Then he told them a parable. "There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?'"

Today's Gospel reading about the rich

man who hoards his surplus is well-timed after last weekend's Summer Mission Appeal with Fr. Jack Tierney, from the Augustinians of the Midwest. If you still wish to contribute, please address your checks to this parish but write "mission appeal" on the memo line so that we can gather the funds and forward them. Thank you for your generosity!

As we adore the Sacred Heart of Jesus in June and his Most Precious Blood in July, the month of August is dedicated to the **Immaculate Heart of Mary**. Our Lady's Immaculate Heart is often depicted as pierced for love of us with a sword of sorrow (or even 7 swords, which equate to the 7 sorrows of Mary). How do we honor Our Lady's heart? In addition to praying the Holy Rosary, consider trying the First Saturday devotion, forms of consecration like wearing the Brown Scapular or Miraculous Medal, acts of penance in reparation for sinners, or simply by praying a Hail Mary for each of Our Lady's seven sorrows:

- The Prophecy of Simeon: When Jesus was presented at the Temple, Simeon prophesied that a sword would pierce Mary's heart.
- The Flight into Egypt: Mary and Joseph had to flee to Egypt with the infant Jesus to escape King Herod's persecution.
- The Loss of Jesus in the Temple: Mary and Joseph lost Jesus in Jerusalem for three days, and they found him in the Temple teaching the elders.
- The Meeting of Mary and Jesus on the Way to Calvary: Mary encountered her son Jesus as he carried the cross towards his crucifixion.
- The Crucifixion of Jesus: Mary witnessed her son's crucifixion and death.
- The Taking Down of Jesus from the Cross: Mary received her son's body after he was taken down from the cross.
- The Burial of Jesus: Mary witnessed the burial of her son in the tomb.

Looking Ahead: The Solemnity of the **Assumption of the Blesed Virgin Mary** (Aug. 15) will be a holy day of obligation this year. Then the Parish Picnic will be celebrated that weekend (Aug. 16/17). There will be a

Saturday night celebration for the whole family that includes a bier garten for those ages 21+, as well as the usual Noon – 3pm festivities hosted by the Knights of Columbus on Sunday. That Sunday evening, Aug. 17, is the annual Priesthood Discernment Dinner with Bishop Boyea and our diocesan seminarians at St. Francis Retreat Center in DeWitt. Men age 17 and up are welcome to RSVP and attend: lansingpriest.org/opportunities/.



Attention Parents:

If you have children who need to be baptized, please do so before they turn 7 years old.

Those 7 or older, are capable of knowing right and wrong and therefore need to have a rudimentary grasp of the Catholic Faith before receiving the Sacrament of Baptism. These classes are often known as OCIC (Order of Christian Initiation for Children) Classes or Becoming Catholic. In the process, the child will also be studying for First Holy Communion, First Confession, and possibly Confirmation at the same time. It is very difficult to have to let parents and children know that because they are 7 or older they cannot receive First Reconciliation or First Communion with their classmates.

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - BENEATH THE SURFACE

The Barn

It's 9:08 on a Saturday morning, and I am too darn busy for confession.

I've probably written before about how hard I find it to get to confession — I say 'probably' because I really can't remember. I whine about it so frequently that it's hard to tell if I've made it the subject of a written piece or if it is simply an oft-recited refrain from the Litany of Colleen's Perpetual Complaints.

During the week, it's tough to get to confession because I have little kids who are attached to me like Velcro, and I don't need them listening in on (and eventually repeating to everyone) my sins. On the weekend it's a little easier, but our parish doesn't offer it before or after Sunday Mass, just on Saturdays. Saturday is when I get most of my work done, so getting absolution usually comes at the expense of productivity.

And that, friends, right here, is my barn. Productivity. That's the proverbial storehouse of my earthly harvest.

For the rich man in the parable, it's a literal barn, filled to bursting with sellable crops. For you it might be money or your job title or what your life looks like to other people on social media. For me, it's Getting Things Done. That's my barn, the repository that holds the whole of my worldly preoccupations.

And it's so full I want to tear it down and build a new one. A bigger one. One that can hold more worry, more time for work, more focus on output and crossing things off a to-do list. Vanity of vanities, indeed.

If I die tonight, the deadlines will go unmet, and no one will even notice. But God, when He meets me in the world to come, will surely ask me why I couldn't take 45 minutes to accept a gift He tried again and again to give me.

I have to burn the barn, friends. I don't want to, but I have to. I'm closing my laptop and going to church.

HOLY HOUR, EXPLAINED!

A holy hour is the practice of spending one hour's time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, praying and meditating on the agony of Jesus Christ. More broadly, a holy hour can also refer to any 60 minutes set aside in prayer and reflection, whether in church or elsewhere.

The holy hour devotion dates to the late 17th century, when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received visions of Jesus Christ. In these visions, the Lord requested that St. Margaret Mary spend one hour every Thursday evening lying prostrate and meditating upon his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. This practice calls back to the Gospel of Matthew, in which Jesus asks his disciples, "Could you not stay awake with me one hour?" (Mathew 26:40) as he awaits His passion.

Holy hours can be made privately or in community, and the USCCB has created a variety of different holy hour formats that can be found at usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/prayers-and-devotions/eucharistic-devotion.

Our parish website, <u>elcatholics.org/devotions</u> also has a collection or prayers, prayer practices and devotions. Remember, there are many ways to "make a Holy Hour" – and it doesn't even have to be an hour! To live like Christ, you need to know Christ.


