From the Desk of Msgr. Patrick A. Schumacher, S.T.L., Pastor

The third Eucharistic Encounter on February 27 was well attended and historic - as bishops commonly only visit parishes outside of the Cathedral for the Sacrament of Confirmation. As I said that evening, I am grateful to Bishop Kagan for his presence during the 90-minute event and it was a good Lenten experience for all of us in attendance. If you haven't read "It is the Lord!" (Bishop Kagan's Pastoral Letter), we have copies available in the literature rack by the Parish Office. And, if you missed the Encounter Night, it was livestreamed and is available on YouTube.

After the Bishop spoke on his most recent pastoral letter, I addressed those in attendance. One of the things I mentioned is how so many Divine Realities are often hidden until we see them differently over time; how the wisdom of God's Providence is hidden until we see how things work out over time. The divinity of Christ was hidden until the event of the Transfiguration. The meaning of the "resurrection from the dead" was hidden until St. John exclaimed, "It is the Lord" (John 21:7). And the mystery of the Holy Eucharist, His true, real, substantial presence is hidden in the appearance of bread and wine until we witness Eucharistic miracles! The popularity of the Eucharistic Miracles exhibit is intriguing to me. The exhibit, which we had onsite the evening of February 27, was the brainchild of Blessed Carlo Acutis, an English-born Italian who died in 2006 at the age of 15 after battling leukemia. During his life, Carlo created a website documenting Eucharistic Miracles, a project that took him two and a half years to complete. Carlo's information has since been curated into a traveling exhibit made of 166 display panels. For the Eucharistic Congress hosted by the Bismarck Diocese (June 2023), 60 panels were chosen and are available to parishes to display. We will display the exhibit a total of three times and each time different miracles will be included. The exhibit will again be available at two upcoming events for the Eucharistic Revival. On April 09, Corpus Christi will host Dr. Lawrence "Larry" Feingold. Dr. Feingold teaches at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary and comes recommended by Fr. Obrigewitch. Dr. Feingold will be in Bismarck for the Spring Clergy Conference and has graciously agreed to offer an evening for the lay faithful of the Diocese, presenting on the Eucharist. Larry and his wife are both converts to Catholicism from Judaism, and I am looking forward to his presentations at both the Clergy Conference and here at Corpus Christi. Then, on April 18, we will have our fourth and final Encounter Night. Hope to see you at both of these events!

As we continue through the Parish Phase of the USCCB's 3-year Eucharistic Revival, let's remember that receiving the Holy Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, is the first and greatest act of faith!

Anointing of the Sick

\ə-'noint-tiŋ 'əv 'thə 'sik\

A sacrament for the recovery and salvation of a critically ill or injured person formerly called Extreme Unction ("last **anointing**"). No longer reserved for those near death, one may be **anointed** before surgery, in extreme age or illness, after losing consciousness, or when no longer coherent.

WHY IT MATTERS

The mercy of God extends to the body as well as soul of each person. Jesus ministered to the sick and suffering both physically and spiritually. The church continues this ministry in its care for the whole person.

From Rites of the Catholic Church as revised by Decree of the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council: The Church obeys Jesus' command to care for the sick by visiting those in poor health but also by raising them up through the sacrament of Anointing and by nourishing them with the Eucharist during their illness. The church offers prayers for the sick to commend them to God, especially in the last crisis of life.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What is the Anointing of the Sick?

One of the seven sacraments of the church, **Anointing of the Sick** recalls the healing presence and power of Jesus when we touch our mortality most vulnerably. From ancient times oil was valued for its healing and beautifying properties and in preparing bodies for burial.

The ordinary minister of the sacrament is the priest. However, it's presumed that others share the event: family, friends, caregivers. Elements of the ritual include prayers, scripture, laying hands on the recipient, and **anointing** of the head and hands. A water sprinkling rite may be included, and affected areas of the sick person's body may also be **anointed**. When in danger of death, additional sacraments of Reconciliation and Communion (*viaticum*, or "on the way with you") are also administered.

MEMORIAL OF SAINT JOHN OF GOD, RELIGIOUS (MARCH 8)

Power players in prayer

When it comes to your health, you can always turn to the saints for help. Feeling sick? Ask Saint John of God, patron of the sick and hospitals, to intercede on your behalf. Suffering from arthritis? Invoke Saint Alphonsus Ligouri. Have a headache? Entreat Saint Teresa of Ávila. Catholics also have the sacrament of **Anointing of the Sick**, to bring further healing.
