Parish Registration

Our Parish family gladly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by filling out a blue Registration Form located on the rack near the Altar Servers Sacristy in the vestibule of the Church or contacting Michele O'Toole, the Parish Secretary, by phone or [email](#) to have a Form sent to you.

The Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated on Sunday at 1PM but other times and days are possible. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to contact Michele by phone or [email](#) to have a Baptism Information packet mailed to you.

Once the Baptism Preparation session is attended, the Baptism Request Form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates sent to the Parish House, a date for your child's Baptism can be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the Certificate signed and sealed by the Pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

Sacred Heart offers a Baptismal Preparation Session required for all parents preparing for their child's Baptism. The date and time for this Session is arranged at the convenience of the parents and the Priest or Deacon who will minister the Sacrament.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form from the Pastor of their parish, the Church requires the following:

- Must be at least 16 years of age.
- Received the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
- If married, be in a valid sacramental marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be a registered and practicing member of a Catholic Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony at our Parish are asked to contact Michele O'Toole, the Parish Secretary by phone or [email](#). Arrangements are to be made at a meeting with the Pastor at least a year in advance of the requested date.

At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend Pre-Cana Sessions and a number of meetings with the priest or Deacon who will preside at the Wedding Mass/Ceremony

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age or wishes to receive the comfort and grace provided by this Sacrament may contact Michele O'Toole by phone or [email](#). In case of an urgent need for this sacrament please call our emergency number at 609-267-8940.

Care of the Sick, Homebound and Elderly:

The sick, the homebound and the elderly are valued members of our Parish. Please contact Merry Marcellino, our Coordinator of Ministries by phone or [email](#) to see how we may be of assistance.

Funerals

In all cases, the family of the deceased parishioner should contact the Funeral Home. They, in turn, will contact the Church to make further arrangements. Normally, a member of our Parish Staff will then contact the family to plan the Liturgy and provide any other assistance.

- Opportunities to purchase memorial bricks in memory of loved ones will be offered again this fall. Details and our order form will soon be available.

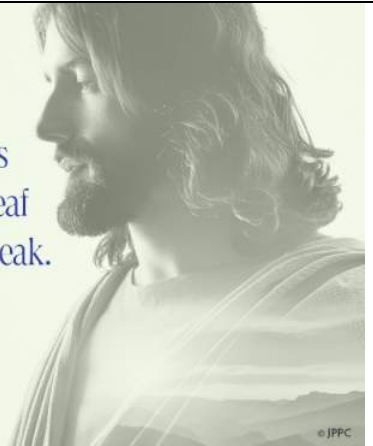

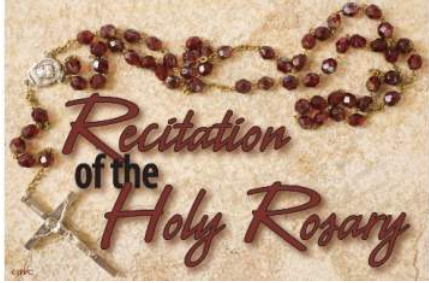

Come and See *Cabrini*



The Cabrini Project - a look at the life of St. Frances Cabrini - comes to a close on September 22nd when we will gather in the Sacred Heart Library at 3pm to see the recently released and highly acclaimed film, *Cabrini*, directed by Alejandro Monteverde.

Cabrini may prove to be one of the best movies of the decade. It is sensationally written, and inspiringly acted by Cristiana Dell'Anna, who perfectly embodied the zest, tenacity, love and indelible determination to be a missionary to her fellow immigrants of New York and America. It is artfully told with tremendously good cinematography, script, acting, editing and score. The scenes of turn-of-the-century New York (and even of the Vatican), transport you back to a time when immigrants were hated and discriminated against, children were easily orphaned by death and disaster, and there was little, if any, help or dignity for these urchins of America. But Mother Cabrini is a triumph by the way she stubbornly works to see that they are given dignity, clothes, food and a place to sleep away from the sewers and rats. The storyline proceeds to show the obstacles, hardship, and disdain which Cabrini surmounts.

Cabrini is a story that reminds us of what one person, guided by the love of Christ, can do to better the lives of all people. After we view *Cabrini*, our discussion should be very lively and spiritually uplifting.

Living the Good News Today

“Be strong; fear not!”

In August, my husband Jeff’s home parish in SD celebrated its 125th parish anniversary. Our local history is so much different from SD’s because of our proximity to the coastline, where explorers first came to North America.

Reflecting upon the founding of this small Catholic parish in 1899, Jeff and I spoke about the courage and tenacity that it took to bring the Catholic faith into new places, keeping in mind that:

- 1861: The Dakota Territory was founded.
- 1877: Pope Leo XIII was elected Holy Father (served for 25 years until 1903).
- 1879: Laura Ingalls and her family spent their first winter homesteading in DeSmet, SD.
- 1887: Pope Leo XIII challenged both St. Katharine Drexel and St. Frances Cabrini to become missionaries to unique needs in the US.
- 1889: SD became the 40th state in the Union.
- 1890: Wounded Knee Massacre of Native Lakota Sioux men, women, and children occurred.
- 1891 (May 15): Pope Leo XIII issued the historical encyclical “*Rerum Novarum*” (On Capital and Labor).
- 1899: St. Mary’s Church in Dell Rapids, SD, was founded.

In this weekend’s readings, the Prophet Isaiah tells us that the Lord speaks to those with frightened hearts: *“Be strong; fear not!”* Throughout the millennia of history, God has been present to His people through those whom He sends to do His work. In SD, St. Katharine Drexel provided funding for mission schools on Native American reservations to minister to the needs of people who were being displaced from their ancestral lands. Life was difficult and dangerous during those times, but faith enabled people to form strong communities who believed in God’s promises.

For several months, our parish bulletin has been promoting Deacon Jim Casa’s “*Cabrini Project*,” in which we have been invited to read Theodore Maynard’s biography “*Too Small a World: The Life of Mother Frances Cabrini*” and watch the movie in Sacred Heart School Library on September 21st.

When Pope Leo XIII invited Mother Cabrini to take on a missionary assignment to Italian immigrants in 1887, he had not personally witnessed the difficulties that families were having when they arrived in America in search of employment and a new life. The movie does an excellent job of showing the challenges that those families faced: squalor, sickness, parental loss, and a great disdain for immigrants with language and economic barriers. Despite her frail health, Mother Cabrini was strong and fearless, taking her missionary activity into other key cities in the US and offering hope to those who were struggling.

When Pope Leo XIII issued his encyclical in 1891, he had great concern over the rapid growth of the Industrial Revolution and the negative effects it was having on the working classes. The Church’s foundational social teaching is on the life and dignity of the human person. Throughout the world, there were people like Mother Cabrini who were serving in difficult situations, always taking to heart the Gospel message to be present to others in their needs as Christ is present to His Church. We can be assured that those courageous religious servants provided inspiration for the encyclical: *“Every minister of holy religion must bring to the struggle the full energy of his mind and all his power of endurance. Moved by your authority, venerable brethren, and quickened by your example, they should never cease to urge upon men of every class, upon the high-placed as well as the lowly, the Gospel doctrines of Christian life; by every means in their power they must strive to secure the good of the people; and above all must earnestly cherish in themselves, and try to arouse in others, charity, the mistress and the queen of virtues. For, the happy results we all long for must be chiefly brought about by the plenteous outpouring of charity; of that true Christian charity which is the fulfilling of the whole Gospel law, which is always ready to sacrifice itself for others’ sake, and is man’s surest antidote against worldly pride and immoderate love of self; that charity whose office is described and whose Godlike features are outlined by the Apostle St. Paul in these words: ‘Charity is patient, is kind, . . . seeketh not her own, . . . suffereth all things, . . . endureth all things.’”*

On the 100th anniversary (1991) of the encyclical, Pope St. John Paul II issued his “*Centesimus Annus*” encyclical about how enduring “*Rerum Novarum*” still was to the world’s hunger for Gospel living (still is): *“Love for others, and in the first place, love for the poor, in whom the Church sees Christ Himself, is made concrete in the promotion of justice. Justice will never be fully attained unless people see in the poor person, who is asking for help in order to survive, not an annoyance or a burden, but an opportunity for showing kindness and a chance for greater enrichment. Only such an awareness can give the courage needed to face the risk and the change involved in every authentic attempt to come to the aid of another.”* (58)

There is still time to get a copy of the biography, learn more about a particular saint’s remarkable life of selfless service, and then watch the “Cabrini” movie with fellow parishioners to see how this particular saint can offer us perspectives on how we are to welcome the poor in our midst with the same spirit that St. James described in his epistle. Inspiration...gratitude...

“Praise the Lord, my soul.”

Good News Reflection

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Is 35:4-7a

Open Your Heart with the Word of God and the Healing Grace of His Sacraments.

“Ephphatha”– Be opened! Jesus used this command to heal the deaf man with a speech impediment. Jesus performed (and still performs) many miracles without any tangible contact with the beneficiary; however, the Church believes that the signs and gestures He used to heal the man that day laid the foundation for the Seven Sacraments. He continues to give us His healing and sanctifying graces through His “touch” offered in the Sacraments, normally through clergy as His instruments. In the Sacrament of Baptism, for example, the Church includes this *epiphatha* rite, asking that the newly baptized become open to the Word of God in his or her life.

Among crowds of people, many who were seeking healing, Christ chose this man to heal. What about all the other people who were flocking to Jesus, hoping to be healed, that did not get chosen for immediate healing? Did it mean He didn’t care for them? Not at all. Jesus loves everyone and

was present with them, too, just as He continues to be with all those whose hearts are open in trust to His love, truth, and grace. Jesus’ gift of healing comes in different forms in the perfect timing and way we need, whether for our body or soul. We must believe and follow Jesus, the Son of God, and His teachings as we live our lives, love Him wholeheartedly, and trust in His perfect love and saving grace.

Just as the deaf man was healed in this Gospel’s miracle story, Christ continues to encourage all believers to “be opened” to the healing graces and spiritual nourishment of His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Sacrament of the Eucharist and the healing Sacrament of Penance. We trust that the form of healing that God will grant us through our belief in Christ the Healer will always be what God, who loves us for eternity, deems best for our soul.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How have you experienced God’s healing presence in your life or witnessed it in someone else? How has God used you as an instrument of healing for another person?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

How can we demonstrate that we are trying to “be open” to God’s sanctifying graces in our lives?

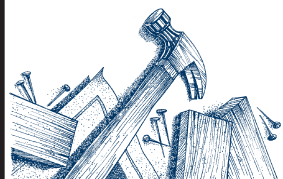
