



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

As I write this, the presbyterate of the Diocese is attending the Spring Conference at the Radisson here in Bismarck. Our presenter, Dr. Ben Nguyen, has been fantastic and dynamic, good for the Diocese. Wednesday evening, we gathered at the Corpus Christi Rectory for a social and dinner. My next programming for the Diocese Office of Continuing Education will be the annual Priest Retreat, which is always held in June at Assumption Abbey, Richardton.

The information and itinerary for the Pilgrimage to Israel was released during Holy Week and in less than 48 hours the participant list was full with a wait list. We currently have over 20 individuals on the wait list and are working on a second Pilgrimage for November 2024. We have worked hard to plan a Pilgrimage that combines religious, historical, and cultural experiences that immerse the pilgrim in the beautiful and soul-touching Holy Land. One comment I have received frequently, "Why plan so far in advance? 18 months is a long time away!" There are many reasons we do this, and I have been planning Pilgrimages for most of my priesthood. Behind the scenes, all the details are worked out while participants have the opportunity for installment payments instead of lump sums, which can hinder participation. Additionally, I have the chance to connect with our group prior to departure, through written communication and in person event(s) to prepare the group. This not only informs the group, but it builds excitement and community within the group. The difference between a tour and Pilgrimage is seen in the effect of the traveler. A sightseer's goal is the destination. For the pilgrim, what happens interiorly is the difference and sets a Pilgrimage apart from a tour. The time of preparation stirs the soul of the pilgrim to prepare them for the journey ahead so we can fully immerse ourselves in the Pilgrimage experience. If you are interested, I invite you to join us for this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to journey to the Holy Land. Someone once said we like our heroes dead more than alive. Cesar Chavez co-founded the United Farm Workers movement but found himself denounced as a communist and surveilled by the FBI during his lifetime. Only after death was his stature recognized, and he was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Encouraged by a priest who fueled him with Catholic social teaching, Chavez was also inspired by the nonviolent resistance of Gandhi. Along with lifelong co-worker Dolores Huerta, Chavez brought national attention to an abused yet fundamental part of our work force. Support farm workers' rights and remember at every table how your food got there.

Benedictine sister, best-selling author, and spiritual guide Macrina Wiederkehr was called a "master of everyday spirituality." She lived with the monastic community of St. Scholastica in Fort Smith, Arkansas and died on this day in 2020 at the age of 80. On this anniversary of her passing, let her words infuse your own everyday spirituality: "Holiness comes wrapped in the ordinary. There are burning bushes all around you. Every tree is full of angels. Hidden beauty is waiting in every crumb. . . . Real Presence is everywhere, and those with the hearts of children revel in it."

Mark left his mark

Mark wasn't a direct disciple of Jesus but was quite active in the Early Church. He was closest to Peter, the latter returning to Mark's mother's house after escaping prison. According to Saint Jerome: "Mark, the disciple and interpreter of Peter, wrote a short gospel at the request of the brethren at Rome embodying what he had heard Peter tell. When Peter had heard this, he approved it and published it to the churches to be read by his authority." Mark's short, action-packed gospel highlights the immediacy of Jesus' actions; Mark also uses the word *eutheos*—Greek for "right away"—more than 40 times. How might the Spirit be tapping you to act with immediacy?

The Catholic Church teaches that the "Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life." As such, it is essential to feeding our spirit and showing us the way to holiness. The very act of listening to the Word, sharing our gifts, and breaking bread with others during Mass is a foretaste of God's reign, where all are welcome to the table. A U.S. Bishops-sponsored Eucharistic Revival is underway to encourage all to encounter Christ in the Eucharist

The real deal

Today's gospel has a eucharistic theme, with talk of "living bread" and "flesh for the life of the world." One way the church emphasizes the Eucharist is its insistence on the Real Presence, that is, the core belief that the bread and wine consecrated at Mass truly are the Body and Blood of Christ. They are not just symbols but, as Saint John Damascene wrote, the "actual deified body of the Lord." If wrestling with that concept makes your head hurt, know that the church also acknowledges this is a "mystery"—something the mind cannot fully grasp. Leave it to the heart to understand.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 8:26-40; John 6:44-51 (276). "The bread that I will give is my Flesh for the life of the world."

What's in your wallet?

Stored in coin wallets, pockets, purses, jewelry boxes, and glove compartments are many hundreds of little beads. Some are held together by string or wire, others fashioned into metal "decade" rings with laminated instructional cards. No matter what form they take, each reminds us of a special prayer of the Catholic Church, the Rosary. Saint Louis Grignion de Montfort, known for his love of the Rosary, always made sure to teach people to pray the Rosary in whatever method best helps them enter into the mysteries of the life of Christ. What's your unique way of praying the beads?

The church has expressed its collective appreciation to her by bestowing the rare title of "doctor of the church" upon her.
