- Grad Student & Young Professional (GSYP) Group meeting every Wednesday evening


Campus Ministry

- 24 students receiving a free *Magnificat* subscription during the school year as a result of new student leadership endowment


Campus Ministry

- 1 collaborative event each semester with St. Mary Student Parish in Ann Arbor (Game Day Mass in Ann Arbor in October & Priest Swap in January)


Fiscal Status

- School 75th Anniversary Gala
 - Held February 7, 2025 in the STA Parish School Gym

 - All funds going toward renovations in 18 classrooms, music room, and school library
 - Painting classrooms, standardized projectors and audio, LED lighting, wood refinishing, custom markerboards, and door framing.

Diocesan Campaigns

- Diocesan Services Appeal (DSA) Status 61% to our parish goal of \$227,445.47
- Stewardship for Saints & Scholars Campaign
 - Feasibility Study complete
 - No combined campaign stretch campaign instead
 - Goal of \$2.875M (anything above benefits the parish beyond the school hoping for \$3.5-4M)
 - Wave 3 rollout starting in August
 - 20% returns to the school, up to \$575, 000 (but won't be available immediately)
 - How best to use? (TBD)
 - Survey what renovations follow in 2026-27, and what is funded by S3 in future years?

Witness to Hope Campaign Summary

The Witness to Hope capital campaign (2017-23) served to enhance our ministry in several ways:

- Repairs to St. Thomas Aquinas Church floor
- New on-site rectory
- Renovation of heating/cooling at St. John Church & Student Center
- New pre-school & after care building at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish School (includes demolition of old convent)
- Pole barn for storage of maintenance equipment
- Replace roof systems at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish School
- Replace intercom system at St. Thomas Aquinas Parish School

In addition, we have replaced the flat roofing at St. John, painted the sanctuary, and installed LED lights in the past year.



Parish School Renovations - 2024

Last summer, the parish also began a multi-year facelift of our elementary school by replacing playground fencing, installing drop ceilings and LED lighting in 9 classrooms, replacing classroom doors, and completing a pavilion that can serve as an outdoor classroom and shade-structure for our playground.



Parish School Renovations - 2025

This summer, the parish is planning the following renovations for the school:

- Main Office Secured Entry Vestibule
- Gym West Wall Support Repairs / Rehanging Gym Divider Curtain
- New Phone System / Rekeying Campus
- Mold Remediation in basement spaces
- Classroom Updates: new painting, new boards, wood trim and door frame refinishing, etc.



Parish School Renovations - 2026+

St. Thomas Aquinas Parish will begin the Diocesan Stewardship for Saints and Scholars campaign this fall. This 5-year pledge campaign will benefit Catholic Education. 20% of the funds collected up to our parish goal of \$2.875M will be returned to our parish for school use in the end. These funds will support future renovations and updates to our school campus.

Future Renovations for our Church

Let's start with the obvious - our **pipe organ** is failing:

The mechanical parts of an organ need to be repaired or replaced every few decades - leather wears out, mechanics fail, electronic components are outdated or out of warranty. As our current pipe organ was built in the mid-80s (1984/85), it is reaching that period of time where components are failing, and the parish needs to plan for a major renovation to keep our organ functional for years to come.



Future Renovations for our Church

A major organ renovation is needed ASAP for the following reasons:

- The newer (80s-era) pipes are failing due to poor metal quality (a poor grade of zinc was used). These pipes are starting to bend and collapse on themselves. You may have noticed the gray boat ropes used to secure the façade pipes lest they fall on anyone during Mass. These pipes will need to be replaced. Note: The original Austin Organ Company pipes are much older yet sturdier and worth renovating to preserve the core of our organ.
- Not all of our current 61 ranks are operational. Some are virtual ranks, and either the electronics or speakers failed years ago. For instance, our present organ has chimes, but they haven't been operational in years.
- In the current configuration, some pipes are inaccessible and cannot be tuned or maintained. A restructuring of the pipe case is required to remedy this situation.

Future Renovations for our Church

As a major pipe organ renovation will require modifications to our church sanctuary, now is a good time to consider what a future church upgrade could look like. We know that we need to replace the sanctuary carpet, pews, and give the church a consistent look, as noted below. These renovations are time-dependent on funding, annual budgeting, special donations, and the possibility of exceeding our *Stewardship for Saints and Scholars* campaign goal. Concept work is in progress.

- Renovate the sanctuary replace carpet with tile
- Emphasize the tabernacle and crucifix by dividing the pipe organ swell boxes
- Make the wood trim match throughout the church
- Replace the acoustic tile on the walls
- Honor our patron saint, St. Thomas Aquinas
- Renovate the bathrooms
