Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are

forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

This weekend is Divine Mercy Sunday, the conclusion of the Octave of Easter and a celebration of the mercy that comes to us through Jesus' saving death and resurrection. As the Divine Mercy Image shows, Jesus appears to his disciples in the upper room as a merciful savior, his right hand raised in blessing and his left hand showing the rays of mercy emanating from his pierced side. On this day, Jesus wants to restore us to our baptismal purity, free from sin and from the punishments due to sin. In addition to attending Mass and receiving Communion worthily (or making a Spiritual Communion for those unable to receive), I invite everyone to take a moment to venerate the Divine Mercy Images—which are displayed at both St. Thomas and St. John—and pray the words, "Jesus, I trust in you."

This Sunday afternoon, a special time of devotion will be held at St. John from 1:15-3:15pm, with Eucharistic Adoration, confession opportunities, the praying of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00pm, Benediction and a reception afterwards. NOTE: You do not have to attend this event to receive the blessings of Divine Mercy or to fulfill the Divine Mercy Novena. The blessings of Divine Mercy can be fulfilled by attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion, assuming that you've confessed your sins already this Lent. Further information can be found on-line at elcatholics.org/ mercy. And to those who have entered the Church through adult baptism but have not yet made a confession, this is a perfect opportunity to celebrate God's Mercy and experience the beauty of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The soul that will go to **Confession** and receive **Holy Communion** shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. – Jesus to St. Faustina (Diary, #699)

The Holy Week and Easter liturgies were beautiful and so well attended! **Thank you** to all of our staff and volunteers—liturgical ministers, decorators, musicians & singers, maintenance, Outreach Mass team, and our OCIA/Becoming Catholic group—who worked so hard over the past few weeks to prepare for this great celebration of the Resurrection. Bless you all!

Please pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Francis! It was beautiful to see the pope greet the crowds at the Vatican on Easter Sunday. I couldn't think of a better way to conclude his pontificate. The Church traditionally celebrates 9 days of mourning when a pope passes away. Then the conclave to elect his successor will start within 2–3 weeks of his death. You'll notice that the clergy will remove the name of the pope from the Eucharistic Prayers at Mass until a successor is named. May the Holy Spirit guide the Church through the upcoming conclave!

Catholic Radio is now on the air in Lansing! Ave Maria Radio is available on 1390AM, or you can access it On Demand via AveMariaRadio.net. The Church will soon canonize its first Millennial saint - Carlo Acutis - as well as another young adult saint - Pier Giorgio Frassati. Bl. Carlo was scheduled to be canonized this weekend, but the ceremony has been postponed while the seat of Peter is vacant. May is coming, the month of Our Blessed Mother. The diocesan pilgrim statue of Our Lady of Fatima will visit St. Thomas for the month.


Also, enrollment in the **Brown Scapular** of Our Lady of Mount Carmel will be offered after the 9:00am Mass on the First Saturday.

Jesus, l'trust in you

The Feast of Mercy A Day of Extraordinary Grace

Sunday, April 27 at St. John Holy Hour: Adoration and Confession 1:00-3:15pm. Chaplet at 3:00pm.

In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina in the 1930s, our Lord repeatedly called for the celebration of the **Feast of Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter**. He promised an ocean of graces to be poured out on the world.

To receive these graces, you are asked to be merciful to others through deed, word and prayer. Make a good and sincere confession during Lent. Worthily receive Holy Communion on the Feast Day (or the Vigil). Venerate the image of The Divine Mercy. Trust in His Divine Mercy.

Jesus wants to give us so much we can't even fathom it. He promises, "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death (687). When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior (1541).

Jesus looked at me (St. Faustina) and said, Souls perish in spite of My bitter Passion. I am giving them the last hope of salvation; that is, the Feast of My Mercy. If they will not adore My mercy, they will perish for all eternity. Secretary of My mercy, write, tell souls about this great mercy of Mine, because the awful day, the day of My justice, is near (Diary, 965).

April 27. A potluck reception sponsored by Family Ministry will be held from 3:15-4:15pm at St. John. Dishes will include Pierogi, Cesar Salad, Papal Cream Cake and Divine Mercy Sundaes.





Ozanam Sunday



Today the members of our parish's two St. Vincent de Paul
Conferences celebrate "Ozanam
Sunday," with a special blessing of
Vincentians after the 10:00am Mass
at St. John's with Coffee & Donuts
for all parishioners following.

Almost 200 years ago, a college student named Frederic Ozanam

and five of his college friends, along with an adult mentor, founded what today is known as the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. In a discussion group with other college students, they had been challenged by some of their non-Catholic friends: "Sure, the Catholic Church has done some great things in the past, but what are you and the Church doing today?!" Taken aback, they met on April 23, 1833, (which was also Frederic's 20th birthday) to respond to this question. Their response, as formulated by Frederic Ozanam: "We must go to the poor!" They soon named their group after the great Apostle of Charity, St. Vincent de Paul, who had lived and ministered to the poor almost 200 years before them. From this humble beginning, the Society quickly grew and eventually spread across France and to the whole world, numbering over 850,000 members world-wide today! Their mission remains the same as that of St. Vincent de Paul and Blessed Frederic Ozanam - to minister to our brothers and sisters in need!

We celebrate Ozanam Sunday annually on the last Sunday of April – close to the dates of April 23 (Frederic Ozanam's birthday and the date of the Society's first meeting) and April 24 (the birthday of Vincent de Paul.) Conferences of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul can be found in most Catholic parishes today throughout the world! We welcome you to join us in this ministry! OFFICE OF THE DEAD

As we continue to mourn the death of Pope Francis and pray for the repose of his soul, I'd like to introduce you to a set of prayers in the Liturgy of the Hours called the "Office for the Dead." While we can pray in many ways for those who have died (for example, the rosary), the Office for the Dead is a liturgical prayer, and is united to the official prayer of the Church.

The Office for the Dead is composed of prayers specific for each time of day (Morning, Daytime, Evening, Night), which are offered for the dead. For example, in the light of this Easter season, Morning Prayer recalls "the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, the true light enlightening all people (see John 1:9) and 'the sun of justice' (Malachi 4:2) 'rising from on high' (Luke 1:78)."

"The celebration of Morning Prayer from the Office for the Dead relates the death of the Christian to *Christ's victory over death* and affirms the hope that those who have received the light of Christ at Baptism will *share in that victory.*"

One way to access these prayers is by visiting DivineOffice.org.

The Office for the Dead provides us a way to pray for the dead while praying the Liturgy of the Hours and is a beautiful way to lift our prayers to God.

Whether it's utilizing the Office for the Dead or praying another way, let us continue to lift up our late Holy Father in prayer, asking God to have mercy on him who proclaimed that mercy to us. May he rest in peace.



(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Wonder, Don't Wander

My daughter recently asked me if it's okay to "wonder if all the Jesus stuff is true."

I wasn't surprised by her question. I've expected it, in fact. If you're raising a child to be a critical thinker, you don't want them to accept everything you tell them simply because it comes from your lips. I have promised my children that I will always give them the truth about God. But that's all I can do — give it to them. Whether or not they accept it, ultimately, is their own choice.

"I know it's true," she told me. "But sometimes it just all sounds so...unbelievable."

She's not wrong. It does sound unbelievable that an all-powerful God could create us for no reason other than sheer love, that He could be generous enough to give us free will to accept that love, that he could be merciful enough not to destroy us when we reject that love, and finally that he could be faithful enough in that love to become flesh and die in order to save us from the consequences of our own poor choices.

But lots of things are unbelievable. That doesn't mean they're not true. When Jesus says, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed," he isn't calling Thomas a fool for questioning something that sounds a little outrageous. He's just highlighting the fact that Thomas is afforded a luxury that none of the Christians born after him, my daughter included, will have: he gets to see proof with his own eyes.

I told my daughter it's fine to wonder — just don't wander. Take Thomas' example. Stay close to the people you trust. Return to the warmth of the upper room. Be willing to recognize Jesus when he's in front of you. **Never be afraid to believe.**

Thomas needed proof to believe the amazing things that had happened. God, in His mercy, gave him that proof — but it was up to Thomas to accept it.

Do we accept the proof we see of God's love every day?

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED! Sprinkling Rite

The rite of sprinkling, also called the Asperges rite, describes the act of sprinkling the congregation with holy water, an action which recalls the new life we received in the waters of our baptism.

If this rite is performed during Mass, it takes the place of the penitential act.

The sprinkling rite usually takes place on Sundays during the Easter season but is permitted on any Sunday. When it is completed, the congregation sings the Gloria.

The name "asperges" comes from the first line of Psalm 51, a penitential psalm that begins with the words "Have mercy on me." In the Extraordinary Form of the Mass, the Asperges rite is done before each principal Mass, except on Palm Sunday.

The tool used by the priest to sprinkle the congregation is called the aspergillum, and the bucket containing the water is called the aspersorium.
