May God grant us grateful and joyful hearts! -



Every few weeks, I get an email from parishioners letting me know that someone is impersonating me or a member of the staff. Unfortunately, there is nothing I can do to stop this except to make sure that everyone is aware of the problem. We never, ever ask you for

gift cards via email or text. We will never ask you for personal banking information over email or text.

There are usually clues that you can't trust the email.

This is just one the many emails that the criminals use to impersonate me. Hover over the email. That will give you the full email address.

Beware of any email or text that lures you into revealing your personal or financial information.
