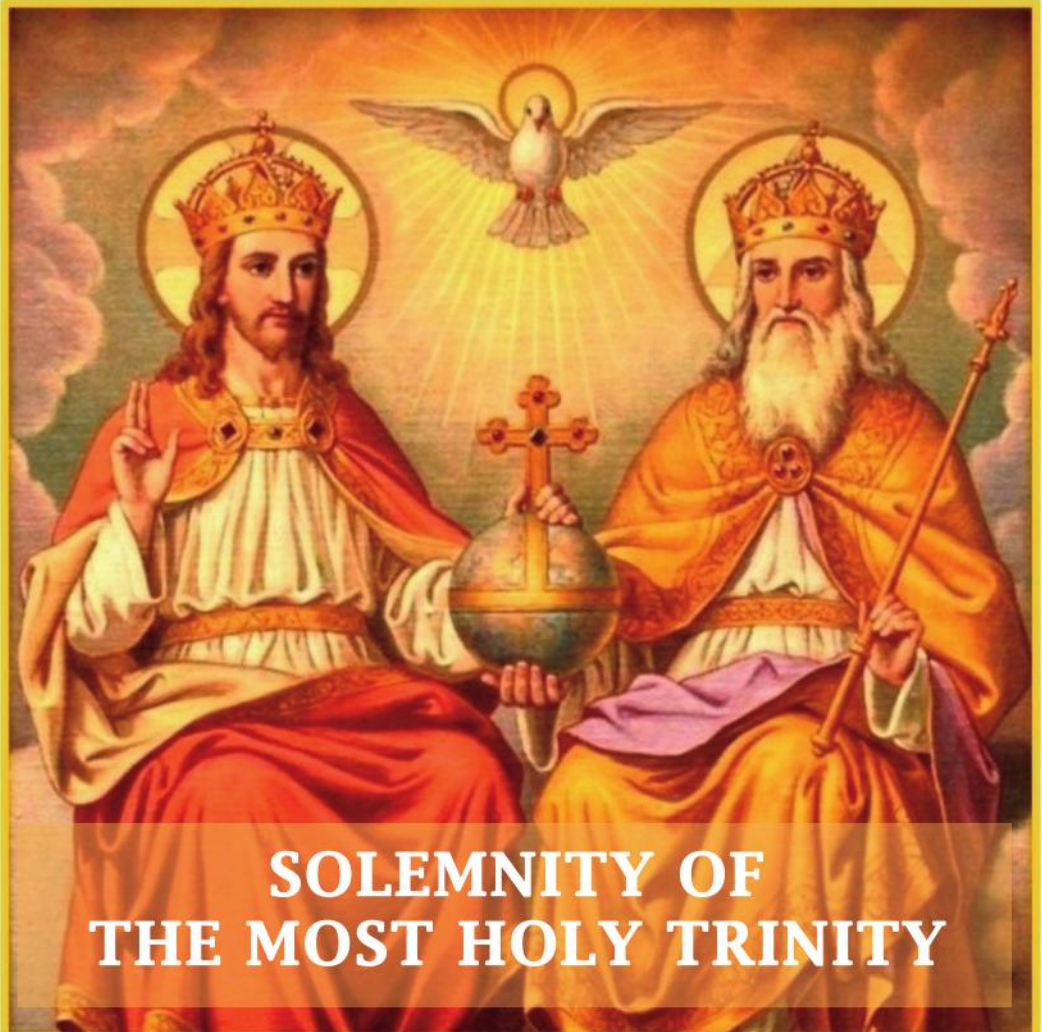

Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in hope of the glory of God.

This weekend, we celebrate the **Most Holy Trinity**. As it states in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them" (para., #234). Although we do not know everything about the interior life of God, we rejoice in the revelation that God is Trinity, a community of divine persons and prototype of the family. As Heaven is the perfection of our relationship with God and neighbor, let us ask Jesus, Mary, and Joseph (The Holy Family of Nazareth) for help in our struggling relationships and family conflicts, as a preparation for the heavenly unity which is to come. Forgiveness and reconciliation are never easy, but they are the way to eternal life. May God bring us peace through the Prince of Peace, Jesus Christ!

Happy Father's Day! The love of Christ urges us to live a life of prayer and service to others even as the world sends the opposite message. Appropriately, we celebrate **Father's Day** this Sunday. To all of our physical and spiritual fathers, thank you for being a steadfast presence of love in our lives. May you continue to reflect the love of God the Father, and, through the intercession of St. Joseph, may all of our fathers—living and deceased—be blessed!

Speaking of *Corpus Christi* weekend, there will be a **FREE Bluegrass Concert in the Park(ing Lot)** with Fr. Peter Clark and

the Red Cedar River Boys on Friday, June 20, in front of the Grand Window at St. Thomas. Bring a lawn chair and a sun hat. There will be a food truck available also.

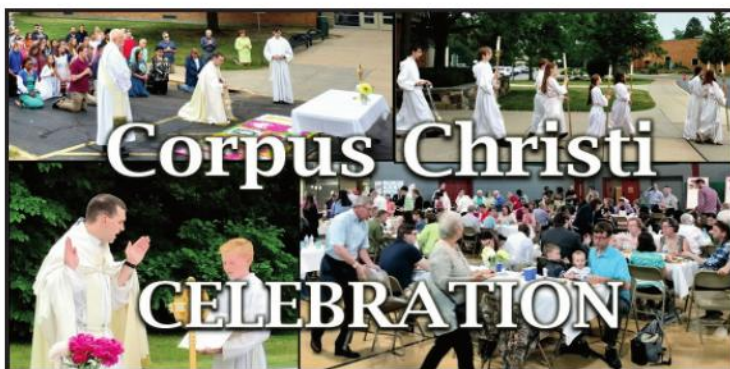

Helping the Homeless in Lansing

One of the ministries of the St. Vincent de Paul Society at St. John is

coordinating support for Loaves and Fishes transitional shelter in Lansing. Transitional sheltering means 24/7 longer term housing that offers the opportunity for residents to get the job training and experience, education and other long-term solutions needed to be able to secure and keep permanent housing.

We welcome parishioners to join us with any of the following:

- Prepare and deliver a home-cooked meal for 12 residents on the second or third Sundays of the month. (We're glad to reimburse you for the ingredients.)
- Serve a meal and perform light kitchen duties from 6:00 to 9:00pm, one or more days per month.
- Donate bedding for a bunk bed (bedsheets, comforter, mattress pad or pillow) for the newly renovated residence for single women.
- Help with occasional yardwork or light maintenance chores twice annually.

Loaves and Fishes provides short-term emergency and long-term transitional housing, advocacy and support services for homeless adults.

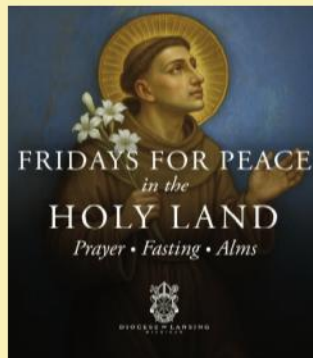

The Best Kind of Mystery

"Do you have a mystery for me to solve?"

If I've heard it once, I've heard it a hundred times. My daughter is obsessed with mysteries. It's not enough for her to read about them in the pages of every Nancy Drew book she can get her hands on. She wants more than that. She wants a real-life mystery. A puzzle that resists being solved. A question that eludes an answer. Something that isn't easy to wrap her head around.

And not surprisingly, she's not satisfied with the "mysteries" I can offer her. The Mystery of Mom's Missing Hair Tie (spoiler alert: it was in my purse). The Mystery of the Missing Lunch Ham (oops, Mom finished it).

Simple answers are so boring. "Will I ever have a real mystery?" she moans.

I get it. We're all this way, really. We are drawn to the mysterious, to the inscrutable. It's because we know that the answers to the really big questions are ones that can't be explained in a neat and tidy way. We know that the reality of life and love and the human condition is something we can't quite fit our heads around. We know that there is so much in this world, in this universe, that we can't...understand. So, in a way, mysteries are the only things that really make sense to us.

Why do we love mysteries so much? Because God is a mystery. And that's never as clear as it is today, on the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, the mystery that boondoggles us all. Four relations. Three persons. One God.

Don't ask me to explain it. I could, but I don't have the word space, and frankly, it might not even make sense then. It's a mystery, you see. A real one. The best kind.

LIVE THE LITURGY – INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

As much as we may not want to admit it, we all want to be healed. Human beings suffer physically, mentally, socially, and spiritually. Of all of the wounds that can afflict us, the ones that require the greatest are of a spiritual nature. Think what can happen if we are healed inwardly, brought back to center, and restored in our relationships, especially in our relationship with God. Be persistent in your faith and seek the inner healing that you so desperately desire.

DEVOTIONS EXPLAINED

Memorare

The Memorare is a prayer to the Blessed Mother in which the supplicant calls upon the maternal love and protection of Mary's intercession in an hour of dire need. "I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother," reads one section of the prayer, which goes on to beseech "the Mother of the Word Incarnate" to receive these petitions with love and mercy.

Popularized in the 17th century by a French priest named Fr. Claude Bernard, the text is derived from an older and longer prayer entitled "Ad sanctitatis tuae pedes, dulcissima Virgo Maria" ("at your holy feet, most sweet Virgin Mary"). The title "Memorare" is taken from the Latin word for "remember," which begins the prayer. The modern version appears in the 1846 *Raccolta*, a collection of indulgenced prayers.

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thine intercession was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.
