


SAINTS FOR OUR TIME: FRASSATI AND ACUTIS INSPIRE A NEW GENERATION IN THE DIOCESE OF MADISON

The Catholic Church canonized Saints Pier Giorgio Frassati and Carlo Acutis on September 7, 2025. These two models of holiness inspire hope in the hearts of young people across the Diocese of Madison. Their legacy lives on through local initiatives like Frassati Fest and the Saint Carlo Acutis Academy.







a weekend retreat offering high school teens opportunities to encounter Christ through the Sacraments and Eucharistic Adoration, engage in personal and communal prayer, and bond in faith with other teens from across the diocese. This year's event was held February 7-9, 2025 at the Kalahari Resort in Wisconsin Dells, with more than 325 teens and adult chaperones in attendance.



Saint Carlo Acutis Academy is an online school enabling any family in the diocese and beyond to receive a quality education in academics and faith. The school is in its fourth year and serves students in grades 5–12. One mother shared the many ways that Saint Carlo Acutis Academy has benefitted her children.

The flexibility of this academy has allowed my children to maintain an education level and focus during challenging times. The class offerings coupled with faith reminders provide a good balance. The administration involvement and immediate teacher responses outside scheduled class times makes this program feel like a community-focused, parent-involved education.

MARRIAGE RETREAT: OFFERING SUPPORT FOR LIFELONG LOVE

In February, 15 couples in their first six years of marriage gathered for the diocese's first-ever Rooted Marriage Retreat. Thanks to sponsorship from the ACA, these couples experienced a day of rest, renewal, and deep connection. Couples learned practical tools for communication and how to dream together, while also having time for prayer, mentoring, and a bit of fun, with dance lessons at the end of the retreat. A highlight was a testimony of how Natural Family Planning (NFP) has blessed one couple's marriage. The impact was clear in the feedback: Couples felt supported and spiritually nourished.

During the next three years, the diocese plans to offer resources and training to strengthen marriages and invest in families to support their growth in love, faith, and community. This will include forming "Building Eucharistic Marriage" teams at parishes, offering "This Old Spouse" retreats for couples 55 and older, and lay the groundwork to train marriage coaches to serve our parishes through "Adventures in Marriage".
