Do as I say, not as I do." How many of us have been tempted to say this to our children? In today's Gospel we hear a resounding reply from Jesus, "Practice what you preach." Those who know us best, our family and

especially our children, can identify the inconsistencies between what we want to teach and the example that we give. The challenge for all of us, especially for those of us who are parents, is to model with consistency the faith and the Christian way of life we wish to teach our children. As you gather as a family, talk about what it means to practice what you preach. Identify some examples of people you know who practice what they preach. What do you observe about these

people? What do you admire about them?

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus talk about the importance of acting in ways that are consistent with our faith. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 23:1-12. Talk together about ways in which your family might better practice the faith that you profess. Choose one action to take that will show your faith in action. Pray together that your family's faith will be shown consistently in your actions. Pray the Prayer for Vocations.

God, in Baptism you called me by name and made me a member of your people, the Church. Help all your people to know their vocation in life, and to respond by living a life of holiness. For your greater glory and for the service of your people,

raise up dedicated and generous leaders who will serve as sisters, priests, brothers, deacons, and lay ministers.

Send your Spirit to guide and strengthen me that I may serve your people following the example of your Son, Jesus Christ, in whose name I offer this prayer.

## <u>Grief Support – Beacon Hospice</u>



Grief is a normal response to loss during or after a disaster or other traumatic event.
Grief can happen in response to loss of life,

as well as to drastic changes to daily routines and way of life that usually brings us comfort and a feeling of stability.

Common grief reactions include: shock, disbelief or denial, anxiety, distress, anger, periods of sadness, loss of sleep and loss of appetite.

Some people may experience multiple losses during a disaster or large-scale emergency event. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, you might not have been with a loved one when they died, or unable to mourn someone's death in person with friends and family. Other types of Loss include unemployment, or not making enough money, loss or reduction in support services, and other changes in your lifestyle. These losses can happen at the same time, which can complicate or prolong grief and delay a person's ability to adapt, heal, and recover. People cope with losses in different ways. If you need help dealing with your loss, join us for our grief recovery support group


first 5 rows on the left side of the church, facing the altar. The ceremony's theme will be an important message from the movie SAVING PRIVATE RYAN released 25 years ago.
