PASTOR'S COMMENTS

The Blood of Christ

At communion time, many Catholics do not partake of the Blood of Christ. Some churches do not offer it. In those that do, some people abstain. Some worry about the sanitation of drinking from a common cup. Others probably find the idea of "drinking blood" a bit repulsive. Perhaps it is. But so is the idea of "eating flesh." Our communion in Christ is a bold gesture of faith and commitment.

Drinking the Blood of Christ is an important expression of our faith. Jesus asked his followers at the Last Supper to eat his Body and drink his Blood. He didn't recommend just one or the other.

The Letter to the Hebrews expresses the significance of the Blood of Christ. In the past, the high priest entered the Holy of Holies, the heart of the temple, with the blood of goats and calves. The sprinkling of this blood forgave the sins of those who were defiled.

When Christ ascended into heaven, he entered the holiest of holy places. He brought with him his own blood—for our sakes. "How much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God." Drinking the Blood of Christ forgives our sins, frees us from "dead works", and makes us more worthy to worship. It is an act of faith, thanksgiving, and forgiveness.


Please get your registrations in early,it helps us know how many teachers we will need for the up coming year. God Bless.

SOME THOUGHTS ON HOLY COMMUNION 2018

Our Catholic Faith rejoices in the belief that Christ is truly present in the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

From the beginning Christians have understood the words of Jesus:" this IS my Body given up for you" to simply mean what Christ has said; I am giving myself to you.

We do not twist the words of Scripture to say this is ONLY a symbol of my body; or this is ONLY a reminder of my body.

In Holy Communion we believe that Jesus offers Himself TO us and FOR us; "fully, totally & completely " as our Food and as our Forgiveness.

What a tremendous gift the Lord offers us each and every time we gather in His name to celebrate the Mass. Not only on Sundays, but at every weekday Liturgy, Christ is HERE for us as our Strength and our Savior.

A few additional comments on how to prepare for Communion.

It is the practice of the church to refrain from food one hour prior to Communion. This means no gum or candy, unless used to suppress a coughing spell.

Since we are coming to meet Christ Himself, proper and respectful attire is simply common sense. Distracting or scanty outfits never belong at Mass.

For those receiving Communion in the hand, please raise your hands high enough so the minister knows this is your wish. Also, prayer beads, tissues or keys should be removed.

If you receive Communion on the tongue, please tilt your head back and extend your tongue so that the Blessed Sacrament may be easily offered to you.

When approaching the Altar do not bunch up at the priest's line. Be aware that there are several other ministers of Communion present.

Before receiving the Eucharist a respectful bow of the head or a sign of the cross should be made.
