FIFTH SUNDAY
in Ordinary Time

Our readings today summon the Church to embrace its calling, to join in God's healing of the world. As we hear of Job's anguish, in which all hope and purpose have disappeared, we are reminded of the depth of suffering in the world around us, and perhaps also within our own hearts. We hear of Jesus bringing healing and hope to Simon's mother-in-law and to the community around Capernaum. And we hear of Paul's commitment to "become all things to all", that is, to walk alongside all kinds of people, offering good news of the love of God. We need to be a people who do not hide from broken hearts, including our own. We are to share in the suffering of our world, but also to live as those who can tell the world of a God who brings hope. At our best, we the Church embody God's great desire to heal the brokenhearted.

A TIME TO LAMENT

The poignant description of human suffering in our reading from the book of Job echoes the cries we have heard throughout the world with the coming of the coronavirus. We grieve many losses: of life and health, of jobs and security, of freedom to be with those we love. We are reminded that many of the psalms are prayers lamenting that the world is often not what it ought to be. In these coronavirus times, we the Church are first called to prayerfully lament: to weep with those who are weeping and to ache for a better world. Our prayer can remind us that, as Paul de-

scribed in Romans 8, all creation is groaning, and the Holy Spirit is groaning in wordless, shared suffering.

We also live in God's promise to transform our tears into joy. God is eager to bring healing to the world, and we are God's instruments in doing so. We bring God's gifts of creativity, resourcefulness, and perseverance to the task. Our prayerful lamentation reminds us of the urgency of God's work through us.

FREED TO SERVE

The first chapter of Mark's Gospel is very fast-paced, as Jesus begins his ministry on the move. The first scene in today's passage happens so quickly that it's easy to miss: Jesus heals Simon's mother-in-law, and she promptly begins to serve Jesus and the disciples. This woman is never named, and only noted by her relationship with Simon. But she is the first person in Mark, once healed by Jesus, to clearly respond as a disciple. Her healing frees her to serve Jesus and others, and sparks the healing of many others.

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus' healings restore health, dignity, and a place in the community. They are also a summons to service. Mark's brief story highlights that God is always raising up persons and communities, healed of illness or sin or sadness, to join in God's healing work for others.

Ash Wednesday:

Plans are underway for Ash Wednesday, the beginning of our Lenten Season. We are preparing individual, sealable baggies that will contain blessed ashes. Attached to this baggie will be instructions regarding how to properly anoint yourself and others, how to dispose of them, and some catechetical information on what Ash Wednesday signifies in the Catholic Church. For those who attend Mass on the weekend of Feb. 13th-14th, one baggie will be handed out as you leave the parking lot following the conclusion of Mass. On Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17th, we will offer the pre-bagged ashes on a drive-thru basis. Volunteers will be in our parking lot from **11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m.** Please enter the parking lot from the East side—from Peck Road. You will be directed to one of two lines to pick up your ashes. There will be a pre-recorded Mass available for your viewing at your convenience that day. You are encouraged to view Mass prior to your anointing. Please call the Parish Office if you have any questions.

Current Confession Times:

Confessions are held on Saturdays from 3:30—4:30 p.m. These times will be in effect until further notice.

Outdoor Masses:

† The Vigil Mass will be celebrated at 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, the Vietnamese Mass will be celebrated at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, and the Spanish Mass will be celebrated at 12:00 p.m. on Sunday. The 8:00 a.m. English Mass is the same.

† If you wish to bring your own chair(s) and sit outside your car during Mass, you are welcome to do so. To ensure everyone's safety, chairs must be placed in front of your car only, in order to maintain appropriate social distancing from the cars around you. Personal-sized only umbrellas are allowed so as to not block the view of attendees who might be seated behind you.

† Masks are required when you enter the parking lot, if you remain in your car with any of the windows rolled down, or if you choose to sit outside your car during Mass. They are optional if you choose to remain in your car with the windows rolled up. We are trying to maximize the parking spaces for those attending Mass and ask that all support volunteers (ushers, Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, music ministers, etc.) park inside the gate area just outside the Parish Hall.

Daily Mass streams at 11:00 a.m., Sunday Mass in English at 11:00 a.m., and Spanish Mass at 2:00 p.m.. You can access these Masses on our website (www.annunciationchurch.net), Facebook (Annunciation Catholic Church), or YouTube (Annunciation Catholic Church Arcadia).

Đức Giê-su chữa nhiều kẻ ốm đau mắc đủ thứ bệnh tật.

Suy Niệm

Từ câu chuyện của ông Gióp, chúng ta rút ra được một bài học đức tin, đó là trong những giờ phút khổ đau, chúng ta đừng vội kêu trách Thiên Chúa, bởi vì Ngài là nguồn sự sống, không bao giờ muốn cho con người phải khổ, phải đau. Rất nhiều khi khổ đau là do con người gây ra cho nhau, vì thiếu yêu thương, thiếu cảm thông, thiếu giúp đỡ. Cùng với ông Gióp, là người tín hữu, chúng ta phải có thái độ đúng đắn đối với Thiên Chúa trong những giờ phút đen tối, cũng như phải sống Tin Mừng thế nào trong mối liên hệ với những người đau khổ. Đau khổ là một cái gì gắn liền với thân phận con người, nhưng đồng thời lại là cơ hội để con người đến với nhau một cách đặc biệt hơn, bằng sự cảm thông, an ủi và giúp đỡ, bởi vì chúng ta tin rằng Chúa yêu thương mọi người, cho nên không thể nghĩ rằng đau khổ và bệnh tật là hình phạt của tội lỗi. Qua đoạn Tin Mừng vừa nghe, chúng ta thấy cuộc đời của Chúa Giêsu là một sự dung hoà tốt đẹp giữa đạo và đời. Thực vậy Ngài không phải chỉ hăng say rao giảng Phúc Âm, cứu rỗi phần hồn của chúng ta mà hơn thế nữa, bằng những hành động bác ái yêu thương, Ngài còn xoa dịu những nỗi đớn đau và thống khổ của chúng ta. Ngài đã đẩy lui cơn sốt cho bà mẹ vợ của Phêrô, Ngài đã chữa lành mọi bệnh hoạn tật nguyền và dân chúng tuôn đến với Ngài thật đông đảo. Phải chăng đây cũng là điều chúng ta cần noi gương bắt chước và thực hiện trong cuộc sống của chúng ta, để nhờ đó bản thân chúng ta trở nên những chứng nhân sống động của Chúa và mọi người cũng nhờ đó mà nhận biết tình thương của Ngài. Qua các việc chữa lành này Người chỉ muốn cho mọi người được biết: Thiên Chúa từ nhân đã đến với họ, đang thật sự ở giữa họ, đang đồng hành với họ, cảm thông nỗi thống khổ yếu đuối của họ, và tích cực can thiệp theo cách thức của riêng Người. Chúa Giêsu không sống vì mình hoặc sống cho mình, nhưng luôn luôn sống vì Chúa Cha và vì nhân loại. Vâng, nếu cuộc đời hôm nay có nhiều tâm lòng vị tha như Chúa, thì dòng đời sẽ không còn những cái khổ triền miên như ông Gióp. Nếu cuộc đời ai cũng biết có trách nhiệm với nhau, sẽ không còn những nỗi đau của cô đơn và tuyệt vọng như ông Gióp. Như chúng ta nhận thấy trong Tin Mừng hôm nay, ngay cả Đức Giêsu cũng cần dành thì giờ cho bản thân mình. Đức Giêsu cầu nguyện không chỉ vì bản thân, mà còn vì nhu cầu nữa: **phải biết mức lấy nguồn sức mạnh ở nơi Chúa Cha qua việc cầu nguyện.** Sáng sớm, Chúa Giêsu đến nơi vắng vẻ cầu nguyện. Suốt ngày bận rộn với con người, Chúa Giêsu phải dành buổi sáng sớm để cầu nguyện. Điều đó cho thấy, đối với Chúa, việc cầu nguyện là quan trọng biết bao. Chúa Giêsu cầu nguyện vì yêu mến, khao khát được kết hiệp với Chúa Cha. Chúa Giêsu cầu nguyện để tìm thánh ý Chúa Cha, tìm sự hướng dẫn sáng suốt cho cuộc đời. Vì thế trước khi bắt tay vào làm việc, chúng ta cầu nguyện với Đức Chúa Cha để mức lấy nguồn sức mạnh cho hoạt động truyền giáo. Theo bạn, cầu nguyện có được lợi ích gì không? Xin bạn chia sẻ kinh nghiệm gặp gỡ Thiên Chúa hoặc những lợi ích bạn được qua việc cầu nguyện. Có điểm nào cuộc sống của bạn giống cuộc sống của Đức Giêsu? Đức Giêsu và bạn, giống nhau và khác nhau ở những điểm nào?

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La conmovedora descripción del sufrimiento humano de la lectura del libro de Job hace eco de los gritos que tenemos escuchando del mundo desde la llegada del coronavirus. Lamentamos muchas pérdidas: de vida y salud, de trabajo y seguridad, de libertad de estar con las personas que amamos. Se nos recuerda que muchos de los salmos son oraciones que lamentan que el mundo con frecuencia no es lo que debería de ser. En estos tiempos del coronavirus, nosotros, la Iglesia, primero estamos llamados devotamente a lamentarnos, a llorar con los que lloran y a dolernos por un mundo mejor. Nuestra oración puede recordarnos que, como Pablo describe en Romanos 8, toda la creación está gimiendo y el Espíritu Santo está gimiendo un sufrimiento compartido sin palabras. También vivimos en la promesa de Dios de transformar nuestras lágrimas en alegría. Dios está dispuesto a traer la sanación al mundo, y nosotros somos los instrumentos de Dios para hacerlo. Para esta tarea traemos de Dios los dones de la creatividad, la iniciativa y la perseverancia. Que nuestro lamento nos recuerde la urgencia del trabajo de Dios a través de nosotros.

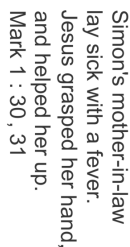
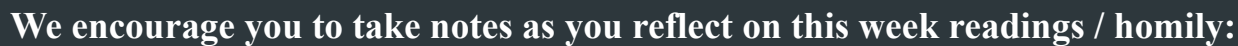
rápido, así como Jesús inicia su ministerio avanzando. La primera escena del pasaje de hoy sucede tan rápido que es fácil perderse: Jesús cura a la suegra de Simón y tan pronto ella está sana empieza a servirles a Jesús y a sus discípulos. El Evangelio no menciona el nombre de ella sino solamente que era la suegra de Simón. Pero ella es la primera persona, una mujer, en el Evangelio de Marcos, que una vez curada por Jesús, responde explícitamente como discípula. Al estar curada está liberada para servir a Jesús y a los demás, provocando una curación en muchos otros.

A lo largo de los evangelios, las curaciones de Jesús restauran la salud, la dignidad y un lugar en la comunidad. También son una llamada al servicio. La breve historia de Marcos destaca que Dios siempre está levantado a las personas y a las comunidades, sanadas de enfermedades, del pecado o de la tristeza, para que se unan al trabajo de sanación de Dios para los demás.

LIBERTAD DE SERVIR

El primer capítulo del Evangelio de Marcos avanza



Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus traveled "throughout the whole of Galilee" and "cured many who were sick with various diseases" (Mark 1:29-35). The Church continues this work of Jesus in the sacrament of the anointing of the sick. People may want to receive this sacrament for many different reasons. They might have a serious illness, or they might be preparing for surgery. Those who are very old or weakened by some physical condition, even if they are not seriously ill, may seek the blessings of the sacrament to renew their strength.

In administering the sacrament of the anointing of the sick, the priest lays hands on the person and prays silently. Then he anoints the person with the oil of the sick, one of the holy oils blessed by the bishop during Holy Week. The one being anointed is reminded that his or her suffering is united with the suffering of Jesus. The prayer asks God to grant the sick person peace and courage in the face of illness. Sometimes those who are ill recover. Some do not. But the sacrament promises that no matter what, God is with them to bring them comfort.

You can also bring comfort to those who are ill. First, you can pray for them, that they may be well and know God's loving presence. You can also assure them that you care for them by sending a note or a card with your prayers and good wishes. If you know someone who is sick or elderly and weak, think about sending them a card. You are part of the Church that continues Jesus' work of caring for those who are sick.
