

Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden

beam in your own eye?

As we begin Lent this week, we enter a penitential season that calls us to be introspective. Do we love God above everything else and put Him at the center of our lives and activities? Do we love and forgive our neighbor as ourselves? Do we respect our own lives as a gift from God, redeemed at the cost of Jesus' blood? The ashes we wear on our forehead remind us to repent, pick up our cross and follow Jesus. We still have a lot of work to do.

Please see the bulletin for Ash Wednesday Mass times, fish fries, Stations of the Cross and other Lenten events. Consider ways to fast (skipping snacks, desserts, or wasting time on social-media), pray (making time for Mass, personal prayer and lifting up those in need - including persecuted Christians around the world), and give alms (sharing our time, talent and treasure or cleaning out our closets and giving away unwanted clothes, canned goods and more). I also recommend inviting a friend to these Lenten events, even if it is a community fish fry. Let us come together in faith and support one another in bearing our crosses.





In the Roman Catholic Church priests are required by canon law to pray the entire Liturgy of the Hours each day while deacons are required to pray the morning and evening hours. 

Sundays in Ordinary Time

Here we are at the end of "Part 1" of Ordinary Time where Jesus, in the Gospel of Luke, challenges us to self-reflection and discernment before we call out others' weaknesses. Now... the next time we experience a Sunday in Ordinary will be July 6 where Jesus, again in the Gospel of Luke, is sending us to be laborers for his harvest. With that in mind, we pick up where we left off...

The Ministry of the Sacristan

Have you considered if God is calling you to serve as a Sacristan? Are you ready to respond to that call with a resounding "Yes"? As mentioned last week, we have three types of Sacristans: Weekend Sacristans, Weekday Sacristans and Funeral Sacristans.

The Weekend Sacristan is responsible for preparing the sacred vessels for Mass, ensures all the liturgical ministry positions are filled such as Altar Servers, Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and secures the collection after Mass. They also take a count of every person in the church during Mass, invite several people to carry up the gifts and clean the sacred vessels after Mass. If needed, the Weekend Sacristan will fill in another position as needed.

The Weekday Sacristan is responsible for preparing the sacred vessels for Mass, serves as the Lector and sometimes Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. If time permits, the Weekday Sacristan may invite someone to serve as the Lector and/or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. If there is a school Mass, the Weekday Sacristan assists in preparing the students who are serving in the various liturgical roles.

The Funeral Sacristan prepares the sacred vessels for Mass, sets out the aspergillum, funeral pall, paschal candle and assists the family and friends of the deceased who may be serving as the lectors and/or gift bearers. If there is no Altar Server present, the Funeral Sacristan prepares for the thurible for the priest to use at the Final Commendation.

If you are ready to say "yes," I look forward to hearing from you this week!

Liturgy of the Hours

One of the blessings of serving as a priest here at St. Thomas/St. John's is that I'm often reminded of the promises I made at my diaconate ordination, which took place right here at St. Thomas two years ago.

During that Mass, one of the questions Bishop Boyea asked me and those to be ordained deacons was, "Do you resolve...to celebrate faithfully the Liturgy of the Hours with and for the People of God and indeed for the whole world?" To which we all responded, "I do!"

What is the Liturgy of the Hours? Together with the Mass, it the official daily prayer of the Church. While priests, deacons, and religious have promised to pray it each day, all the faithful have access to these prayers and are able to celebrate this liturgy, even in the absence of an ordained minister.

I was first introduced to this type of prayer about ten years ago at a time when I was searching for ways to stay connected to the Lord in prayer each day; not only the times I went to Mass. The fact that there is a prayer available to use at any part of the day: morning, mid-day, evening, and night, helped me to pause and remain rooted in the Lord at set times throughout the week. Since the text of the Liturgy of the Hours is drawn from the Scriptures, it also allowed me to become more familiar with the Bible and use these sacred texts as my personal prayers.

To pass along this treasure of the Church which has enriched my own spiritual life (while remaining faithful to the promise I made at ordination), I will be offering some further teaching on the Liturgy of the Hours in this bulletin column in the coming weeks, so that each of us can more fully offer the Lord a continual sacrifice of praise!



What the Devil Doesn't Have

The devil knows all the rules. The devil knows all the Bible verses. He probably knows them better than you do (certainly better than I do). He knows them so well that here, in today's Gospel, he thinks he can outsmart the Son of God. He thinks he can out-argue him.

See, the thing you need to know about the devil is that he could have a master's degree in theology. Maybe even a doctorate. But have you ever met a master's student, or even a doctoral one, who doesn't have a particular passion for what they're studying? I sure have.

The devil didn't rebel against God because he didn't understand God's will. He rebelled because he understood God's will perfectly — and he didn't like it.

The devil knows that Jesus is human, and so in today's Gospel he employs all the very best tricks he has for getting humans to break. Physical hunger. Insecurity and a desire for power. The yearning to appear learned and wise.

The devil will try these things with us, too — this Lent, and throughout our lives.

It doesn't work with Jesus, because, of course, Jesus is not just human. He can feel temptation, but he will not submit to it. But how are we supposed to do the same? We're not divine. We're just human.

Well, here's the thing. We may be only human, but as Christians, we have a secret weapon. (No, it's not a master's degree in theology. Some of you may have that, but it probably doesn't make you holier.)

We have a love of what the devil has renounced — those things belonging solely to God. Truth. Joy. Humility. Sanctifying sacrifice.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Remove the beam from your own eye, Jesus reminds us, before removing the splinter from your brother's. This doesn't mean we should not help each other to be holy. But holiness must come from within. If we don't have it, we can't share it. Are we looking hard enough at our own souls?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question:

After attending our parish retreat and feeling much better and stronger about my faith, I want to make this Lent worthwhile. What can I do to keep the spirit and practice of Lent?

Answer:

You've already taken the first step by going on the parish retreat. It is important for us to "tune up" our faith, taking some time to renew ourselves through prayer, meditation and education. By deepening our knowledge and understanding of faith, we are often better attuned to its richness and meaning for our life.

Lent is an intense retreat, a forty-day period of reflection and penance that prepares us to celebrate the passion, death and resurrection of Christ. Our communication with God and our awareness of him is the purpose of prayer. Setting aside extra time each day helps intensify the season. Prayer includes daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, communal penance services and private confession. Making restitution for sin as well as disciplining our hearts and minds to focus on God is the purpose of penance. It helps us restore a sense of balance to our souls, thrown off kilter by sin. Penance includes personal sacrifice, selfdenial, fasting, almsgiving and charitable works.

Finally, spiritual practices help us sharpen our understanding and insight into the meaning and understanding of our faith. When you take your faith seriously, you do what is necessary to follow Jesus more closely, to integrate your life and your faith more carefully.





March 14 - 15 Break Open the Parables: Women's Retreat


This retreat will take several of Jesus' parables and explore the deeper meanings while giving time for guest to reflect on his teachings and how they work in our lives.




