In support of Catholic Education, our bishop has begun a new 5-year pledge campaign entitled, Stewardship for Saints and Scholars:


stewardshipforsaintsandscholars.com. Before beginning this campaign, our parish conducted a feasibility study and refined its project goals. Now, this

In suffering, we can unite our lives with Christ's and grow closer to Him. Through the power of the cross, may we share in the triumph of Christ Jesus.




Everyone is invited to meet to pray the rosary on Wednesday, Sept. 17 at 9:30am at St. Thomas before the Senior Mass.




