And we have aging facilities in need of repair with a large staff and faculty that works very hard for modest salaries. Thankfully to our parishioners and benefactors, our income outpaced our expenses this past year, but inflation is certainly cutting into our budget, and there is more work to be done. Sacrificial giving will be needed to even keep pace with our current activities this coming year.

Our ongoing National Eucharistic Revival reminds us that Our Lord is Truly Present in the Eucharist at every Mass and in every tabernacle. As our parish brings us the most priceless gift of Heaven in the Eucharist, let us look to make a return to the Lord for all that we have received by seeking to cover the rising costs of mission that support the sacraments and ministries of the Church. And please continue inviting family members and friends to encounter Jesus through the Catholic Church. The world needs our witness, so let us preserve our ministries for the benefit of future generations. As Fr. Mac would say, "Let us keep first things first!"





\$820,120.25 was released from restriction from the Witness to Hope campaign.

\$232,103.60 was used for projects at both churches and in the school building to help balance our budget.

The remaining **\$588,016.65** was put into one of our savings accounts at the Diocese.


