

Jesus said, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

The more we reflect on the nature of Heaven, the more clearly we see our mission on Earth. If Heaven is the perfection of our relationship with God and one another, then we should strive hard to grow in love of God and neighbor daily. We can ask ourselves the following: Are we growing in our knowledge of the faith, spending meaningful time in prayer and taking our responsibility for evangelization and service seriously? Do we really care about God and desire to be with God more today than yesterday? Loving God sounds so easy, and yet there are so many distractions that get in the way. Likewise, Jesus' command to love one another seems ridiculously simple. It is easy to dismiss or take this command for granted. But do we really love others enough to give our lives for them, as Christ did? Do we promote their salvation, lead them to Christ and away from sin? As summer break arrives, let us commit to helping our family and friends to get to church and stay connected to Jesus. And let us work on praying the Rosary daily to ask Our Lady of Fatima to deliver our world from war and violence as well as to protect the dignity of human life. Consider praying the Rosary as you enjoy walking around your neighborhood this summer. This is a simple way to pray for your neighbors! HABEMUS PAPAM – Welcome Pope Leo XIV! I never thought I would see an American pope...frankly, I did not think the Universal Church would accept such a candidate. Please pray for him! Pope Leo spoke of uniting the world and building bridges, and we certainly need that unity across the world and across the Catholic Church. May the Holy Spirit guide him always! In addition to keeping the newly elected Holy Father in your private prayers, the Church encourages the recitation of the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be for the intentions of the Pope each day. And please pray for him as you recite the Holy Rosary.

Graduation Time! It is time to pray for our high school and 8th grade graduates this month. May God bless them in their further studies and summer plans! Plus,

the diocese offers discernment groups for those over age 16. If you know of someone expressing curiosity about the priesthood or consecrated life, your parish clergy are happy to help or check out the diocesan vocation department for assistance: dioceseoflansing.org/vocations.

The US Bishops Conference just reissued their pastoral response to the epidemic of pornography in our culture. I encourage parents and educators to read this document, so as to make our world safer for our young people. See the parish website for a copy.

To celebrate the conclusion of our National Eucharistic Revival and the Jubilee Year of Hope, our diocese will offer 40–Hours Devotion at all of the parishes between Pentecost and Corpus Christi Sunday. St. Thomas will host Eucharistic Adoration from Sunday evening, June 8, until Tuesday morning, June 10. We'll post sign-up information soon. Also in celebration, the diocese will offer a 10:00am Mass in Lugnut Stadium on Saturday, June 21. All are welcome. Then there will be a Eucharistic procession back to the cathedral afterwards. Visit <u>eucharisticjourney.org</u> for more details. Plus, we will offer our annual parish procession on Corpus Christi Sunday, June 22.

Speaking of Mass, if you are travelling this summer, check out <u>MassTimes.org</u> to find local parishes to attend. And - out of reverence for Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament - please do not chew gum at Mass. It violates our pre-Communion fast, and it would be sacrilegious to receive the Holy Eucharist with a wad of gum in our other cheek, or worse yet - to mix the fragments of the Eucharist with the gum we are chewing. Please dispose of your gum before entering the Communion line. Thank you for honoring Our Lord!

This week, our Monthly Senior Mass will be at St. Thomas this Wednesday at 10:00am, with the Rosary at 9:30am and a reception afterwards. This will be our last Senior Mass until September. And our Friday Eucharistic Adoration at St. Thomas has concluded until the fall.


Besides the hundreds of students coming for Mass each week, we have also welcomed a number of new and old friends to the student center. Since October, priests and religious from 7 different communities/religious orders have visited. Some have come just to spend time with our students, while others have shared about their community or given a talk during one of our monthly Traditio Nights. We have also enjoyed visits from some of our Catholic Spartan alumni priests and seminarians. Allowing our students to witness so many vocations in action is such a gift! A particularly fun collaboration continues to grow with the Campus Ministry team at St. Mary Student Parish in Ann Arbor. They hosted our 2nd annual Game Day Mass in October, followed by some friendly competition and food. Then, in January, we swapped priests for a day, sending Fr. Corey to spend time with the [University of] Michigan Catholics while Fr. Kyle Shinseki S.J. came up to East Lansing.

Other highlights of the spring semester include student-led Praise & Worship events, our Spring Retreat based on the Theology of the Body, a Mass in the MSU Union just after the 2 year anniversary of a mass shooting on campus, and, as always, the beauty of Holy Week in all its liturgies and events specific to our Catholic Spartan culture. Personally, I also enjoyed offering a 6-part series during the Lenten season, entitled "Jesus the Bridegroom" and based on Dr. Brant Pitre's book of the

same name. A different student group hosted each week of the series, (with the help of generous parishioners) serving soup and creating a hospitable space for attendees to learn about God's love for us throughout human history. The semester wound down with several social events (and a lot of free food!) before ending with our Graduation Mass for outgoing students in all their regalia.

We had fun celebrating the fruits of our ministry at our inaugural Heritage Gala in November 2024. Please save the date for the next Gala, November 8, 2025, as we expect an even bigger party than last year! I am so grateful for the generosity of our alumni and friends who continue to help make all we do at St. John's possible. As we spend this summer planning and discerning what God wants us to do next for our students, I ask for your prayers that His will be done on our campus!

Last week we covered how being formed by the Word of God in Sacred Scripture is a key element to living as a disciple and that in praying the Liturgy of the Hours, our reading of Scripture is made into a prayer. While most of the texts of the Liturgy of the Hours are from the Bible, this liturgy also makes use of other texts

including hymns, intercessions, and prayers. Today, let's look at the importance of hymns.


Music itself is a powerful tool which has an impact on our thoughts and feelings. Different types of music can have different effects on us. For example, loud and chaotic music can get us agitated while quiet, peaceful music can set us as ease. Some music can get us "pumped up" for physical activity and other music can bring back memories from the past. In her liturgy, the Church employs a specific type of music that is aimed at lifting the soul to God.


The songs we sing at church have the two-fold purpose of giving glory to God and aiding us along the path to holiness. Whether or not we are musically inclined, singing has an impact on our spiritual lives. While it helps to hit the right notes, songs aid our prayer by what they mean. Even Saint Cecilia "was proclaimed patroness of music not because of her beautiful voice or her talent for music, but in memory of the virginal song she sang to her heavenly Spouse hidden in the depths of her heart" (Saint Thérèse in Story of a Soul, pg. 202). Truly, "He who sings prays twice" (Saint Augustine as quoted in CCC 1156).

Whether singing at Mass, praying the Liturgy of the Hours, or any other time we sing praise to God, we should not to be discouraged with the thought that our voice is not pleasing to God. "In reality, you will add a unique and beautiful note to the eternal melody [that ascends to heaven], and Our Lord – Jesus Christ himself - will sing it with you" (The Everyday Catholic's Guide to the Liturgy of the Hours, pg. 115).



Habemus Papam...We Have a Pope!

On Thursday, May 8 Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, O.S.A., was elected as our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, the 267th Bishop of Rome! Our first Pope ever from North America. He was born in 1955 and raised in Chicago, Illinois. He is a religious order priest belonging to the Order of St. Augustine. He is a dual citizen of the United States of America and Peru where he served as a missionary priest for many years in the Archdiocese of Trujillo and Bishop of the Diocese of Chiclayo for 7 years. Pope Francis tapped him to serve as the Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops in 2023, elevated him to a Cardinal and the rest is history.

40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration
I share the followed letter from Bishop Boyea:

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

During this Jubilee year, we have an extraordinary opportunity to unite as a diocese in prayer, in faith, and in mission. Starting at Pentecost, June 8, we will embark on an intercessory journey—a 40 Hours Campaign—like no other.

For two weeks, parishes across our diocese will host Eucharistic Adoration for 40 or more hours each, blanketing our communities in continuous prayer and intercession for the full conversion of all the souls within our boundaries.

This campaign will lead to a powerful moment of unity on June 21—a diocesan-wide Mass at Jackson Field, home of the Lansing Lugnuts. After Mass, we will process with the Eucharist through the heart of our capital, culminating at the Cathedral. Pilgrims will even have the opportunity to celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi on the Capitol Lawn with food and fellowship.

Let us come together in mission as one body in Christ. Let us persevere in prayer and proclaim the Good News with boldness and joy. This is our moment to shine as a community of faith and I invite you to join us!

Our 40 hours of Eucharistic Adoration will take place at St. Thomas Aquinas in the Cana Chapel and will begin on Sunday, June 8 at 5:30pm and conclude Tuesday, June 10 at 8:30am. You may sign up for a time slot in the back of both churches or at eleatholics.org/adoration.

Fifth Sunday of Easter

GOSPEL MEDITATION – Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture by Father John Muir

I've always found it amazing that Jesus never says to his disciples the straightforward and bumper stickery words "I love you" or "I will always love you" (a la Dolly Parton's song). Why doesn't Jesus say, "I love you"?

Well, actually he does, but in particular ways. He says, "As the Father loves me, so I love you" (John 15:9) thereby rooting his love for us in the space of the Holy Trinity. This week he commands, "Love another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). He presents his love for us as a completed action which continues into the present moment. How has he loved us? By becoming one of us, one with us, and finally giving his life for us in his suffering on the cross. We weren't there when he did that, but neither were his Apostles (except one). Still, that action is his great "I love you" to us.

His love is also hedged in a command: "Love one another." So how can we practically follow it? The great St. John XXIII wrote in his diary that each day he followed this rule: "Only for today, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it." The hidden nature of a good deed is a sign that it is truly loving. This week, take on St. John XXIII's practical method of following Jesus' great commandment of love. It's a splendid way to say, "I love you."

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

If you love like me, Jesus tells his disciples, they will know you are mine. We shouldn't leave any room for doubt in the minds of each and every person we encounter. Let the whole world know: we love like Christ, and we belong to Christ.

PRAYER OF CHRISTIAN LOVE

Fill our hearts, O Lord, with Your love, the deepest, richest, purest love any of us has ever known. May Your love be our standard for love.

May Your love be what we bring and communicate to the world. May Your love define us as Christians, made in Your image and likeness.

Amen.

GOOD AND EVIL

Question:

If God is good, why is there evil in the world?

The problem of evil is perplexing. If God is all -powerful and all-good, why doesn't He stop bad things from happening? He must either not be all-powerful, or perhaps He's not very good after all. Human beings have faced the possibility of evil since the very beginning of our existence. In granting us free will, God gives us the ability to make free choices. God does not force us into moral perfection. We are not forced to love Him or to love our neighbor. We must make the decision ourselves. This means, of course, that we have the ability to choose against love.

One small decision of selfishness, jealously, or pride may not seem so bad. But every decision — good or bad — is like a stone dropped into a still pond. The ripples extend much farther than the original stone. When decisions against love begin to compound, they affect families, neighborhoods, and nations. This is all the more reason for Christians to be faithful to our baptismal call to love one another as Christ has loved us!

Universal Prayers

With one voice, let us bring our prayers to our merciful Father.

For our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, that he may be strengthened as he embarks on his ministry of unity, love, and peace.
