Parish Registration`

Our Parish family gladly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by filling out a blue Registration Form located on the rack near the Altar Servers Sacristy in the vestibule of the Church or contacting Michele O'Toole, the Parish Secretary, by phone or email to have a Form sent to you.

The Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated on Sunday at 1PM but other times and days are possible. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to contact Michele by phone or <a href="mailto:email

Once the Baptism Preparation session is attended, the Baptism Request Form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates sent to the Parish House, a date for your child's Baptism can be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the Certificate signed and sealed by the Pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

Sacred Heart offers a Baptismal Preparation Session required for all parents preparing for their child's Baptism. The date and time for this Session is arranged at the convenience of the parents and the Priest or Deacon who will minister the Sacrament.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form from the Pastor of their parish, the Church requires the following:

- Must be at least 16 years of age.
- Received the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
- If married, be in a valid sacramental marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be a registered and practicing member of a Catholic Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Sacrament of Matrimony at our Parish are asked to contact Michele O'Toole, the Parish Secretary by phone or email. Arrangements are to be made at a meeting with the Pastor at least a year in advance of the requested date. At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend Pre-Cana Sessions and a number of meetings with the priest or Deacon who will preside at the Wedding Mass/Ceremony Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age or wishes to receive the comfort and grace provided by this Sacrament may contact Michele O'Toole by phone or email. In case of an urgent need for this sacrament please call our emergency number at 609-267-8940.

Engaged couples who wish to celebrate the

Care of the Sick, Homebound and Elderly: The sick, the homebound and the elderly are valued members of our Parish. Please contact Merry Marcellino, our Coordinator of Ministries by phone or email to see how we may be of assistance.

Funerals

In all cases, the family of the deceased parishioner should contact the Funeral Home. They, in turn, will contact the Church to make further arrangements. Normally, a member of our Parish Staff will then contact the family to plan the Liturgy and provide any other assistance.



Good News Reflection

Feast of The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

December 26, 2021

Pray: Beloved Jesus: Give me the grace of being aware of the ways I stray from You and renewing a firm decision to resume the path which leads me to re-encounter You. Amen.

Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 or 1 Samuel 1:20-22, 24-28

Trusting the truths we don't understand

"Joy mixed with drama marks the fifth [joyful] mystery," wrote Saint John Paul II in his encyclical on the Rosary, *Rosarium Virginis*Mariae (paragraph #20), as he reflected on today's Gospel story about Mary and Joseph losing the boy Jesus and finding him in the Temple. "Here he appears in his divine wisdom as he listens and raises questions, already in effect one who 'teaches'."

This scripture, he pointed out, reveals that Jesus was already wholly dedicated to his Father's affairs. That's the first part of the mystery: How early did he feel inspired to serve as the Son of God?

The second part of the mystery, John Paul II explained, is "the radical nature of the Gospel, in which even the closest of human relationships are challenged by the absolute demands of the Kingdom." Which relationships? Family relationships! In this scripture, Mary and Joseph faced the challenge that every parent experiences. They were "fearful and anxious," because they did not understand what was happening to their child.

Today, we are like Mary and Joseph in their moment of failing to understand the words of Jesus. His teachings challenge us to accept a more difficult life, a life of doing good to our enemies, taking a stand against injustices, standing up for Christian values, getting persecuted for it, turning the cheek and going the extra mile, a life of courageously adhering to the ways of God.

Our preference, when it's inconvenient or unpleasant to be so holy, is to rationalize and make excuses for any behavior that the world says is good and right but which contradicts the Church's scripture-based teachings. However, if we are sincere about following Christ, we are willing to do what is difficult. And it's usually in the doing that we begin to understand the benefits of becoming more like Christ.

Without this understanding, however, we have to trust that the words of Jesus are truth. Like Mary and Joseph, we need to ponder in our hearts what we do not understand and at the same time move forward in holy living. Then we discover the joy that comes from a life that's lived wholly in Christ.

On this Feast of the Holy Family, let us pray that Mary and Joseph will help us hear Jesus whenever our troubles or temptations get so distracting that we lose sight of him. Let us learn to recognize that Jesus is always present with us in his Holy Spirit, helping us, guiding us, and mercifully loving us, especially in the challenges we face.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

What teaching of the Church have you rationalized away so that you don't have to obey it? Or what teaching of Christ do you excuse yourself from? Assume that your disobedience is due to not understanding what is really being taught. What will you do to seek and gain a better understanding?

Questions for Faith Sharing:

How meaningful is the Holy Family to you? What is it about the relationships between Jesus, Mary and Joseph that appeals to you? What has this taught you about Christian living?

Living the Good News Today

"All who heard Him were astounded."

When the current school year started, we learned that the parish would soon be starting a program to train new altar servers. Because our twin grandchildren were now in fourth grade, they were eligible. When our daughter told them about this, they were so excited (and so were we as grandparents). After their training concluded, there was great anticipation for Advent to arrive and the altar server schedule to require commitments. On the first weekend of Advent, my husband Jeff and I were very conscious of the many families that we knew whose children were serving for the first time, so joyful to see their children serving the Lord with gladness.

While visiting my 91-year old uncle, I mentioned to him that our grandchildren were preparing to be altar servers. With a mischievous grin on his face, he asked me how they were doing with their Latin responses. He took great pride in sharing his own experiences as an altar server during the late 1930s and throughout World War II while his older brothers were serving overseas. The pastor of our Camden parish frequently requested Uncle John and his best friend to serve. We had to laugh as he recounted the story of serving at midnight Mass one Christmas Eve until almost 3 AM, and then leaving with the monsignor to celebrate the first Christmas Mass for the Little Servant Sisters of the Immaculate Conception in Cherry Hill before the sun rose. He said he was too tired to think of presents!

Our families are the privileged places where we form the values in our lives, learn the traditions that are important in our heritage, and lay the foundation for a strong faith commitment. The call to holiness begins at our Baptism, but only because our families desired us to have a life with Christ.



On the Sunday between Christmas and the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God (January 1st), the Church celebrates the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. This weekend's Gospel tells us that Jesus was 12

years old (equivalent to a 6th grader) when He accompanied His parents to Jerusalem. As the family started their return to Nazareth, Jesus stayed behind without His parents' knowledge, giving them a five-day search to find Him finally in the temple area with the learned teachers. St. Luke tells us that "All who heard Him were astounded." Just imagine an adolescent in such a sacred setting, listening intently, asking profound questions, and speaking with wisdom that astonished the elders. Did they wonder what great things that God hand

in mind for this young boy, as happened so many generations before when Hannah dedicated her son Samuel to the Lord and left him with the prophet Eli?

In 1994, the United Nations declared the International Year of the Family. Pope St. John Paul II decided to bring this theme into the Church and celebrated the First World Meeting of Families from 8-9 October. In 2022, the Church will observe the X World Meeting of Families in Rome from 22-26 June. The theme is: *Family Love: A Vocation and A Path of Holiness*. Even though we may not journey to Rome to be part of this event, we can still participate as families in this faith-building event, striving to capture the spirit of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

While visiting the website for the Tenth World Meeting of Families

(http://www.laityfamilylife.va/content/laityfamilylife/en/sezione-famiglia/incontri-mondiali-delle-famiglie/wmof2022.html).

I found a link called "Catechesis," which directed me to a page that offered seven catecheses for families on the spiritual journey to the World Meeting:

- 1. Vocation and family;
- 2. Called to Holiness;
- 3. Nazareth: Making Love Normal;
- 4. We Are All Children, We Are All Brothers;
- 5. Fathers and Mothers:
- 6. Grandparents and the Elderly;
- 7. Excuse Me, Thank You, Sorry.

Although each catechesis lent itself to use by families of all generations, it was the seventh catechesis that intrigued me the most. I tried to imagine our family reading the reflection together and then following the instructions of the catechesis:

Points of discussion for couples/for families

Give examples where we could learn to say in our families:

- May I
- Thank you
- Pardon me

When did I say, "May I", "thank you", "pardon me" today? Points of discussion within the community

 Are we capable of saying "May I," "thank you," "pardon me" in our community, in our relationships with one another?

While the words may seem so simple, they require diligence and sincerity to put into practice.

In his epistle this weekend, St. John reminds us that we are to love one another as Christ commanded us. The Holy Family exemplifies a profound love of God in their relationships as mother, father, and obedient Son. As 2022 begins, let us cherish our own relationship in God's extraordinary love:

"Beloved, we are God's children now."
