

You know prayer is important, but you still find it challenging. Perhaps it's hard to find time to pray, or you're unsure what to do when you do pray. Or maybe you feel restless and distracted and don't feel close to God.

You might struggle to trust God and surrender to his will. Or maybe you feel discouraged by your many weaknesses and your inability to overcome them. Ultimately, you worry that what you're doing in prayer isn't "working," because you aren't seeing major changes in your life.

If you have any of these feelings, you are not alone. Many of the saints had similar ones. Even the saints struggled in prayer, had complicated problems, and made mistakes. They were like us. But each time they fell, they got up again and learned to rely more on God's grace. And eventually they were changed.

What God did in countless saints, he wants to do in ordinary people like us. And that's what this study is about: the journey God wants to take us on in our prayer life, helping us learn how to cooperate during prayer and allowing him to act in our lives more fully. This is a perfect study with Edward Sri, to take you through the Lenten season.

From the Desk of Msgr. Patrick A. Schumacher, S.T.L., Pastor

We find ourselves at the last weekend of January. Perhaps you've already forgotten your New Year's resolution or if you're like me, you didn't make one. Although, I did quit chewing Copenhagen in January 2004, so I have 20 years of being tobacco free. What I do encourage you to do is a Lenten resolution, which it is not too early to begin thinking about. Lent, if you haven't realized, commences in a short two and a half weeks, on Ash Wednesday, February 14th. If Valentine's Day is a big deal for you and your significant other, you may want to celebrate early – perhaps "Fat ValenTuesday" (*Fat Tuesday + Valentine's Day*) could be a thing this year?! As we look ahead, I challenge you to be mindful of your Lenten journey. Don't just do "the same old thing." Try something new. Lent should be a time to grow closer to Christ through your acts of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Take some time this week to think about what you want to do for Lent.

I also ask that you take some time this week to prayerfully consider how you can assist Corpus Christi. As we responded in the Psalm of the day, "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." There are many needs the Church has and with a parish of our size, the need is only amplified. It takes many, many people to be the hands of Christ during our gathering as a Parish Family for the celebration of the Holy Mass. Have you ever taken a moment to really look around during Mass? It is often times the same faithful parishioners who serve in the various ministries at Mass. In my 30+ years as a priest, it has often been the same case. However, I have also always said to my staff in these 30+ years, someone can't help if they don't know the need. There are ministries for every ability – for everybody. Can you serve in some capacity as an individual? Can your family find ways to serve together? Thank you, in advance, for discerning how you can assist in the Liturgical Ministries at Mass.

WORD OF THE WEEK

Benedictus \be-na-'dik-tas\

From Latin meaning "blessed," the hymn sung by Zechariah, John the Baptist's father, an elder priest, who became mute on learning that he and Elizabeth would become parents late in life. After John's birth, Zechariah's tongue is loosed and he praises God with this canticle beginning: "Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, for he has come to his people and set them free" (Luke 1:68).

CONTEXT

Since the early centuries, the **Benedictus** has been sung in the morning prayer of the church's liturgy because of its praise for the coming of the Redeemer and its allusion to Christ coming as the dawn to give light to those in darkness.

May I have the courage today/ To live the life that I would love,/ To postpone my dream no longer,/ But do at last what I came here for/ And waste my heart on fear no more.

—John O'Donohue, Benedictus: A Book of Blessings

WHY IT MATTERS

The **Benedictus** is one of four canticles sung at the start of Luke's gospel, including Mary's Magnificat, (My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord), the song of the angels to the shepherds (Glory to God in the highest!), and Simeon's prayer at the presentation of Jesus in the temple (Lord, now you let your servant go in peace). Together these songs remind us that, in the face of good news, the most reasonable response is to sing. Joyful people know this. It is the most natural response to the graciousness of God who truly has "come to the people and set them free"!

From The General Instruction on the Liturgy of the Hours: The Gospel canticles, the *Benedictus*, the *Magnificat* and the *Nunc dimittis*, should be accorded the same solemnity and dignity as is usual for the hearing of the Gospel (138).

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

Why do we sing at Mass?

Saint Augustine, who said many things well, insisted: "Singing is for one who loves." This is the same Bishop Augustine who considered banning music from his church altogether. In the end he adhered to an older proverb: "Whoever sings well prays twice over." So pass out the song sheets.

Saint Paul was an earlier proponent of church music, back when church still gathered in somebody's house. He advocated that believers sing "psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God" (Col. 3:16). While Augustine got it right that singing is for lovers, happy people in general whistle while they work, and grateful people know they have something to sing about. This may explain why some folks in church are reluctant to sing. Without a significant increase in the spirit of joy and gratitude, don't expect an increase in responsive singers. Yet to those who love, feel joy, and are grateful, a little frivolity in public is in order.
