EVANGELIZATION

The two greatest commandments, love of God and love of neighbor (Matt 22:36-40), both impel us to evangelize. Evangelization is a requirement of love.

1. We evangelize for the glory of God

First, and most importantly, we must evangelize out of a sincere love for God and a desire to be obedient to his will, "who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim 2:4). When Jesus was about to ascend into heaven, he entrusted to his disciples this mission:

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and Io, I am with you always, to the close of the age. - Matthew 28:19-20

As modern day disciples of Jesus Christ, these words are also addressed to us. When we evangelize, we glorify God by humbly and faithfully fulfilling his command.

2. We evangelize to save the souls of others

Second, love for our neighbors also impels us to evangelize. Authentic love is not just a passion or emotion. "Love is to will the good of another." If we truly love others, we desire their good, and especially their ultimate good, which is eternal life with God in heaven. And this ultimate good of eternal life and supernatural happiness can only be obtained by faith in Jesus Christ...

PRAYING ABOUT "THE MISSION FIELD"

Before the next meeting with your staff or team, personally commit to 30 - 60 minutes in prayer around these three questions:

- Who is disengaged or on the margins of our parish communities?
- What is currently happening in our parish that has great evangelizing potential?
- How do we invite back to Mass those we haven't seen since early 2020?

Ask God to answer these questions. Most likely he won't do so audibly, but pay attention to anything that he might place on your heart or in your mind.

When you get together again share with each other what you think you may have heard in prayer. Have someone on the team take thorough notes during this time of sharing.
