



Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

Cost of Discipleship: Our Gospel reading this weekend from Luke 14:25 –33 is tough but fair. If Jesus is truly

the Lord of our lives, then he must also be Lord of our relationships, possessions, and burdens. If Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14:6), then we must be prepared to follow him on our own way of the cross, shouldering the burdens of discipleship patiently. Is Jesus really commanding us to "hate" our lives and our families? Of course not! However, he often uses hyperbole (a conscious exaggeration) to catch our attention and make us reconsider our priorities. Do I put my comfort, relationships or material possessions before God the Almighty? If so, then I need to ask Jesus for the grace to seek him first in all things so as to put everything else in its proper relationship to God.

Today, the Church will canonize its first Millennial saint – Carlo Acutis – as well as another young adult saint – Pier Giorgio Frassati. If you wish to learn about these new saints, visit these sites for more information: carloacutis-en.org or frassatiusa.org.

September 8 is the day on which we celebrate the birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary, nine months after the Immaculate Conception, Dec. 8. Although we do not know her exact birth date, we have been celebrating her on this day for centuries. So please take a moment and honor the Blessed Mother with a 'Hail Mary' this Monday.

Prayers for Annunciation Parish: The news of the shooting at Annunciation Catholic Parish and School in Minneapolis is deeply upsetting. Let us pray for the healing of that community, especially for the children to grieve their losses and feel safe again. Undoubtedly, it was not easy for our own school community to gather in church for an All School Mass the very next day, but I am very grateful for the support of parents and community members to fill St. Thomas. And I am also thankful for the ELPD presence that day and for their continued presence on our parish campus. With the police station so close to St. John and St. Thomas, our emergency response time is excellent. Plus, given the diversity of our large parish, we have medical personal, first responders, retired military and police officers at Mass regularly.

As we work to continually improve our campus safety. I would like to focus on rebuilding our usher ministry at St. Thomas and St. John. We have not had ushers in years, and, given the instability of our modern world, having ushers at the entrances to church would serve as a deterrent as well as a welcoming presence to new members and visitors. There will be opportunities for our college students to sign-up for liturgical positions (including ushering) this Sunday at St. John and for our permanent community next Sunday at St. Thomas, in the gym during the pancake breakfast. I know that it is a commitment to come to Mass early, but please consider becoming an usher so as to rebuild this ministry ASAP. Daily Mass goers and school parents are also welcome to sign-up for usher training to assist the school and parish staff in watching over the All School Masses each week.

Although we may have many safety concerns for our children and students, let us be careful not to transfer our adult anxieties to our children. Please be careful to limit their access to the news media so that they don't become fearful. We want our students to feel

confident enough to follow instructions should an emergency occur. Let us prepare them well through training and safety drills without making them paranoid. September is National Preparedness Month. This is a good time to discuss safety with your family members and even practice shelter or fire drills at home. For example, if there were a fire at home and everyone left by different exits, does your family have a designated meeting spot, like a neighbor's home, as a gathering place to verify their immediate safety? You can find safety information for all sorts of situations at ready.gov/calendar or ready.gov/september.

Thank you all for your commitment to safety and for your continued prayers! As we look out for one another as Jesus intended, we will become a safer and more welcoming community.
