WELCOME



Jesus said to his disciples: "Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are

those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival."

We are challenged to make an accounting of our stewardship in today's Gospel. The longer version of this passage concludes with the familiar warning: "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more." Stewardship consists of time, talent and treasure for sure, but it also extends to our ownership of Christ's mission of teaching, baptizing, and caring for vulnerable lives.

As I shared in my homily last weekend – regarding the Parable of the Rich Fool – there is a relationship whereby the poor rely on the rich for earthly material support, but the rich rely on the poor spiritually for good works, almsgiving, and deeds of mercy to prove their faith and atone for their sins. In short, the poor may need us for temporary support, but we need to serve them for our eternal salvation. As Jesus reminds us that the first will be last and the last first, let us be about the Lord's work as good stewards of our faith and resources.

On Monday, the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Clare of Assisi. Did you know that she is the patron saint of TV? In her later life, when too ill to attend Mass, the images and sounds of the Mass miraculously appeared on the wall of her room. Pope Pius XII, an Italian who knew this story, proclaimed St. Clare the patroness of television in 1957, when TV was relatively new. Let us ask the intercession of St. Clare for our TV Outreach Mass, now in its 40th year of operation. And if you wish to support this media outreach or learn more about it, please visit: www.outreachmass.org.

This week's Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Aug. 15) will be a holy day of obligation this year. Please see the cover for the options. Then on Saturday, Aug. 16, the Vigil Mass will be a Candidacy Mass for Deacon Formation. Bishop Boyea will preside and recognize the men and seminarians who are preparing for ordination to the diaconate.

There will be a Saturday night celebration for the whole family that includes a Bier Garten for those ages 21+, as well as the usual Noon – 3pm festivities hosted by the Knights of Columbus on Sunday. 



Attention Parents:

If you have children who need to be baptized, please do so before they turn 7 years old.

Those 7 or older, are capable of knowing right and wrong and therefore need to have a rudimentary grasp of the Catholic Faith before receiving the Sacrament of Baptism. These classes are often known as OCIC (Order of Christian Initiation for Children) Classes or Becoming Catholic. In the process, the child will also be studying for First Holy Communion, First Confession, and possibly Confirmation at the same time. It is very difficult to have to let parents and children know that because they are 7 or older they cannot receive First Reconciliation or First Communion with their classmates.

Are You Talking To Me?

Last summer I was at the National Eucharistic Congress when Fr. Mike Schmitz delivered an impassioned call to repentance in his keynote address during an evening revival session. The crowd received his message with great enthusiasm. Their applause and the cheers shook the Lucas Oil Stadium.

The next night, Sr. Josephine Garrett took the stage and, in her address, got into the nitty-gritty of what it means to be a disciple, what it means to live repentance — or, as she so beautifully put it, to embrace the hunger.

And in doing so, she called back to the previous night's thunderous approval of Fr. Mike's message.

"When I heard you clapping when Father said we need repentance, I was worried you thought he was talking about your neighbor's repentance," she said. "He is not."

In other words: he's talking about your repentance.

We all love a message about The Right Thing To Do. We all love when a priest or a nun or any Catholic with a microphone gets up and talks about the truth. We rise to our feet and applaud.

And then, too often, we take a deep breath and walk to our car and forget all about it — because we think they were talking to someone else. You know...the others. The ones who need to hear it. The ones who aren't being vigilant.

In today's Gospel, Peter asks Jesus, "Is this parable [of the absent master] meant for us, or for everyone?" (Luke 12:41). And Jesus answers him with a question. In so many words, he says this: "Do you want it to be for you? Are you ready to hear it?"

Whoever we are. Wherever we're from. Whatever our life looks like. However we pray. He's talking to us.

Are we ready to hear him?

HOUSE BLESSING EXPLAINED!

Catholics who move to a new place of residence often wish to have their dwelling blessed, to call the favor and help of God upon all those who live in the house and all those who will enter it.

The Roman Ritual (Book of Blessings) provides two formats for house blessings: one during the Easter or Christmas season (specifically for the Epiphany) and one for Ordinary Time. Those who live in the home must be present for a house to be blessed. A priest, deacon or lay person can administer the blessing, although if a lay person does so they must use the rites accorded to lay ministers in the Roman Ritual.

A house blessing includes Scripture readings, intercessions and a prayer of blessing.

If you're interested in getting your home blessed, call your parish and ask to set up an appointment to have a home blessing. It is customary to serve dinner or present a small gift, but you don't have to. However, if you do serve food, it's a wonderful way to get know your priest! Once the blessing starts, the priest will begin reciting prayers and will bless every room in the home with holy water. This is also a great time to have rosaries or holy images blessed.





