


Monthly Food Bank Volunteering

Answers: 1.We declared independence because we were taxed without representation. 2. 56 people signed the Declaration of Independence. 3. The Declaration of Independence was signed in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. 4. The first seven words of the Declaration of Independence are "When in the course of human events." 5. The largest signature on the Declaration of Independence is John Hancock's. 6. The Liberty Bell is located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in the tower of Independence Hall. 7. The Liberty Bell no longer rings. It rang from 1778 to 1835, when it cracked. 8. The name: "Uncle Sam" originated in 1812, when a meat packer by the name of Sam Wilson provided meat to the U. S. Army. Someone saw the meat shipments that were stamped with U. S. and joked that the initials stood for "Uncle Sam," and the name stuck. 9. Francis Bellamy wrote the Pledge of Allegiance. 10. Betsy Ross sewed the first official American flag. 11. The stars were in a circle on the first flag to show that all the colonies were equal. 12. The Statue of Liberty is 151 feet tall. 13. France gave us the Statue of Liberty. 14. Americans consume 150 million hotdogs on July 4th each year. 15. This is the only three-part answer to the Fourth of July Trivia Questions. The Fourth of July became an unpaid holiday for federal workers in 1870. In 1938 it became a paid holiday, and in 1941, it was declared a federal holiday.
