

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- -If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- -Be at least 16 years of age.
- -Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- -Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

FEDERAL DONOR RECORDKEEPING RULE ON CHARITABLE DEDUCTION

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 included a section relative to charitable deductions. The rules require that people claiming charitable deduction back up those deduction claims with cancelled checks; records from banks or credit card companies; or written notices from the charity or not-for-profit institution. The burden is on the donor to maintain or obtain the required records.

The parish will provide a record of contributions, upon request, which will satisfy the IRS requirements. Contributions of cash can only be used as a deduction if church envelopes are used enabling the parish to identify the donor. 

The Dorian Gray Project

- update - by Deacon Jim Casa Our 2019 "winter book/movie" project is Oscar Wilde's Picture of Dorian Gray and what a wonderful story to consider during the long, cold winter.

Dorian Gray is considered a classic novel and as such, it has a power to take into account. Let's consider this: When you read the classics, you're reading books that have had a pivotal role in shaping the way we read and write today. Books aren't written or read in a vacuum. They're woven by writers and consumed by readers with the influence of centuries of writing behind us. In Dorian Gray, you will find it to be a very modern story, even if it was published in the 19th Century. Its themes are forever in the "now." Classic novels are the milestones of our ongoing literary tradition. When you familiarize yourself with the classics, such as Dorian Gray, you start to understand where a lot of other books fit in. You'll begin to identify influences and references in your own reading that you weren't able to before, or didn't even notice.

Reading the classics can also help you appreciate your favorite books even more. When you return to them, you'll unpack depths that you didn't know were there.

Reading the classic novels makes us think about the 'bigger issues' of life and how we address these issues through a great story's plot, the characters and the themes. Dorian Gray will not disappoint the reader on these points.

Through these Bulletin updates, we will take a closer look on such matters and how they apply to this memorable story of mystery, culture, religion, romance and self-reflection. So, start reading The Picture of Dorian Gray and enter the world of Dorian and in it, you may find part of yourself. Our movie part of the project will ask you to save the date of Friday, April 12th at 7:30pm; then we will gather to see the classic, 1945 film version of Dorian Gray which stars George Sanders and the talented, young ensemble of Donna Reed, Angela Lansbury, Peter Lawford with Hurd Hatfield as Dorian. Good News Reflection

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time January 27, 2019

Pray: Beloved Lord, in the desert You prepare me for my mission. Give me the grace of discovering it and of listening to You in the silence of my intimacy with You. Amen.

Nehemiah 8:2-6, 8-10 Ps 19:8-10, 15 1 Corinthians 12:4-11 Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

The ministry of Christ today

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, we see Jesus announcing the reality of his ministry: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set the oppressed free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.... Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Did this ministry come to an end when he ascended to heaven and disappeared off the face of the earth?

As the reading from Corinthians points out, we are now the Body of Christ on earth.

We are *all* -- every one of us -- *important* parts of this body! Do not underestimate yourself. God created you and brought you into the Church because you can make a significant difference. No one else can do what you can do, the way you can do it, in the plans that he has for making this world a better place.

We Christians are, as a community of believers, the Body of Christ on earth. Every time we receive the Body of Christ in Holy Communion, we receive what we are, and thus we're renewed in the continuation of Christ's ministry. His mission is our mission.

By receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, we consume not only Jesus in his full humanity and his full divinity, we also consume his ministry. The Spirit of the Lord comes upon us. Every Mass is a renewal of our vocation to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set the oppressed free, and to proclaim what is acceptable to the Lord.

In other words, every time we receive Jesus in the Eucharist, the scripture passage that he quoted in Luke 4:18-21 is fulfilled again.

Sin is anything that prevents this from happening.

Whenever the prayers of others are not answered, whenever evil is allowed to prevail, whenever souls suffer because they have not heard the good news of salvation in Jesus, it's because the parts of Christ's earthly body that can do something about it are not doing it. God provides everything that's needed on earth *through us*! Jesus continues his ministry on earth *through us*!

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How does it feel to know that you're called to continue Christ's ministry? Reflect on how important you are to the Body of Christ and his mission. What are you good at? What do you feel passionate about? What particular evils disturb you most? This is where you can make a difference!

Questions for Family & Community Faith Sharing:

Name ways that ordinary people can bring good news to the poor, or free captives, or help the blind see, or set the oppressed free, or proclaim what is acceptable to the Lord. What are your experiences doing this?

Living the Good News Today

"...in one Spirit, we were all baptized into one Body."

During our military service in the USAF, my husband Jeff and I had the unique privilege of welcoming two of our four children into our family while we were in the process of permanent change of station moves (1978 and 1983). Our second daughter was born in South Dakota, when we already had orders to Frankfurt, Germany. Three days after her birth, we visited the base photo lab to get her passport photos taken! Six weeks later, the movers came to our house to ship our household goods, some to Germany and others to long-term storage. We then departed to spend Christmas with both sides of our family in SD and NJ.

While we stayed with my family in Camden, we arranged our daughter's baptism in my home parish—the place where I had been baptized. To make things even more special, my senior year high school religion teacher and mentor was the presiding priest at her baptism. One of my vivid memories of her baptism was the beautiful recitation of the litany of saints, especially when Fr. Frank added our daughter's name to the end of the litany—a truly sacred moment!

Last weekend, Jeff and I attended a special presentation for lay Franciscan spiritual assistants at the Franciscan Spiritual Center in Aston, PA. The guest speaker was Fr. Regis Armstrong, OFM Cap, a renowned Franciscan scholar and faculty member (theology) of Catholic University of America. When Fr. Regis began his talk, he shared with us his invitation to teach an undergraduate course on mystical theology. He shocked his colleagues by developing his course around the sacrament of baptism and its profound mystical significance in the Christian life. As he taught this class, he told us that it was not uncommon for his students to spend 5-6 weeks contemplating the four questions that the celebrant asks when parents bring their children to the church door:

- 1. What name do you give your child?
- 2. What do you ask of God's Church for [name]?
- 3. You have asked to have your child baptized. In doing so, you are accepting the responsibility of training him/her in the practice of the faith. It will be your duty to bring him/her up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving by loving God and our neighbor. Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?
- 4. Are you [godparents] ready to help the parents of this child in their duty as parents?

As I listened to Fr. Regis describing his classes and why this was so important for them to appreciate, I found myself remembering conversations with my parents about why they had chosen the names for my three brothers and me. It also brought back a wonderful memory of sitting with my delightful mother-in-law to learn how she had named her seven sons and five daughters.

When Fr. Regis asked if we remembered (and celebrated) our baptismal dates like our own birthdays, it really made me appreciate what those students were taking away from "mystical theology." It is that same experience that I have every year at the Easter Vigil, when our baptism and that of those being welcomed into the Church that very night are so mystically tied to the death and rising of Jesus Christ. The singing of the litany of saints always makes my heart swell with joy...a long line of holy people in faith praying for us!

As part of his talk, Fr. Regis shared many quotes from Sacred Scripture, the popes, and the documents of the Second Vatican Council. He opened with a quote from *Lumen Gentium* (6):

"Through baptism we are formed in the likeness of Christ. 'For in one Spirit, we were all baptized into one Body.' (1 Cor 12:13). In this sacred rite, fellowship in Christ's death and resurrection is symbolized and is brought about."

As part of confirmation classes, we all learned the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, including fear of the Lord. The awe and wonder that are the essence of this particular gift can be savored in the words of St. Pope Paul VI, written in 1964:

"Those who are baptized and by this means incorporated into Christ's Mystical Body, His Church, must attach the greatest importance to this event. They must be acutely aware of being raised to a higher status, of being reborn to a supernatural life, there to experience the happiness of being God's adopted sons/daughters, the special dignity of being Christ's brothers/sisters, the blessedness, the grace, and the joy of the in-dwelling Spirit." (Ecclesiam Suam, 39)

Just as the Spirit led Jesus to the synagogue to read the scroll of Isaiah and to share the meaning of those glad tidings, we have also been gathered in this one Spirit of the Lord by baptism. At an audience on 18 April 2018, Pope Francis reminded the faithful of this sacramental gift:

"Baptism enables Christ to live in us and us to live united to Him, to collaborate in the Church, each one according to his condition, in the transformation of the world. Received only once, the baptismal cleansing illumines our whole life, guiding our steps to the heavenly Jerusalem...as happens with a seed full of life, this gift takes root and bears fruit in a terrain fed by faith. The baptismal promises that we renew every year in the Easter Vigil must be revived every day so that baptism "Christifies": we must not be afraid of this word. Baptism "Christifies" one who has received baptism and he is "Christified," resembles Christ, is transformed into Christ, and renders him truly another Christ."

Through our baptism, we became a new person in Christ—one Body made of many parts. With awe, wonder, and awareness, we can echo what Jesus said:

"The Spirit of the LORD is upon me."
