Original Sin

Excerpts from the Catechism of the Catholic Church

The First Man, Adam, tempted by the devil, let his trust in his Creator die in his heart and, abusing his freedom, disobeyed God's command. This is what man's first (Original) sin consisted of.²⁷⁸ Subsequent sin would be disobedience toward God and lack of trust in his goodness. In that sin Man preferred himself to God and by that very act scorned Him. He chose himself over and against God, against the requirements of his creaturely status and therefore against his own good. Constituted in a state of holiness, man was destined to be fully "divinized" by God in glory. Seduced by the devil, he wanted to "be like God", but "without God, before God, and not in accordance with God".²⁷⁹ Scripture portrays the tragic consequences of this first disobedience. Adam and Eve immediately lose the grace of original holiness.²⁸⁰ become afraid of the God of whom they have conceived a distorted image - that of a God jealous of his prerogatives.²⁸¹

The harmony in which they had found themselves, thanks to original justice, is now destroyed: the control of the soul's spiritual faculties over the body is shattered; the union of man and woman becomes subject to tensions, their relations henceforth marked by lust and domination.²⁸² with creation is broken: visible creation has become alien and hostile to man.²⁸³ of man, creation is now subject "to its bondage to decay".²⁸⁴, the consequence explicitly foretold for this disobedience will come true: man will "return to the ground",²⁸⁵ out of it he was taken. Death makes its entrance into human history.²⁸⁶

How did the sin of Adam become the sin of all his descendants? The whole human race is in Adam "as one body of one man".²⁹³ this "unity of the human race" all men are implicated in Adam's sin, as all are implicated in Christ's justice. Still, the transmission of original sin is a mystery that we cannot fully understand. But we do know by Revelation that Adam had received original holiness and justice not for himself alone, but for all human

nature. By yielding to the tempter, Adam and Eve committed a personal sin, but this sin affected the human nature they would then transmit in a fallen state.²⁹⁴ is a sin which will be transmitted by propagation to all mankind, that is, by the transmission of a human nature deprived of original holiness and justice. **And that is why original sin is called "sin" only in an analogical sense: it is a sin "contracted" and not "committed" - a state and not an act.**

Although it is proper to each individual,²⁹⁵ Sin does not have the character of a personal fault in any of Adam's descendants. It is a deprivation of original holiness and justice, but human nature has not been totally corrupted: it is wounded in the natural powers proper to it, subject to ignorance, suffering under the dominion of death, and inclined to sin - an inclination to evil that is called "concupiscence". Baptism, by imparting the life of Christ's grace, erases Original Sin from the soul and turns that soul back towards God, but the consequences for his wounded nature, weakened and inclined to evil, persist in man and summon him to spiritual battle.

This spiritual battle is the duty of the life of the baptized Christian and may be fought victoriously because Christ, through His Life, Death and Resurrection bestows the powerful weapon of grace. This grace is obtained through the Sacraments which Christ Himself established in His Church, so that by living in grace, and maintaining a life in the state of grace, ultimately His children may live happily and, most importantly, attain their eternal happiness, which is eternal life with Him.

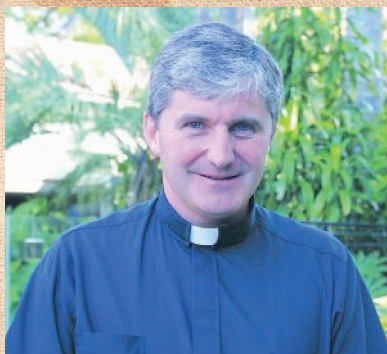

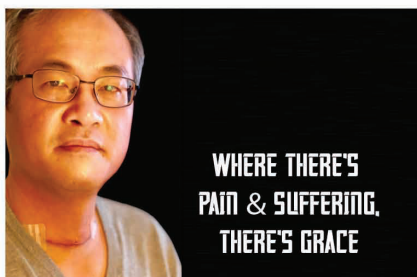

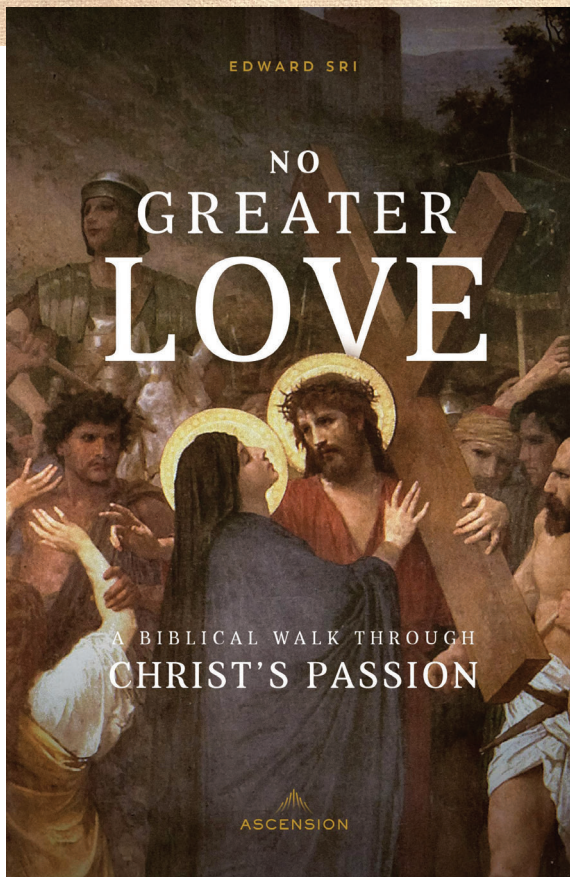
