The Virtues



PART II: THE HUMAN VIRTUES

The First Cardinal Virtue: PRUDENCE

PRUDENCE is the virtue that disposes practical reason to discern our true good in every circumstance, and to choose the right means of achieving it. Prudence is “right reason in action,” writes St. Thomas Aquinas, following Aristotle. It is not to be confused with timidity or fear, nor with duplicity or dissimulation. It is called *auriga virtutum* (the charioteer of the virtues); it guides the other virtues by setting rule and measure. It is prudence that immediately guides the judgment of conscience. The prudent man determines and directs his conduct in accordance with this judgment. With the help of this virtue we apply moral principles to particular cases without error and overcome doubts about the good to achieve and the evil to avoid.

In *The Four Cardinal Virtues*, Josef Pieper writes, “That is prudent which is in keeping with reality.” Moral principles and good intentions amount to little if pursued blindly. Action on behalf of the good requires accurate perception of concrete situations and circumstances.

Pieper identifies two causes of imprudence. One is thoughtlessness. Sometimes thoughtlessness arises from indifference or impatience, but it can also follow from a mentality that presumes to know in advance what to do. How many times have we seen someone say something true but unkind? It’s easy to imagine a justification that appeals to principle: “We have an obligation to speak the truth!” Prudence does not contradict this principle, but it knows when, and how, to say hard truths. The prudent man says the right thing in the best way, or holds his tongue.

Another cause of imprudence is irresoluteness. We often face situations that require us to act quickly. Irresoluteness can take the guise of moral rectitude. A seminar-room mentality of ongoing debate can be morally debilitating. We may be tempted to weigh the circumstances, get advice and consult experts so that we can reassure ourselves that our actions are irreproachable. We cover our indecision with the garb of moral seriousness: “It would be irresponsible to act without further inquiry and consultation.” Prudence operates differently. The prudent man knows he cannot enjoy the luxury of certainty. The virtue of prudence draws on powers of judgment, not on proofs.

Prudence is the first of the cardinal virtues because, without it, the others--justice, fortitude and temperance--lack proper direction. Don Quixote is comical, not brave, because he lacks an accurate grasp of reality. This fundamental role of prudence in the exercise of all the virtues explains why St. Augustine said that the virtues of the pagan Romans were but glorious vices. Christ reveals the actual shape of human reality. Without this knowledge, we can be cagey, perhaps even wise in a worldly sense. Yet without revelation, we cannot be truly prudent. In Christ we see clearly that the principalities and powers rule this world and must be opposed. But the prudent man can never act as though sin and death had the final word. Their loyalty to Christ and insouciance toward death accord with reality. As many preachers have observed, “He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain that which he cannot lose.”

Everyone loves the beauty and innocence of a baby. As an expression of that love, Our Lady of Lourdes parish announces an adoption program for young and old alike.

The members of Our Lady of Lourdes parish family will have the opportunity on the Feast of the Presentation (February 2) to “spiritually” adopt a child who is newly conceived this month. Not all newly conceived babies are allowed to be born. In fact, more than 4,000 babies lose their lives to abortion each day. It is these babies you are being asked to “adopt”.

St. Thomas Aquinas—January 28—

Priest & Doctor of the Church

The Angelic Doctor; the Great Synthesizer; the Dumb Ox

A great and quiet intellect, a teacher, and a Dominican friar. St. Thomas Aquinas is known for his written works, in which he synthesized Aristotelian philosophy with the principles of Christianity. He is also known for his Eucharistic hymns, which include *Pange lingua*, the last two verses of which comprise the *Tantum ergo*, which is sung or recited during the veneration and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

During his studies, St. Thomas Aquinas was nicknamed by his peers ‘the Dumb Ox’, both because of his size and the fact that he was slow in speech. Yet his teacher, St. Albert, noted of him, “We call this man a dumb ox, but his bellowing in doctrine will one day resound throughout the world.”

St. Thomas Aquinas is the patron of students, schools, learning, book sellers, scholars and theologians.

We must love them both, those whose opinions we share and those whose opinions we reject, for both have labored in the search for truth, and both have helped us in finding it.


St. John Bosco—January 31—Priest

Teacher of Youth

Son of Venerable Margaret Bosco. John’s father died when the boy was two years old; and as soon as he was old enough to do odd jobs, he did so to help support his family. He would go to circuses, fairs and carnivals, practice the tricks that he saw magicians perform, and then put on one-boy shows. After his performance, while he still had an audience of boys, he would repeat the homily he had heard earlier that day in church.

He worked as a tailor, baker, shoemaker and carpenter while attending college and seminary. As a teacher, he worked constantly with young people; he wrote short treatises aimed at explaining the faith to children, and then taught them how to print them. Friend of St. Joseph Cafasso, whose biography he wrote, and confessor to Blessed Joseph Allamano. He is the patron of apprentices, editors, youth, laborers and performers.
