Every family has special moments that they remember and share again and again. In

sharing these stories, the meaning and importance of these events develop and deepen over time. This is how it was with the disciples' remembrance of Jesus' Transfiguration. The full significance of what they had seen and experienced could only be understood after Jesus' death and Resurrection. As they told other believers about this event and recorded the story for us in the Bible, our understanding of what it means to call Jesus God's own Son has also deepened.

As you gather as a family, think about some special family memories that your family tells over and over again. Talk about why these memories are important to you. Recall that in the Bible we find many important memories about Jesus that have been recorded for us so that we can believe that Jesus is God's Son. Read today's Gospel, Mark 9:2-10. What do we learn about Jesus from this Gospel? (He fulfills the promises God made to Israel through the Law and the prophets. God glorified Jesus in his Resurrection. Jesus is God's Son.) Conclude in prayer together that as we continue to read the Bible, we will deepen our understanding of and our love for Jesus. Pray together the Lord's Prayer. Peace, Dina

### Lenten Fast and Abstinence Regulations

Abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent (for those 14 and older) is required by Church law. Also, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting: those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious health conditions excuse a person from these precepts.

Pastors and parents are encouraged by the law of the Church to ensure that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated nonetheless in an authentic sense of penance.



## Lecture Series With Fr. John Vidmar, OP

The Early Church

Fr. John Vidmar from Providence College is currently offering a Lenten Lecture Series that began

last Monday, February 19. The series will continue on Monday, February 26 and conclude on Monday, March 4. Each session will be held in the church and begin at 7:00 PM. This three-part series is focused on the development of Early Christianity from its roots in the world of Judaism to the Gospels and Jesus Christ, then examine how this Church grew and suffered, and grew some more.

Week One: The three sources of the Christian Church, Jesus, Paul, early Church organization.

Week Two: Persecutions from the Romans to rival religions (Gnosticism, mystery religions). Exploration of the catacombs.

Week Three: Growth of monasticism, liturgy, doctrine, art.

While not required, participants might benefit from purchasing and using Fr. Vidmar's book titled *The* Catholic Church through the Ages (2d edition) from Paulist Press as a supplementary resource.

Registration is not required.
