Parish Registration

Our Parish family gladly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by filling out a blue Registration Form located on the rack near the Altar Servers Sacristy in the vestibule of the Church or contacting Michele O'Toole, the Parish Secretary, by phone or email to have a Form sent to you.

The Sacrament of Baptism

Please see the Diocesan Directives for Baptism at (Baptisms).

The Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated on Sunday at 1PM but other times and days are possible. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to contact Michele by phone or <a href="mailto:email

Once the Baptism Preparation session is attended, the Baptism Request Form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates sent to the Parish House, a date for your child's Baptism can be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the Certificate signed and sealed by the Pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

Sacred Heart offers a Baptismal Preparation Session required for all parents preparing for their child's Baptism. The date and time for this Session is arranged at the convenience of the parents and the Priest or Deacon who will minister the Sacrament.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form from the Pastor of their parish, the Church requires the following:

- Must be at least 16 years of age.
- Received the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
- If married, be in a valid sacramental marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be a registered and practicing member of a Catholic Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Please see the Diocesan Directives for the Sacrament of Matrimony at (Weddings). Engaged couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony at our Parish are asked to contact Michele O'Toole, the Parish Secretary by phone or email. Arrangements are to be made at a meeting with the Pastor at least a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend Pre-Cana Sessions and a number of meetings with the priest or Deacon who will preside at the Wedding Mass/Ceremony Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age or wishes to receive the comfort and grace provided by this Sacrament may contact Michele O'Toole by phone or email. In case of an urgent need for this sacrament please call our emergency number at 609-267-8940.

Care of the Sick, Homebound and Elderly: The sick, the homebound and the elderly are valued members of our Parish. Please contact Merry Marcellino, our Coordinator of Ministries by phone or email to see how we may be of assistance.

Funerals

Please see the Diocesan Directives for Catholic Funerals at (Funerals). In all cases, the family of the deceased parishioner should contact the Funeral Home. They, in turn, will contact the Church to make further arrangements. Normally, a member of our Parish Staff will then contact the family to plan the Liturgy and provide any other assistance.



The Columbiettes Honor Jessica Donohue for her dedication in helping our Parish through the pandemic.

On May 9th, 2021, the Columbiettes Santa Maria 1179 was proud to honor someone who has proven to be a very special person to our parish time and time again. This past year has been challenging for us all. We found ourselves quarantined, in our homes, sometimes cut off from the outside world. It quickly became a time that could truly be defined as traumatic, stressful and uncertain. As every part of our lives were tested, our church was not immune to the impact of Covid-19. The doors were closed and we all found ourselves with no access to the very home we come to in order to be with the Lord.

Mister Rogers was once quoted as saying "look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping". It was something his mother would say to him as a child when something was scary. This year we needed "helpers" more than ever before. We knew all the frontline workers and essential workers were doing what they could to keep our country running. But during it all, we had a "helper" of our own. Mrs. Jessica Donohue emerged as our helper. She knew we as a parish, needed to know our home of worship would be ok and that we as a parish would be ok. So she stepped up in a way that could only be described as inspiring.

Once the doors to Sacred Heart shut, she went into action. As the Director of the Religious Education Program, she began revamping the program so that our children were not without the support of the Catechists. Google Classroom became her best friend. She considered the needs of the students and made sure each individual family had the support they needed and ensure the children in the program continued on schedule. As learning and retreats went to an online platform

and sacraments were postponed, she remained in constant communication with all the catechists and families.

Jessica did not stop there though. She began sending Parish Updates which included information beyond the Religious Education program. Jessica kept us connected and updated on information from the parish as well as the Diocese through email and Facebook.

After what seemed like an eternity, our doors opened again and we were welcomed to gather. During Advent, Jessica knew that many parishioners were still not coming to mass and did not feel safe to do so. So tapping into her technical skills, she took Sacred Heart to YouTube and brought mass to those at home via live stream.

Despite how we had adapted to everything going on, Jessica knew we still needed to feel connected. So, again being called to action, Jessica began a Wednesday night meeting which allowed all who wanted to attend to gather and pray the rosary.

Jessica we know you do all of this while simultaneously being a wife, a mother, a daughter and a student. We know you are always there when we need you and we are all so proud to call you ours. Lastly, thank you to your family for always sharing you. We see their sacrifice as well and appreciate all you do for us. Thank you for your unwavering dedication to our parish.

Good News Reflection

Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord May 16, 2021

Moving forward with the Holy Spirit

Sometimes we find ourselves in the same posture as the disciples in today's first reading, looking up at the sky where we last saw Jesus, not moving, just staring at nothing, waiting for him to come back and do something to rescue this world from its evil.

It seems like he's not finished. There's more he should be doing. Our world needs the Second Coming of Christ -- and now! What's the delay?

Ahhh, but he's told us not to stand about gawking and waiting but to go forth and spread the Good News. He told us to take what he's given us and use it to serve others, to make a difference somewhere, somehow, to someone.

Why do we stare at the empty sky? Because we feel inadequate.

Parents know this feeling. After giving birth or adopting a child in an amazing partnership with God the Giver of Life, we have the awesome task of raising this tiny human into a faith-filled, emotionally healthy adult. Wow. More than a few miracles will be needed.

Graduates know this feeling. After completing college or a Lay Ministry training program or ordination or final vows, we stand on the threshold of working for the Lord and wonder: Will I be effective and successful? Will I like it? Or will I be sent where I'd rather not go?

Those who are grieving know this feeling. After a loved one is taken home to the Lord or a friend is lost in a failed relationship, our lives change drastically. It feels like it shouldn't have. How can we recover from the emptiness, which by its very nature forces our attention onto ourselves and our unmet needs, so that we become full of service to others?

Every change in our lives is a commissioning. Every loss is the beginning of a new calling. Every experience is training for a work of God's kingdom that the Lord wants to accomplish through us.

Why are you standing there looking at the sky? Jesus has been your teacher and your guide: Although you cannot see what he's doing now, he has not abandoned you. He is fulfilling his promise: "You will receive power from the Holy Spirit, and you will be my witness throughout the earth." Indeed, you were given that Holy Spirit in baptism, and it is this Spirit of God that empowers you to continue the ministry of Jesus using your particular gifts and talents and experiences.

We must confidently raise our foot to step forward and, while it's still in mid-air, ask: "Okay God, where do You want me to place this foot down next?" If we remain centered on the Lord, we will not lose our balance. The Holy Spirit will do the work of Christ on Earth through us.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

What thresholds or new beginnings are you facing? How are these opportunities for the continuation of the ministry of Jesus?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

In what ways are you doing the works of Jesus? Which parish ministries could use your gifts and talents? How do you rely on the Holy Spirit to get it done?
