First Holy Communion 2020

Once we begin to receive information in regard to being able to resume our gatherings inside the church for communal worship and prayer, we will reach out to parents and begin looking at the parish calendar.

Confirmation 2020

In regard to the Celebration of Confirmation for the young people of our parish, as previously scheduled for May 3, 2020 at the Cathedral of Saints Peter & Paul in Providence, no specific information related to postponement has yet been made available. However, now that social distancing guidelines and closures of certain businesses here in Rhode Island have been extended through May 8th, we believe it is safe to conclude that Confirmation as previously scheduled for May 3rd will be postponed. As soon as more information in regard to possible future dates is provided by the Office of the Bishop, be assured that it will be shared with parents, candidates and sponsors.

Tuition Assistance

In accordance with Diocesan Policies, **Tuition Assistance is only for students in grades K-8.** With particular permission and authorization from the Bishop, tuition assistance may be available for students who attend one of the Catholic High Schools here in the diocese. ***The premise of the Catholic School Tuition Assistance Program is that financial assistance is based on need.*** Families requesting assistance must fulfill the following requirements:

- ***Must** be registered in the parish (at least one full year.)
- ***Must** attend Mass on a weekly basis.
- ***Must** use the budget envelope system.
- ***Must** show family involvement in parish programs/ministry.
- ***Must** submit the FACTS form through the school's Financial Aid Office

Please fill out a separate form for each child in a household. If you need an application sent to you, please call the Rectory at 232-5600. **Applications should be completed and returned to the Rectory by June 1st.**
