During the season of Advent, we choose to add many activities to our family's schedule to prepare for our celebration of Christmas. John the Baptist reminds us that our repentance is another way in which we can prepare for the Lord's coming and our celebration of Christmas. You and your family, might seek out this sacrament on an individual basis.

Read together today's Gospel, Luke 3:1-6. Talk about how John the Baptist called upon the people to prepare the way of the Lord through repentance. \*Together as a family, prepare a simple reconciliation service in preparation for Christmas. Gather in a prayerful space, perhaps around the family Advent wreath. Read again from today's Gospel, Luke 3:1-6. Invite each family member to pray silently, asking God to forgive his or her sins. Pray together the Act of Contrition. Then celebrate God's forgiveness by sharing the sign of peace with one another.

\* Please be advised that such a service IS NOT sa substitute for the obligation that we all have to avail ourselves of the Sacrament of Reconciliaiton at least once per year. Such a service may serve as an opportunity to make a thorough examination of conscience in preparation for reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



Traditionally, Advent wreaths are constructed of a circle of evergreen branches into which four candles are inserted, representing the four weeks of

Advent. Ideally, three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and goods works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas. The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of his second coming to judge the living and the dead. - USCCB. Peace, Dina

#### **Grateful for God's Providence**



Our parish's goal was \$423,714.00. Per the latest update report, 229 families made one time gifts or pledges that totaled \$385,312.00. With one time gifts and the amount fulfilled on pledges, a combined total of \$250,243.00 has

been paid. Forty percent of that amount (\$100,097.00) comes back to the parish.

With a team consisting of Thomas Lonardo + Associates, Odeh Engineers and Garaventa Lift, plans are underway for the restroom wth handicap accessibility that will be installed on the main level of the church as well as for the lift system that will make the lower level of the church accessible.

#### The Year of St. Joseph Comes to a Close

On December 8, 1870, Blessed Pope Pius IX proclaimed St. Joseph as the patron of the Universal Church. To commemorate this anniversary, Pope Francis declared a Year of St. Joseph, running from December 8, 2020 to December 8,



2021. The Holy Father encouraged Catholics all over the world to spend the year learning more about St. Joseph and growing in devotion to him

There was quite a media reaction when the year was announced and when it kicked off, but it has sort of

fallen off the radar for many of us. Lest the Year of St. Joseph fizzle out or fade away, here are some wonderful resources about the head of the Holy Family...

First, there are the documents about St. Joseph produced by popes over the last 100 or more years. There is *Quemadmodum Deus*, the decree of Bl. Pius IX that declared St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church. Then there is *Quamquam Pluries*, the encyclical letter of Pope Leo XIII on devotion to St. Joseph. Pope Benedict XV also wrote a letter, a *motu proprio*, on devotion to St. Joseph, titled *Bonum sane*. St. John Paul II wrote an Apostolic Exhortation on the Person and Mission of St. Joseph in the Life of Christ and of the Church, a masterwork of devotion to Our Lord's foster father, called *Redemptoris Custos*, as well as an Apostolic Letter on the 150th anniversary of Pius IX's declaration of Joseph as Universal Patron, titled *Patris Corde*. 
#### **Baptisms Celebrated in November 2021**



# <u>December 8<sup>th</sup> -The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary</u> What is the Immaculate Conception?



The Immaculate Conception is a Catholic dogma that states that Mary, whose conception was brought about the normal way, was conceived without original sin or its stain. That's what "immaculate" means: without stain.

It's important to understand what the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception is and what it is not. Some people think the term refers to Christ's conception in Mary's womb without the intervention of a human father; but that is the Virgin Birth. Others think the Immaculate Conception means Mary was conceived "by the power of the Holy Spirit," in the way Jesus was, but that, too, is incorrect.

The essence of original sin consists in the deprivation of sanctifying grace, and its stain is a corrupt nature. Mary was preserved from these defects by God's grace; from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings.

When discussing the Immaculate Conception, an implicit reference may be found in the angel's greeting to Mary. The angel Gabriel said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you" (Luke 1:28). The phrase "full of grace" is a translation of the Greek word *kecharitomene*. It therefore expresses a characteristic quality of Mary. The grace given to Mary is at once permanent and of a unique kind. *Kecharitomene* is a perfect passive participle of *charitoo*, meaning "to fill or endow with grace." Since this term is in the perfect tense, it indicates that Mary was graced in the past but with continuing effects in the present. So, the grace Mary enjoyed was not a result of the angel's visit. In fact, Catholics hold, it extended over the whole of her life, from conception onward.
