Parish Registration

Our Parish family warmly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by stopping by the Parish House during the office hours.

The Sacrament of Baptism

We welcome new life into the Church through the sacramental sign of Baptism which is celebrated **every Sunday of the month at 1:00pm** with the exception of Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole, at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 or stop in and pick up a Baptism packet.

Once the Baptismal Preparation class is attended, the form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates are turned in then a date for your child's Baptism will be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the certificates signed by the pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

We offer a Baptismal Prep Class for parents as a way of preparing them for their child's journey of faith. Classes are scheduled for the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30pm. Please contact the Parish Secretary to register.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form the following requirements must be met:

- If married, be in a valid marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- Completed the Sacraments of Initiation; Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Be a registered, active participant of a Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples wishing to celebrate and consecrate their love in the Sacrament of Marriage are asked to call the Parish Secretary, Michele O'Toole at 609-702-1848 ext. 301.

Arrangements are to be made with the Pastor a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend preparation sessions.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age, or who feels the need for the comforting presence of the Church's sacramental prayer life may be anointed. Please contact the Parish Office at 609-702-1848 ext. 301 during office hours. In the case of an emergency, please call and follow the instructions listed on our telephone message.

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The "Thief of Time" Project

Facilitated by Deacon Jim Casa

The winter is here, the cold is here, the snow is here, the long nights are here - time to curl up with a good book, so why not take part in the parish 'read the book - see the movie project?' This winter, we will enjoy a mystery, "A Thief of Time" by Tony Hillerman.

"A Thief of Time" is set in the present day American Southwest, in Navajo country. What begins as a missing person case soon develops into a complex web of crimes involving larceny, Native-American artifact looting, grave robbing, and murder. The veteran Lieutenant, Joe Leaphorn and the young Officer, Jim Chee (both of the Navajo Tribal Police), combine their experiences and their instincts to the crimes that, at first, appear remote and unconnected - but, things begin to change as they delve deeper into clues. The tension builds from the first page of Hillerman's very stylish 'who done it.'

Along the path to solving the mystery, Leaphorn and Chee meet a wide variety of memorable characters, and many of them seem to be involved with either the missing person's case or the murders or both. The characters seem to come from all walks of life. Some are highly educated scientists studying the culture of the Anasazi of the ancient Southwest. Some are shifty but likable charlatans. And others are business and trades people, like lawyers, national park employees, art dealers and collectors, and mechanics. All of them make an impression for your reading time. "A Thief of Time" is not only entertaining, but quite an informative one that brings to life problems that are germane to tribal life, today; indeed, "A Thief of Time" is not only a solid mystery novel, but a social justice story as well. Clearly, "A Thief of Time" has something for everyone.

So, begin your reading of "A Thief of Time" and save the date of Friday, March 27th at 7:30pm to gather at the Sacred Heart School Library to see the film version of the novel and then engage in a spirited open discussion of the story.

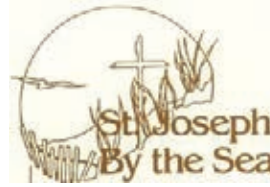

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Good News Reflection

The Epiphany of the Lord
January 5, 2020

Pray: I want to discover You, Jesus, my Savior, in the simple and wonderful things of every day. I want to announce Your greatness to the simple of heart. Amen.

Isaiah 60:1-6
Ps 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-13
Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6
Matthew 2:1-12

Where did the faith of the Magi come from?

The Season of Christmas includes the celebration of the arrival of the magi from the East. Let's consider the humble adoration of the magi for the Christ child. The magi were Gentiles, and the Greek word "magi" meant oriental scientists. Despite sometimes being translated as "astrologers", their visit to the manger does not validate astrology.

Because they were not Jews, their determination to meet the Jewish savior says much about what the word "epiphany" means. The magi are good examples of believing in the importance of Jesus even without understanding what it would mean to them personally or to the rest of the world.

They worshiped Jesus as a King-Messiah before they knew how he would become king or how his kingship would save the world from evil. As scientific scholars, they had studied religious writings from beyond the scope of their own culture. Then, they acted on faith in response to the Spirit of God who activated them, and it changed their lives.

Only the Spirit of God can move someone to have faith, because faith is a gift of the Holy Spirit (see 1 Corinthians 12). The word "epiphany" means discovery, a revelation that changes our lives. Epiphanies are gifts from God as he collaborates with our desire for new growth.

We can imagine how the magi felt when they experienced an epiphany in the presence of the Christ child. Although they did not understand how this baby from a poor family could become king, they remembered him for the rest of their lives and listened for news from the land of Israel about Jesus. We know that they heard about his crucifixion and learned what his followers were teaching about it, for they became Christians -- their relics have been venerated since very early times.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

What sign from God, like the star that the magi followed, are you waiting to see? What signs is God already showing you? These are evidence that he is working in your life. What epiphany -- new understanding -- is Jesus giving you about what God is doing in your life?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

God has given you faith to believe in Jesus as the Messiah. How do you act on this faith? And how do these actions evangelize non-believers?
