y la justicia en lugar del reconocimiento. Si perseveramos, nuestro Señor nos promete una gran recompensa en el cielo. Nuestra verdadera felicidad se encuentra en amar más, ¡y en amar como Cristo!



## REFLECTIONS

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.” MATTHEW 5:3

The phrase “poor in spirit” can be confusing. Think of it in this sense – poor in spirit means depending on God’s providence and not depending on our own self-reliance. Being detached from earthly things (power, money, and comfort) and being attached to heavenly things (charity, sacrifice, and mercy). Denying ourselves from satisfying our desires and helping others obtain their basic needs.



# BAPTISM

**Baptism, the first and fundamental sacrament, is the purifying and sanctifying sacrament of rebirth. It is how its recipients are incorporated into the church in a sacramental bond of unity.**

**For parents who have been blessed with a new baby or have a child up to age 7 who has not been previously baptized and want to answer Christ's invitation to this new life, St. Aloysius offers group baptisms on the second Sunday of each month.**

# BAPTISM

**Before contacting the Rectory Office to register for a baptism, please review the following requirements:**

- **Parish Registration**

- If you are registered at St. Aloysius Parish, no further action is needed.
- If you are registered at another parish, request a letter of permission from that parish.
- If you are not registered at any parish, register at [www.stalscaldwell.org](http://www.stalscaldwell.org). → Quick Links → Parish Registration.

- **Godparent Requirements**

- One Godparent (male or female) or two Godparents (one male and one female).
- Must be at least 16 years old.
- At least one Godparent must be a confirmed Catholic (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation).
- One non-Catholic Christian Witness is permitted only with one Catholic Godparent; must be baptized and at least 16.
- All Godparents must submit a Sponsor Certificate from their current parish (not a Confirmation certificate).

- **Sponsor Certificates**

- Submit all certificates by email, mail, or in person to the Rectory Office.
- Baptism registration cannot be completed until all certificates are received.
- Please call the Rectory Office to register once the certificates have been submitted.
