GOD of the LIVING

Thirty-Second SUNDAY
IN ORDINARY TIME

November 10, 2019

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus says that God is "not God of the dead, but of the living" (Luke 20:38). You might think that's a pretty obvious statement. But it has profound implications for how we live as Christians because this reality underlies something at the heart of Catholic teaching—the Communion of the Saints.

The saints, those who have died and gone before us in faith, remain connected to us through Jesus Christ. They aren't detached spirits floating about in some mystical realm but fellow members of Christ's body who remain deeply concerned about God's plan for salvation here on earth. They have been through the same struggles we have and they now stand before God's throne in heaven, cheering us on as we live out our lives and missions here on earth. They are alive in the body of Christ, just as we are.

Because they are alive in Christ, we can ask them to pray for us and intercede for us. This is our basic understanding of the Communion of Saints—through Jesus, we are all "in communion" with each other. We can ask the saints, as our brothers and sisters in heaven, to lift us up to our God and intercede on our behalf. The readings for today reaffirm that belief by reminding us that God is indeed the God of the living—those of us still on earth as well as those who now live directly in the Divine Presence.

1st Reading Reflection

~ 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14 ~

There's certainly not a hint of complacency in 2 Maccabees. The oft-noted influence of persecution may account for some of the fierce resistance to idolatry that this Jewish woman and her seven sons show to the decrees of Antiochus IV Epiphanes, the Hellenic king. During his reign, the Temple in Jerusalem was turned into a temple to Zeus and pigs were sacrificed on its altars. Ritual prostitution was also conducted in the courts of the Temple of God. The insult to Jewish sensibilities was far more than what would be ordinary to a foreign occupation. Antiochus had profaned the holiest spot in the world!

In the several centuries before the coming of Christ, idolatry, polygamy, and other violations of God's plan for Israel had become very rare in what seems to have been a real growth in the collective spiritual maturity of the Jewish people. That could've been a response to the loss of national sovereignty, but many centuries of meditating on God's Word and deeds may have matured God's people to the point that some were willing to die for the one who would eventually come and die for them.

2nd Reading Reflection

~ 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5 ~

St. Paul speaks of an “everlasting encouragement and good hope” granted to the Thessalonians by God; confident that these will “strengthen them in every good deed and word.” And indeed, the infant Church will, before very long, be tested in many places in just the same way as the Jews were in the time of the Maccabees.

In every age there are “perverse and wicked people” who oppose God’s work and the people who do it. To carry on that work, constancy in faith and confident hope are essential. Without the belief that God will strengthen and guard us “from the evil one,” it would be impossible to persevere in the Christian apostolate. St. Paul’s short exhortation here can be just the thing to revive us; even when it’s only the little pressures of our daily walk in faith that oppress us.

Gospel Reflection

~ Luke 20:27-38 ~

The Sadducees were a party of uncertain origin. Although they had clear religious affiliations, they might best be described as cultural Jews. They were disinterested in devotional Judaism but wanted to maintain their social status as leaders in the Jewish community. They were extreme religious conservatives in the sense that they denied the canonical character of everything in the Hebrew Scriptures except the first five books called the Torah or Pentateuch.

Although Jesus’ teaching would’ve been far from the materialist doctrine of the Sadducees, he meets their criteria

for valid argument by only referring to the Mosaic text in proving the immortality of the soul. Jesus overcomes what the Sadducees would’ve thought of as an unanswerable objection to the belief in the afterlife. The fallacy in the Sadducees’ position is that life after death must be entirely different from life here. One of the aims of marriage is the propagation of the species. But, if there’s no more death, there would be no further need for propagation either. Extinction is no longer a possibility in an eternal life and so the marital relationship would be drastically altered.

With friends or family, reflect on the following questions:


- The Church is not just those of us who are living now here on earth, but all those believers who have gone before us and are now in heaven, the Communion of Saints. These saints, both those with a capital “S” who are officially recognized by the Church and those with a small “s” like when we sing “When the saints go marching in,” are part of this greater Communion of Saints. **How does the idea that there are “fellow pilgrims” in heaven interceding with the Father on your behalf make living a holy life easier? How can the realization that the Father listens to the pleas of the saints enable you to have greater trust that you do not have to “do it alone,” but have a whole group of**


“cheerleaders” to assist?

- In his reflection, Edward Sri explains that praying to the saints is simply asking them to pray for us. Just as I might ask you to pray for me, we can do the same thing with the saints in heaven. **What experience have you had with asking the saints for their help? If the idea of asking the saints to pray for you is new to you, what experiences have you had with asking other people to pray for you? How do you think this might compare with asking the saints for help?**
- The presenter said that when Catholics pray to the saints, we aren’t talking to dead people because the saints are alive in Jesus Christ and that they are “rooting for us on the playing field of our lives.” **How can knowing that the saints are deeply concerned with our salvation help strengthen your faith? How can you develop a deeper relationship with the saints?**

Prayer: Prayerfully consider Jesus’ words from today’s Gospel reading about how God is the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, even though they had been dead for many centuries. God is still their God because “he is not God of the dead, but of the living.” Now imagine meeting in heaven the many saints who are alive in God, sharing in eternal life. Maybe it’s Old Testament figures such as Abraham or Moses. Or perhaps picture meeting Christian saints such as St. Peter or the Blessed Virgin Mary or recent saints such as Blessed Teresa of Calcutta or Pope St. John Paul II. Considering the reality of this eternal life in God which the saints share, what can you do now to begin to live more for eternity and not just life on earth?

Suy Niệm

Niềm tin của người Kitô hữu phải là kinh chế cuộc sống này, không phải là để thả mồi bắt bóng nhưng là qui chiếu đời sống này vào Thiên Chúa. Thiên Chúa là Thiên Chúa của kẻ sống. 

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En noviembre, con la víspera de Todos los Santos al principio de mes, nuestros pensamientos y oraciones se dirigen hacia aquellos santos y almas que ya se han ido antes que nosotros. ¿A dónde se fueron? La verdad es que no lo sabemos. La Escritura hace muchas afirmaciones acerca de la vida después de la muerte, pero todas las nociones de la vida eterna requieren fe y esperanza. En el Evangelio de Lucas de hoy, Jesús habla con palabras de consuelo acerca de la vida después de la muerte, las personas justas haciéndose hijos de Dios, como ángeles.

Los héroes-mártires de la lectura de nuestro Antiguo Testamento acerca de los macabeos ofrece ejemplos iniciales de fe en la resurrección de la muerte.

Ellos se mantuvieron firmes en su fe, deseando morir en lugar de ir en contra de la ley de Dios. Su historia terriblemente brutal de esperanza podría parecer imprudente para algunos, pero todos estamos conscientes de ejemplos actuales de hombres y mujeres que han sufrido en lugar de traicionar sus creencias.

SOLO PODEMOS IMAGINAR

En la época de Jesús, la creencia de la resurrección de la muerte todavía no había alcanzado una aceptación universal. De hecho, los saduceos del Evangelio de hoy fueron firmes negadores de la resurrección e intentaron ponerle trampas a Jesús. Cambiándoles la perspectiva, Jesús afirma que Moisés en el pasado creía que el

Dios de nuestros ancestros en la fe es verdaderamente el Dios de los vivos, y que todos estamos vivos para Dios, ya sea que todavía vivamos o se esté muerto. La muerte solo es una etapa, una puerta u otra dimensión. Realmente no lo sabemos. Jesús nos asegura que esas son preocupaciones innecesarias para los fieles, así como los detalles de la vida del mundo no serán importantes. No solamente nuestros cuerpos mortales van a cambiar, sino todo aquellos que conocimos de la existencia mortal, todo el matrimonio, toda la familia, todas nuestras relaciones, serán transformadas en formas que difícilmente podemos imaginar. Todo lo que tenemos será otra vez de nosotros. Así que debemos dejar de preocuparnos y vivir para ser dignos de aquello que venga después, ya que cuando estemos incorporados en la fiesta de amor eterno de la existencia gloriosa con Dios, nuestro gozo será pleno.
