Is there such a situation as talking too much? Should texting, social media, and other electronic means of communication be included in that question?

The answers to the questions have to be in the affirmative.

If the use of electronic devices that entertain individuals as they go about their lives is included, the situation becomes more problematic.

We live in a noisy world. If there were a list of activities essential to the life of the human spirit that are seriously lacking, similar to the list of endangered species, silence would be on that list.

Is silence some medieval construct that is no longer relevant in a modern, heavily technological world? Is not humanity essentially social? Is not the experience of silence cold and sterile?

Is it not rather that silence is a value?

There are a number of videos, ironically, on social media about the harmful effects of using social media.

Silence is a value. The ability to embrace silence is a sign of maturity. A person who cannot spend significant time in silence needs to ask why the inability.

As we reflect on the life of faith during the Easter Season, we should give thought to our experience of silence as individuals and as part of a family.

There should be a definite time during each day when we turn off all electronic devices. There is no reason for a television or a computer to be on all day long, much less throughout the night.

There should be definite places where electronic devices are never used. The dinner table comes to mind. The family meal is a time to relate personally, dynamically.

For us as a people of faith, silence is essential to our spiritual growth. There is no serious prayer without silence. The Mass has periods of silence because we need the silence to reflect upon what we are hearing and saying. Indeed it is only in silence that we can hear the Lord speaking in our hearts. It is only in silence that we can listen to our own hearts.

During Lent, the mother of a kindergarten child told me that he asked why the statues were covered. I was not surprised because he is a bright little fellow. More importantly, his parents sit in church with their children as a family every week and have been doing so for many years. Even more, they are obviously introducing their children to the Mass, including the moments of silence.

There may be a lesson there for all of us.
