

And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy

Spirit

Happy Birthday! Pentecost commemorates the birth of the Church as the Holy Spirit sends the apostles out to preach, teach and baptize the nations. We too share in that continued mission of salvation with the Holy Spirit to guide us. The challenge is in learning how to "listen" to the Spirit.

The Jesuits have developed a technique called the Daily Examen. It just takes a few minutes before you go to sleep to review your day and reflect on where and how God is working in your life. [Note: This is not an Examination of Conscience to recall and confess your sins.] The Daily Examen—although there are variations, of course—is typically completed in five simple steps:

- (1.) Call on the Holy Spirit to help you to see your day through God's eyes.
- (2.) Review your day and all that happened.
- (3.) Give thanks for all of the blessings of the day.
- (4.) Give to Jesus all of the shortcomings of your day.
- (5.) For all of the mysteries of the day and your challenges in the day to come, end by asking the Holy Spirit to guide you to greater understanding.

Again, there are variations in this exercise, such as switching steps 2 & 3 by giving thanks before reviewing your day. But, however you do it, taking time to call on the Holy Spirit and to prayerfully review your day can only help you to grow as a Christian disciple.

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. When our hearts are broken, we can come to Jesus and know that he understands our pain. There are lots of Sacred Heart devotions to explore, and—as a start—I recommend learning about St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and the 12 Promises of the Sacred Heart. Our bishop has also asked us to offer prayers, fasting and almsgiving on the Fridays of June for the intention of peace in the Holy Land.

To celebrate the conclusion of our National Eucharistic Revival and Jubilee Year of Hope, our diocese will offer 40-Hours devotion between Pentecost and Corpus Christi Sunday. This means that St. Thomas will host Eucharistic Adoration from Sunday evening, June 8, until Tuesday morning, June 10. You can still look for available hours via our parish website: elcatholics.org/adoration. If you are coming for the night hours, we will leave the front Alton Street doors and doors by the Cana Chapel unlocked. So feel free to park in the front drive by the Grande Window and spend the night with Jesus. Thank you for your devotion!

Seven men will be ordained to the priesthood for our diocese on June 14 at St. Thomas! There will be no 9:00am Saturday Mass that day. And please pray for these ordination candidates!

Our Concerts in the Park(ing Lot) will return on Friday, June 20, in front of the Grand Window at St. Thomas with Fr. Peter Clark & Red Cedar River Boys. There will be food and family fun.

The diocese will offer Mass in Lugnut Stadium on Saturday, June 21, at 10:00am and all are welcome. Afterward, there will be a Eucharistic procession back to the cathedral. Visit <u>eucharisticjourney.org</u> for details! Again, we will cancel the 9:00am Saturday Mass at St. Thomas on June 21 so that everyone can attend this Mass.

Finally, the Parish Corpus Christi Procession and Potluck are happening on Sunday, June 22 after the 11:00am Mass at St. Thomas. To sign up to bring something to the potluck, go to elcatholics.org/connecting.





Fridays for Peace in the Holy Land:

Bishop Earl Boyea has asked that we consider offering prayers, fasting, and almsgiving each Friday in June, Month of the Sacred Heart, for peace in the Holy Land. This includes Friday, June 13, Feast of Saint Anthony of Padua, patron of the Holy Land.

Upon that day, Bishop Boyea suggests we bring lilies, as is customary upon Saint Anthony's feast, to a local shrine or altar dedicated to Saint Anthony. Lilies are the

symbol of Our Lady of Peace. As for almsgiving, Bishop Boyea recommends donating to the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, cnewa.org/, the official papal agency dedicated to giving pastoral and humanitarian support to the Middle East, including the Holy Land.

2025 Alternative Spring Break Reflection



This year's Alternative Spring Break trip to Tupelo, Mississippi was a week filled with joy, laughter, building of friendships, singing, meaningful work, and most importantly, a deepening of our faith. Partnering with Habitat for

Humanity, we witnessed the amazing commitment and kindness of the people of Tupelo at the worksite and in the community. Throughout the week, our Tupelo team worked diligently on a variety of construction tasks, preparing a house for an incoming Tupelo resident. From 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., we were tasked with laying down sod, installing baseboards and

trim, and painting walls, among other duties. Above all, we started and ended our work day in prayer, recognizing that our main purpose was to live out God's call of love, charity, and service.

On Monday, we met with Tracy, the Construction Supervisor for Habitat for Humanity, who had also worked with us on last year's

trip. He directed us to lay down stacks of sod in a staggered pattern to create the lawn for the front and back yards of the house. We immediately got to work laying down the grass squares, which ended up taking the entire work day! On Tuesday, the team began to work on installing baseboards under the guidance of Tracy and Ronnie, another Construction Supervisor. Using a miter saw, the Tupelo team made 45° cuts into the baseboards to properly install them into the corners of each room and closet. Although the cutting process took some trial and error, the team was able to cover each room with baseboards in the span of two days! On Wednesday, the team installed the guarter round molding to each of the baseboards. Then, after all the baseboard and quarter rounds were caulked and nailed into place, the team began the painting process. We painted the walls of each room and inside the closet as well as the doors. On Thursday, the last work day, we painted the second coat of paint to the walls and installed the door knobs, toilets, and finally, the kitchen appliances. On


Friday, after a week of hard work and heartfelt service, the team got a chance to take much needed rest, play some spikeball, or catch up on some homework. We also had the chance to explore Downtown Tupelo, stepping into the legendary General Store where Elvis Presley bought his very first guitar!

Without a doubt, we had an amazing trip, which could have not been possible without the kindness of both the people at Habitat for Humanity and the Tupelo Team. When we arrived at the house where we'd be staying for the week, Carlee, the Office Manager at Habitat immediately came to greet us with open arms. Mary Ann, the Executive Director at Habitat not only provided us with food for the trip but also transportation to and from the worksite! Tracy and Ronnie also were extremely kind, enthusiastic, and patient in assisting us throughout

the work day. Furthermore, the Tupelo team was amazing especially during the team meals where members stepped up to help cook the meals or clean up afterward. Last, but certainly not least, Fr. Corey helped keep us focused on our faith, reminding us to offer up our sacrifices and troubles to the Lord, especially when the work day got tiring. Further, beginning our day with

morning mass and ending in Night Prayer really helped to keep us focused on our faith, reminding us to put God first in everything we do.

Words can only describe so much about the blessings of the Alternative Spring Break in Tupelo. What I do know for certain is that this year's trip helped to build strong friendships as I heard excitement about next year's trip on the bus ride home. More than anything, our trip to Tupelo embodied what it truly means to serve others as Christians

Leaving the Room

I was a full-grown adult before I realized that Pentecost is known as "the birthday of the Church," and it only resonated with me because someone showed up to a church function with cake and candles. Leave it to buttercream frosting to drive home a theological reality I had been missing for 25 years.

I knew what Pentecost was, of course. It simply went over my head that, despite all the incredible, world-changing things that had come before the moment of Pentecost, prior to this day, the Apostles were just a group of guys in a room. It wasn't until Pentecost that they became the Church.

So what makes the Church...well, the Church, capital C? What makes it more than just a group of guys in a room?

It's true, they were a very special group of guys. They had the Truth — capital T. They had borne witness to Christ's miracles, to his life and to his passion and death. But they were still in that room.

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they received graces and gifts that made them fit to carry out the Great Commission. The Truth wasn't enough, even with a capital T. They needed the Spirit — capital S — and more than that, they needed to receive it with the courage and faith necessary to do what needed to be done.

To get up and leave the room.

Because what good is any of it unless they leave the room? What does it matter, the tongues of fire and the miraculous bilingualism and, frankly, the coming of the Spirit, if no one ever hears about it?

The mission is what made them the Church. It's what makes us the Church. Without it, we're just a bunch of guys in a room.

Jesus has promised that you will abide with us forever through an Advocate, your Spirit of truth, the Holy Spirit. That same Spirit has become our teacher, our hope, our peace.

DEVOTIONS EXPLAINED Prayer Before Meals

Anyone who has ever dined in a Catholic home has probably heard the prayer before meals that begins with the famous words: "Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts." These words in particular are first found in the Galesian Sacramentary, a book of Christian liturgy that dates to the seventh or eighth century, but the practice of praying before meals is Biblical, harkening back to the Jewish ritual washing of hands before eating. In the Gospels, Jesus is shown praying before the Last Supper and other meals, setting an example followed by Paul in Acts 27:35.

In his 2015 encyclical Laudato Sl', Pope Francis urged the faithful "to return to this beautiful and meaningful custom."

"That moment of blessing," he wrote,
"reminds us of our dependence on God for
life; it strengthens our feeling of gratitude for
the gifts of creation...(and) reaffirms our
solidarity with those in greatest need."




