OUR MISSION STATEMENT

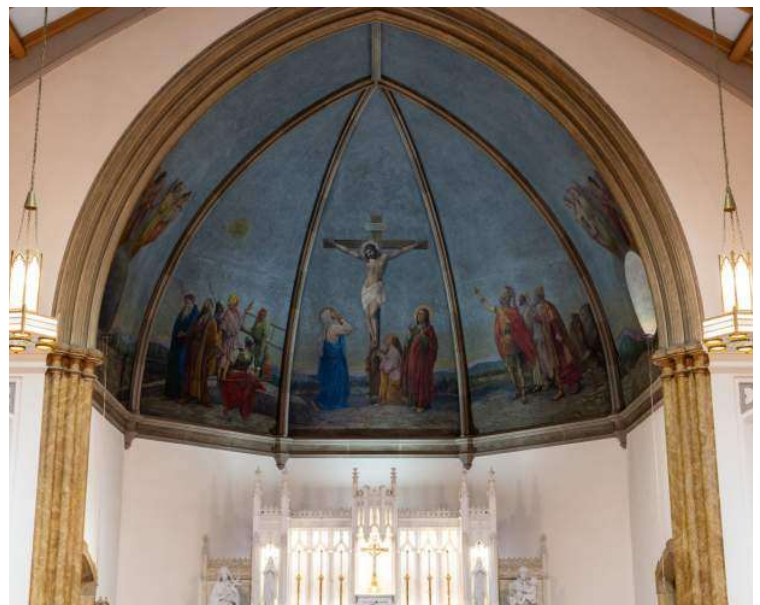

Dear Parishioner



Imagine Mary of Magdala arriving at the tomb early in the morning. It was still dark. As a brave follower of Jesus, what was going through her mind? There were cherished images of Jesus bringing life and hope to so many people, including her. Yet these memories were overshadowed by the nightmare images of Calvary. The darkness of that early morning hour reflected the darkness that enveloped her heart.

Mary and the other disciples, however, discover that Jesus is no longer a prisoner of the tomb. At first, she does not fully understand the wondrous event that has taken place. She ran to share her astonishing news with Simon Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved. The Gospel tells us they returned to the empty tomb and believed. The good news of Easter begins to sink into the minds and hearts of the disciples.

Our wounded world often makes us feel like we are, at times, enveloped in darkness. Yet today, we come to profess our belief in the resurrection of the Lord. Peter declares in the first reading that we have been chosen by God to be witnesses of the good news of Easter. Our belief in the resurrection does not give us easy answers to the profound questions like suffering, war, and violence. However, our faith DOES give us the hope that there is light shining in the midst of darkness. This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

Christ the Lord is Risen Today! Alleluia!

¡Cristo, el Señor, ha resucitado hoy! ¡Aleluya!

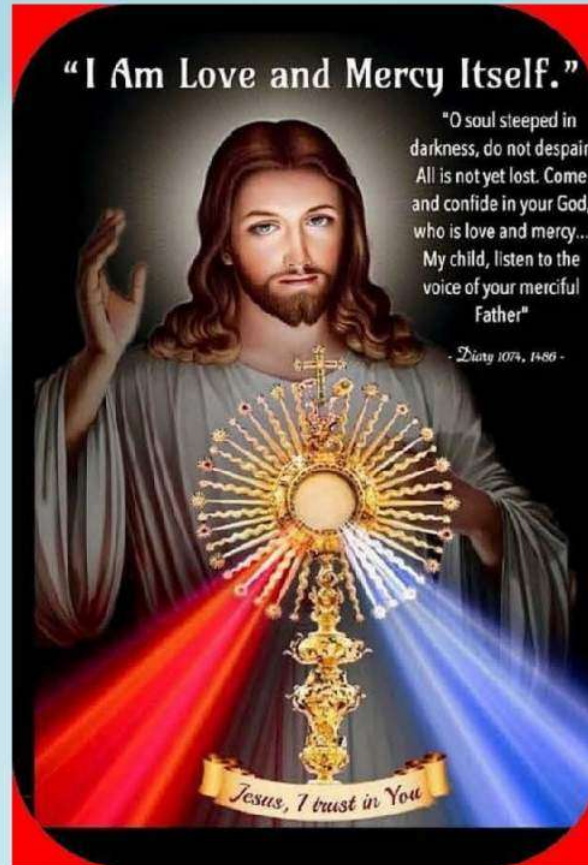

As Baptized Catholics, we are called to share our faith and invite others to become fully initiated Catholics. The OCIA process is a spiritual journey and the formation process for welcoming adults to become part of our Catholic Church.

Who participates in OCIA?

- Unbaptized adults who would like to explore becoming Catholic or adults baptized in another Christian faith who desire to become Catholic.
- Baptized Catholics who want to receive the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and/or Confirmation.
- Catholics interested in deepening their relationship with Jesus.

On Saturday, February 21st, we celebrated the Rite of Continuing Conversion at The Sacred Heart Cathedral in Newark.

Conversions to our Catholic faith are on the rise in the Archdiocese of Newark and around the world. Our Archdiocese is breaking last year's record with over 1,100 candidates for full communion into the Catholic faith and over 650 Catechumens (people never previously Baptized) for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) at this year's Easter Vigil. We have been advised that these are the largest numbers in the history of our Archdiocese.

We are very pleased and proud that St. Aloysius is so well represented with eleven candidates for full Communion on May 17th. We also have three Catechumens scheduled to be fully initiated Catholics at the Easter Vigil in 2027.

It is arbitrary how people come into OCIA, it is completely Holy Spirit driven. All the praise goes to our Lord. The Holy Spirit and Blessed Mother have been on the move the past few years bringing new souls to Jesus. It is a great story to relate. Especially with all the negativity surrounding our Catholic faith.

If you hear the call of the Holy Spirit and Blessed Mother and desire to either complete your Sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation or to just deepen your relationship with Jesus, please feel free to attend OCIA sessions. All are welcome.

Christ the Lord has risen! And as the whole world rejoices - singing His glory with hearts and voices so joyful - may you discover that Easter brings you peace, faith, and hope anew, and may these blessings fill your heart with joy throughout the year.


