



WELCOME



Jesus said to his disciples: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem.

You are witnesses of these things."

This Sunday, we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ into Heaven. He returns to the Father to send the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and inaugurate the era of the Church. Amazingly, Jesus entrusts the Mission of Salvation to his disciples, then and now. We need to take responsibility for sharing and building up the Catholic faith in our families and community.

Therefore, brothers, be all the more eager to make your call and election firm, for, in doing so, you will never stumble. For, in this way, entry into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and savior Jesus Christ will be richly provided for you. (2 Peter 1:10-11)

Have you ever heard of the Latin phrase, nemo dat quod non habet? It means that you cannot give away what you do not possess. Ascension Sunday reminds us to take our spiritual lives and relationship with Jesus more seriously each day to be better witnesses to Christ to those we meet. Let us use these summer months to build up our daily habits of prayer, study, and service, instead of taking a vacation from them. I encourage everyone to call upon the Holy Spirit in these days leading up to Pentecost. Our parish website has a traditional novena for you to use if you wish: elcatholics.org/holy-spirit-novena. And, even after May is over, keep praying the Rosary daily for world peace and for God's protection from all harm.

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. When our hearts are broken, we can come to Jesus and know that he understands as his heart bleeds for love of us. There are lots of Sacred Heart devotions to explore, and—as a start—I recommend learning about St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and the 12 Promises of the Sacred Heart. Jesus loves us more than we'll ever know! You can find the Litany to the Sacred Heart and learn more on our website: eleatholics.org/litany-of-the-sacred-heart-of-jesus. There is also a printable PDF of the litany.

On First Saturday, June 7, I will offer a presentation entitled, The Mission & Conditions of Discipleship. This is a scriptural overview just in time for Pentecost! Come to Fr. Mac Hall after the 9:00am Saturday Mass at St. Thomas on June 7. Refreshments will be served.

Seven men will be ordained to the priesthood for our diocese on June 14 at St. Thomas! There will be no 9:00am Saturday Mass that day. Please pray for these ordination candidates! Find the Novena online at elcatholics.org/ordination-novena.

Our Concerts in the Park(ing Lot) will return on Friday, June 20, in front of the Grand Window at St. Thomas with Fr. Peter Clark & Red Cedar River Boys. There will be food and family fun.

To celebrate the conclusion of our National Eucharistic Revival and Jubilee Year of Hope, our diocese will offer 40–Hours devotion between Pentecost and Corpus Christi Sunday. This means that St. Thomas will host Eucharistic Adoration from Sunday evening, June 8, until Tuesday morning, June 10. Sign up to sit with Jesus at elcatholics.org/adoration. Plus, the diocese will offer a 10:00am Mass in Lugnut Stadium on Saturday, June 21, and all are welcome. Then there will be a Eucharistic procession back to the cathedral afterwards. Visit eucharisticjourney.org for further details or to RSVP! Our parish procession on Corpus Christi will be Sunday, June 22 after the 11:00am Mass.

May God renew and guide His Church in the Holy Spirit!





Alternative Spring Break Reflection



Hi, my name is Mitchell Lorenz, and I was the leader of the Jonestown Alternative Spring Break for 2025. This was my third year heading down to Jonestown, and I was excited to see what adventures would come about this year. We had 10

students sign up to go, along with a couple Catholic Spartan alumni that accompanied us on the trip. These alumni were a big help when it came to the details of each project. A huge shoutout to Andy Randazzo, Pat Wharton, Patty Long, Antonina Klatka, and our very own campus minister Anna Stankewitz for all of their contributions.

Here is a run down of the different projects completed during our time in Jonestown: For two different houses in the town, we built new stairways and decks that are much more stable, so that the owners can have an easier time getting in and out of their homes.

This project involved a lot of measuring, cutting, and drilling pieces together, and it was satisfying once we finally got the decks into place.

We also completed a renovation of two bathrooms in one house. This included replacing the plumbing, flooring, drywall, toilets, shower, and vanities. This project took up a majority of the work done, and it allowed many people to do construction work that we had not done before. While working on the bathrooms, we noticed a shed in the back of the house that was deteriorating. For the safety of everyone in the house, a group of us took time to demolish the shed, and then we put the remnants of the shed in a dumpster to be taken away. This was my favorite project, solely because it was enjoyable to hit the structure with a sledgehammer and watch it tumble down.

Along with the projects that we completed, we also had a number of excursions while we were down

there. A tradition we have for Jonestown is to head into Clarksdale to go to Abe's BBQ, in which we were able to dine on some delicious Mississippi Barbeque and enjoy each other's company. A quirk about this year's ASB was that Ash Wednesday fell during spring break. We decided to go to Ash Wednesday Mass in Clarksdale. The church was beautiful, and it was a nice experience to be able to reflect on what we were doing halfway through ASB, and it allowed me to really be able to appreciate the gifts that God gave all of us to use to glorify him. It also was fitting that the start of Lent, a time meant for prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, happened while we were giving up our spring breaks in order to serve others that we do not see on a daily basis. During the week we also saw many of the children in Jonestown, and we went outside and played football with them. That was a fun experience during the week.





Overall, Jonestown has become one of my favorite weeks. I won't say that this week was easy, as there were times in which I wondered why I gave up my spring break to do this again, but ultimately I came to love and appreciate Jonestown and the work, just like in the past few years. I'm glad and thankful for everyone who came together to help make this happen.

As we come to the final week of this Easter Season, this is also the final week of this column on the Liturgy of the Hours. So let's take time to review some of what we have covered the past 13 weeks:

- Liturgy is a sacred service and God's work in us.
- The Hours refer to the different times this liturgy is celebrated to sanctify the whole day.
- We can access these prayers using the Shorter Christian Prayer books at St. John's or apps on a mobile device (Divine Office or iBreviary, for example).
- This liturgy follows the Church calendar and keeps us in sync with the different liturgical seasons.
- In the Liturgy of the Hours, we pray the same prayers Jesus prayed: the Psalms.
- This prayer is the voice of the bride, the Church, addressing Christ, her "bridegroom."
- It can be an effective way to pray for the dead.
- It is a great way to prepare for the Eucharist and extend our thanksgiving.
- Here we pray with the Scriptures and are formed by the Word of God.
- It allows us to lift our voices and hearts to God in songs of praise.
- Through intercessions, we consecrate our day to God and daily lift up those in need of prayer.

May this great treasure of the Liturgy of the Hours help us all to live out the exhortation of Saint Paul to "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)



That the World May Believe

I love today's Gospel because, in it, Jesus prays for me. And you.

And the guy sitting next to you at Mass. And the priest, and the altar server, and all the people in all the churches in all the towns in all the world who woke up this morning and headed to Mass because, while it's true that God is everywhere, the Body and Blood of Jesus is only found in one place.

And he prays for the barista who will sell you your coffee later today and see your crucifix and hear you say, "God bless," and think, "That's a weird necklace, and I don't believe in God," but who will one day, at her lowest point, wonder if anyone ever truly loved her, and remember the sight of that broken and bloodied Corpus.

Today, Jesus prays for the person you passed on the way into the parking lot this morning, the one who doesn't go to Mass anymore but who always walks his dog on this street, on this morning, for reasons he can't explain.

He prays for your great-great grandparents and your great-great grandchildren.

"Those who will believe in me through their word." That's me. That's you. That's us. We're the ones who believe through the word of the Apostles, who bore witness to the life and death and Resurrection of the God-Man, Jesus Christ, and whose testimony to that life is an eternal flame illuminating the understanding of every human being who will ever say, "I believe."

But if we listen to what Jesus says today, we must understand: it's not just the Apostles' job, and it's not done. It's not a book that is closed. It's a mission that is alive and ongoing, and it's as much ours as it was theirs: that the world may believe that you sent me.

"God is most glorified in us when we are most satisfied in Him". Focus on gratitude and finding joy in your faith, even during challenging times. Remember that Jesus is always with you, offering strength and comfort.

DEVOTIONS EXPLAINED

Prayer After Meals, Explained
Just as praying before a meal, praying after
a meal is meant to inspire in Christians an
attitude of thanksgiving and an
acknowledgment of our dependence on
God.

Though it is a less common practice in the modern world, early Church fathers like Tertullian and St. Jerome extolled the importance of praying after a meal, and the Christian poet Prudentius composed hymns for before and after meals ("ante cibum" and "post cibum").

There are no "official" prayers for after a meal, but the most common one said by Catholics is this: "We give thee thanks, almighty God, for all your benefits, who lives and reigns forever and ever. And may the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace." It is a benediction which recalls our perpetual fellowship with the entire Body of Christ, including those who have passed from this life.




