


#### St. John Food Cupboard Needs

Last week, we covered why this prayer is called *Liturgy of the Hours* by addressing that "hours" means the different times of the day this liturgy can be celebrated. Now, in order to get started on sanctifying each day through the prayer of the Church, we will need to be equipped with the right resources.

While the printed version comes in a <u>four-volume set</u>, the easiest way to access the Liturgy of the Hours is on a mobile device. The two most popular apps are called <u>DivineOffice.org</u> and <u>iBreviary.com</u>. Both of these apps are free and updated daily to provide you with the prayers for that particular day.

If you prefer to pray with a printed book in church, you may borrow the *Shorter Christian Prayer* books located in the back of St. John church. These prayer books include Morning, Evening, and Night Prayer. (At St. John Only).

While you may pray the Liturgy of the Hours individually, you are also welcome to pray with others the following times at St. John this Lent:

- Monday & Wednesday, after 5:30 PM Mass
- Tuesday & Thursday, after 8:45 PM Mass

We also continue to pray Morning Prayer together each Saturday after the 9:00 AM Mass in the Cana Chapel at St. Thomas Aquinas.

Taking advantage of these resources and opportunities will help you to stay connected with the liturgical life of the Church and be fed by the Word of God. I pray that you will consider entering into this chorus of praise the Church has sung throughout the ages – may it serve as a blessing in your own spiritual life this Lent and overflow to those around you!

#### The Key to a Good Confession is Preparation.

Taking time before you come to church to go through an examination of conscience will allow you to be direct and not miss anything. It is ok to bring your notes! Our priests are honored by the opportunity to hear your confession and warmly invite you to come next Sunday, March 30 to the Penance Service being held at St. Thomas from 1:30pm –3:30pm.

## Examination of Conscience

Confession can seem intimidating for a lot of people, but with some simple preparation, it can be a healing encounter with Christ that fills us with peace. Pray that God will give you peace and help you make a good confession.

Reflect on ways you have harmed your relationship with God, yourself & others using the question below.

- Do I pray to God every day? Have I thanked God for His gifts to me?
- Did I put my faith in danger through readings contrary to Catholic teachings or involvement in non-Catholic sects? Did I engage in superstitious practices: palm-reading or fortune-telling?
- 🐈 Did I take the name of God in vain? Did I curse or take a false oath?
- Did I miss Mass on Sundays or holy days of obligation through my own fault? Am I attentive at Mass? Did I keep fast and abstinence on the prescribed days?
- Tid I disobey my parents and lawful superiors in important matters?
- Did I hate or quarrel with anyone, or desire revenge? Did I refuse to forgive? Was I disrespectful?
- Tid I get drunk? Did I take illicit drugs?
- Tid I consent to, recommend, advise or actively take part in an abortion?
- Did I willfully look at pornography, entertain impure thoughts or engage in impure conversations or actions? Did I use artificial means to prevent conception?
- to marriage? Was I unfaithful to my spouse? Did I engage in sexual activity outside of marriage?
- Tid I steal or damage another's property? Have I been honest and just in my business relations?
- Have I been responsive to the needs of the poor and respected the dignity of others?
- Did I tell lies? Did I sin by calumny, or detraction, of others? Did I judge others rashly in serious matters?
- Have I envied other people?



#### How do I go to Confession?

**Confess** your sins aloud to the priest, who listens lovingly on behalf of Christ and the Church.

**Receive Penance**, the prayers or good deeds the priest gives you to begin healing the relationships hurt by your sins.

Pray an Act of Contrition, a simple expression to God that you are sorry for your sins and that you resolve to leave sin behind and live in the light!

Receive Absolution, the words the priest speaks which reconcile you to God and the Church.

#### **An Act of Contrition**

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.

#### THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

GOSPEL MEDITATION -ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

My childhood best friend was Xander Price. He was the fastest runner in school, an excellent baseball player and Jewish. Though his family wasn't intensely religious, I felt totally at home with them despite our religious differences. Everything about their Judaism seemed to undergird and strengthen my own experience of being a Catholic. I knew they didn't believe in Jesus like my family did, but I intuited somehow that Jesus was "hiding" in their religion. Like a cat moving under a blanket, ready to emerge at any moment, the Lord was hidden there in a special way.

In the Gospel for this third Sunday of Lent, Jesus says, "For if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me, for he wrote of me" (John 5:46). Stunning words, those. Moses wrote about Jesus. The way therefore that we come to know and believe in Jesus is to discover him lurking in Moses' writings. The Hebrew Scripture is the wonderful womb in which Jesus gestates within a host of images: Adam, Isaac, David, Melchizedek, the Temple, sacrificed lambs, prophets and so on. Right now, in your parish's OCIA program, soon-to-be baptized people are carefully studying where Jesus is in the writings of Moses, so that they may believe in him. This works for all of us, too, who wish to deepen our knowledge and love of Jesus.

Lenten challenge: Take some time to prayerfully study one of the images of Jesus listed above in the Old Testament. Identify which one you find compelling and consider why this is so. If you don't know where to start, begin with the prophet Jeremiah as an image of Jesus.

#### The Annunciation - March 25

The Annunciation recalls the day when the Archangel Gabriel appeared to Mary and revealed God's will that she become the Mother of the Son of God and she accepted. The incarnation of Christ changed the life of every Christian person who ever lived. Reflecting on that moment in salvation history is an opportunity for grace, growth and peace.

#### Anima Christi, Explained

The Anima Christi prayer takes its name from its opening lines: Soul of Christ — "Anima Christi" in Latin. In this prayer, the faithful invoke the image of Christ crucified, calling upon the salvific elements of his wounds, his Body and his Blood to strengthen them, imploring him to save them from "the malicious enemy" and to bring them, in their final hour, to his presence.

The author of this prayer is unknown, but it originated in the 14th century and was referenced in St. Ignatius' Spiritual Exercises. It is traditionally said after or before receiving the Eucharist. You can find this prayer on the back cover of our hymnal.

Soul of Christ, sanctify me.
Body of Christ, save me.
Blood of Christ, embolden me.
Water from the side of Christ, wash me.
Passion of Christ, strengthen me.
O good Jesus, hear me.
Within your wounds hide me.
Never permit me to be parted from you.
From the evil Enemy defend me.
At the hour of my death call me and bid me come to you,
that with your Saints I may praise you for age upon age.
Amen.



In early February, a woman approached 40 Days for Life prayer vigil participants outside Planned Parenthood in Lansing to effusively thank them for their prayer and


