SWEET SACRAMENT. WE THEE ADORE!

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, the Church honors Christ, truly present in Holy Eucharist. This is the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally called Corpus Christi.

Why do we have Eucharistic Processions?

Pope St. John Paul II once asked a group of American seminarians in Rome, "Why do Americans no longer have Eucharistic Processions?" When none of them offered an answer, he encouraged them to reintroduce the practice.

Joyous feast days like Corpus Christi were once deeply tied to Eucharistic Processions. In fact, the Church asks that, twice a year, every parish should have a procession with the Most Blessed Sacrament. This weekend, we will have processions at the 4pm and 10 am Masses inside of church. Christ the King once again will walk among us.

HAND-PAINTED ICON OF BLESSED SEELOS **DONATED TO PARISH**

This week, a hand-painted icon of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos was donated to the parish in honor of Gloria Hebert. The icon is now in the sanctuary, together with a first-class relic (part of the bone) of Father Seelos.



Father Seelos spent years in New Orleans ministering to the poorest of the poor. In 1867, a yellow fever epedemic struck, and he died caring for the sick.

Next week, the icon will be moved into its permanent home in

the back of church. A beautiful oak shrine has been donated to house the relic (in memory of Iris Berry Dearhamer). The shrine will be installed this week.

KEEPING YOU INFORMED: THE RECTORY PROJECT

This Thursday, June 19, I met with our architect and his team in Baton Rouge. The architect has completed preliminary drawings to submit to the diocese for approval.
