Nourished and Formed by the Word of God

Last week we learned that praying the Liturgy of the Hours is a great way to both prepare for Mass and to extend our praise and thanksgiving at Mass to other times of the day/week. I also referenced how the Catechism teaches us that the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our lives. Now, I'd like to look at another essential aspect of the Christian life: being nourished and formed by the Word of God.


Each Sunday we hear three readings from Sacred Scripture which serve to instruct, nourish, and form us into the people God calls us to be. However, the Church urges us not only to listen to the Word of God at Mass, but to immerse ourselves in God's holy word throughout the week. While there are many ways to engage the Scriptures, the Liturgy of the Hours allows us to not only read God's word but to make it our very prayer.

That means when we pick up the Liturgy of the Hours, we use the words that God has given us as our own prayer - kind of like praying with the words Jesus taught His disciples in the "Our Father," (which is also incorporated into the Liturgy of the Hours). Pope Benedict XVI likened praying this way to a child learning how to speak:

When a child begins to speak... he learns how to express his own feelings, emotions, and needs with words that do not belong to him innately but that he learns from his parents and from those who surround him... and little by little he makes them his own, the words received from his parents become his words. (General Audience, Wednesday, June 22, 2011)

This is what happens when we pray the Liturgy of the Hours! The many psalms, Old and New Testament canticles, along with dozens of short readings from the letters of the New Testament all become our prayer when praying this liturgy. May our increased familiarity with God's word shape our prayer, that He may continue to form us into the disciples we're called to be.

Resembling Jesus

I once wrote an article about several women residents of a local nursing home. In researching the piece, I discovered that they had grown up in the same neighborhood as my grandmother, and that one of the women was, in fact, my grandmother's dearest childhood friend.

When I visited this woman to take her photograph, she took a long look at my face, and I could see in her eyes that she was reaching back in her memory across the years. She said: "You resemble her." I wept on the way home.

My grandmother died when I was nine, and for the last several years of her life she suffered from Alzheimer's disease. I have always deeply grieved the time we lost, the relationship we could have had. I have hazy fragments of memory from before her illness that lead me to believe we loved each other very much.

Being told I look like my grandmother by someone who knew her well — being identified as belonging to her in some way was one of the more beautiful things to happen to me.

When we love someone, we want to be associated with them. We want to be recognized as theirs somehow. And if we love Christ, we should want to be known as belonging to him. We should want those who see us to know we are his.

The only way we can resemble Jesus is through love. It is his most recognizable quality, his most famous trait. This is how all will know that you are my disciples.

As Catholics, we are always talking about finding ways to live our faith boldly, unapologetically, publicly. Good — we should! But if we want people to know we are Catholic, we should love them. Bravely. Recklessly. Sacrificially.

As he loves us.

There is an invitation in the empty tomb and the abandoned burial cloths. What great things could we accomplish, if we only believe that Christ has conquered death? Go forth this Easter season, boldly embracing the hope of the resurrection.

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED! Hail Mary

The words of the Hail Mary — undoubtedly the most recognizable Catholic prayer after the Lord's Prayer — are deeply rooted in scripture. The opening lines of the prayer are taken from the



words of the angel Gabriel at the Annunciation — "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." This line is known as the Angelic Salutation. The following words — "Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus" — echo the sentiments expressed by Elizabeth at the Visitation.

The Angelic Salutation is regarded as the earliest devotional prayer to Mary, since it forms the very first words spoken to her as the Mother of God, but Catholics did not begin to utilize the Hail Mary prayer in its current form until around the 11th century.

An in-depth explanation of each line of this prayer is provided in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2676-2677.




