

This weekend also marks the conclusion of the National Eucharistic Revival, a three-year initiative of the US bishops (2022-2025) to renew our knowledge of and love for Jesus in the Eucharist, the Source and Summit of our Catholic faith. And thank you to all who participated in the Diocesan Eucharistic Procession yesterday or this Sunday's Parish Procession after the Ilam Mass! June 22-29 is Religious Freedom Week. This week concludes with the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. When our hearts are broken, we can come to Jesus and Mary and know that they understand the pain of sacrifice and loss. First Friday and First Saturday devotions are meant to honor the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts and make up for the sins of ingratitude, mockery and indifference by which they are offended. 

Eucharistic Procession and Potluck

Come celebrate the Feast of the Eucharist June 22!

SUNDAY, JUNE 22, TODAY! is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ.

The celebration will take place after the 11:00am Mass. You are welcome to come to any part of the event.

The PROCESSION will leave the back of St. Thomas Church and processes around the perimeter of the property. We'll stop and pray briefly at each of four directions – west, south, east, and north as a way of expressing our desire to bring Jesus with us as we go out into the world. The procession will conclude with BENEDICTION in front of the Parish School Gym.

EVERYONE is invited to the **POTLUCK** in the gym at 12:30pm.

Mass Intentions

Mass Intention books will be opened for 2026 starting June 30.

No Mass requests will be taken via email. Requests for Mass intentions must be requested by phone, in person in the Parish Office, or by mail.

A \$10 minimum stipend is requested as determined by diocesan policy is to accompany each Mass request. A Mass offering may be more than the suggested stipend. However, no one will be denied a Mass intention because of inability to pay. Simply let us know.

Guidelines for Mass Intentions

A Mass intention may be requested for: a deceased loved one; a living person who is sick or suffering; a living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life; in thanksgiving to God (including the Lord Jesus or the Holy Spirit); in thanksgiving for a prayer from a Blessed or a Saint; or for a prayer intention (so long as the intention does not contradict Church teaching), World Peace, Vocations, Respect for Life, Souls in Purgatory, etc. These intentions should be general and not specific to an individual.

Priests are requested, but are not required, to announce the name of the Intention aloud.

Regardless of if read aloud, please be assured the graces of the Holy Mass are still applied to the soul of the person or the special intention that you requested it be offered for.

As a parish, we will make every effort to accommodate a Mass for the passing of a loved one, on/near the anniversary of the first anniversary of a person's death.

Lengthy intention listings cannot be published in the Bulletin and must be edited for the sake of brevity.

Requests will be honored on a first-come, first serve basis in the order in which the request is received at the Parish Office.

The schedule of Mass intentions is subject to change according to the Mass schedule. There is no promise that they will be said on the scheduled day due to priest illness, schedule change, diocesan obligation, etc. Every attempt will be made to contact the concerned parties ahead of time, but that is not always possible. We will make every effort to reschedule the mass at a later date.



June is the Month of The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Attention Parents: Child Baptism



If you have a child or children who need to be baptized please do so before they turn 7 years old. While the Sacrament is the same for everyone, the preparation needed for the

Sacraments does differ depending on a person's age and circumstances. Unlike infants, a child 7 years old or older has attained the age of reason and needs to take a basic Catholic Faith formation course before baptism.

For those who are age 7 or older, they are capable of knowing right and wrong and therefore need to have a rudimentary grasp of the Catholic Faith before receiving the Sacrament of Baptism. These classes are often known as OCIC (Order of Christian Initiation for Children) Classes or Becoming Catholic. In the process, the child will likely also be studying for First Holy Communion, First Confession, and possibly Confirmation at the same time.

It is very difficult to have to let parents and children know that because they are seven or older they cannot receive First Reconciliation or First Communion with their classmates. They must take classes like anyone else who comes into the Church and receives all of their sacraments (even Confirmation) at Easter Vigil. If you have a small child who is not baptized, Schedule his/her baptism this summer!



Shared lodging: \$175 per person



As the Day Was Drawing to a Close

It isn't uncommon for me to get to the noon hour only to realize that I haven't yet eaten anything that day.

It drives my husband crazy. He was raised by a bunch of Italian women, so he can't help but think three meals ahead. And don't get me wrong, I love food — I literally dream of donuts. But some days, I'm just so busy and I keep putting it off until I realize how weak I feel, how light-headed. And I think to myself: Stupid, you've done it again.

This is what comes to mind today, on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, as I read the Gospel account of the miracle of the loaves and fishes.

I think of hunger, distraction and the poor planning of those who pride themselves on being capable.

"As the day was drawing to a close," it is written — that's when the disciples finally realized that 5,000 hangry people is not an ideal situation.

I wonder, did Jesus roll his eyes when they came to him, and think, "Finally"? At any point he could have pulled out a fish and said a blessing. But he waited for them to ask. He waited for them to realize how badly they needed it.

Sometimes we forget that we need the Eucharist. It's not just a nice thing to have, a sweet act of devotion, a sacramental item that bolsters our faith. The Eucharist is none of those things. The Eucharist is the food without which we will die. The Eucharist is something we must seek out. Remember: the day is drawing to a close.

Today, on this celebration of the feast of Corpus Christi, we come and seek to respond to his grace to dare to do all we can, to be filled with wonder, to receive an increase of faith, to examine our consciences, and to follow him more and more deeply along the path of light and life into a holy communion that is nourished here at Mass, extends throughout the whole of life and is meant to lead us to that communion with God and with the saints that will know no end. "Blessed are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb!" Blessed indeed are we to be here.

DEVOTIONS EXPLAINED Pilgrimage

When the time came for the Transfiguration of Christ, Jesus took three of his disciples to "a high mountain by themselves," indicating that the sacred mysteriousness of this moment was something best experienced apart from the routine of ordinary life. This is the principle behind the act of pilgrimage: a journey to a place of spiritual significance, undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

Christian pilgrimages really began in the fourth century, when churches in the Holy Land were constructed in locations associated with the life of Christ. Throughout the centuries, pilgrims have likewise flocked to sites of Marian apparitions, miracles, and to places connected with the lives of saints.

2025, is a Jubilee Year, a period of special grace and spiritual renewal, will be celebrated by Catholics worldwide. This year is particularly significant as the theme is "Pilgrims of Hope," encouraging people to seek hope in a world facing various challenges. Pilgrimages during this period are especially meaningful, offering opportunities to visit holy sites, receive plenary indulgences, and deepen faith.




