
know that there is much more going on than any summary can cover.

Thankfully, we met our expenses this year, but our attendance and collections have clearly suffered since the pandemic. May Almighty God bless us and preserve us in faith now and forever!



#### STA Parish School

One of the greatest assets is our Parish School. Our pre-K through 8th grade students and staff rely on our parish for support, to be able to provide a high-quality education and share the love of Jesus everyday in the classroom.

In 2022-2023, there were 338 students enrolled at the STA Parish School, and utilized 21 classroom teachers, 6 teachers for special classes, and 5 support staff.

The school received **\$65,403** in tuition support from the parish, STA Education Trust Fund, staff tuition credit, and our Tuition Assistance program.

# St. Thomas Aquinas Education Trust Fund

Once a year a small board of trustees meet to discuss parish education needs. **The Educational Trust Fund**, originally named the St. Thomas Aquinas Education Foundation, established in 1973, provides grants to improve and enhance our school and formation programs.

The Educational Trust Fund has enhanced the curriculum at the Parish school - helping our students be on-par or surpass peers from other schools - and funded projects to bring in speakers, concerts, and more that create engagement in youth and adult formation.

Countless children, adults, and families who belong to or have engaged with the St. Thomas Aquinas Parish community are the true beneficiaries of the Trust.

One of the founding tenants of the Trust Fund is ensuring the **preservation** of funding for years to come. The Trust Fund is funded by private donors and held in an account by the Diocese of Lansing.
