Parish Registration

Our Parish family gladly welcomes new members. Please register at your earliest convenience by filling out a blue Registration Form located on the rack near the Altar Servers Sacristy in the vestibule of the Church or contacting Michele O'Toole, the Parish Secretary, by phone or [email](#) to have a Form sent to you.

The Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism is usually celebrated on Sunday at 1PM but other times and days are possible. We encourage parents who wish to have their child baptized to contact Michele by phone or [email](#) to have a Baptism Information packet mailed to you.

Once the Baptism Preparation session is attended, the Baptism Request Form completed and the Godparent Eligibility Certificates sent to the Parish House, a date for your child's Baptism can be set.

Baptismal Preparation

Catholic Godparents are required to complete an Eligibility Certificate and have the Certificate signed and sealed by the Pastor of the parish where they are currently registered and practicing their faith.

Sacred Heart offers a Baptismal Preparation Session required for all parents preparing for their child's Baptism. The date and time for this Session is arranged at the convenience of the parents and the Priest or Deacon who will minister the Sacrament.

Sacramental Sponsorship Letter

This is a form required to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. To receive this form from the Pastor of their parish, the Church requires the following:

- Must be at least 16 years of age.
- Received the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.
- If married, be in a valid sacramental marriage according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Be a registered and practicing member of a Catholic Parish.

The Sacrament of Marriage

Engaged couples who wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony at our Parish are asked to contact Michele O'Toole, the Parish Secretary by phone or [email](#). Arrangements are to be made at a meeting with the Pastor at least a year in advance of the requested date.

At least one person should be a registered member of the parish. All couples are required to attend Pre-Cana Sessions and a number of meetings with the priest or Deacon who will preside at the Wedding Mass/Ceremony

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Any Catholic who is seriously ill, advanced in age or wishes to receive the comfort and grace provided by this Sacrament may contact Michele O'Toole by phone or [email](#). In case of an urgent need for this sacrament please call our emergency number at 609-267-8940.

Care of the Sick, Homebound and Elderly:

The sick, the homebound and the elderly are valued members of our Parish. Please contact Merry Marcellino, our Coordinator of Ministries by phone or [email](#) to see how we may be of assistance.

Funerals

In all cases, the family of the deceased parishioner should contact the Funeral Home. They, in turn, will contact the Church to make further arrangements. Normally, a member of our Parish Staff will then contact the family to plan the Liturgy and provide any other assistance.

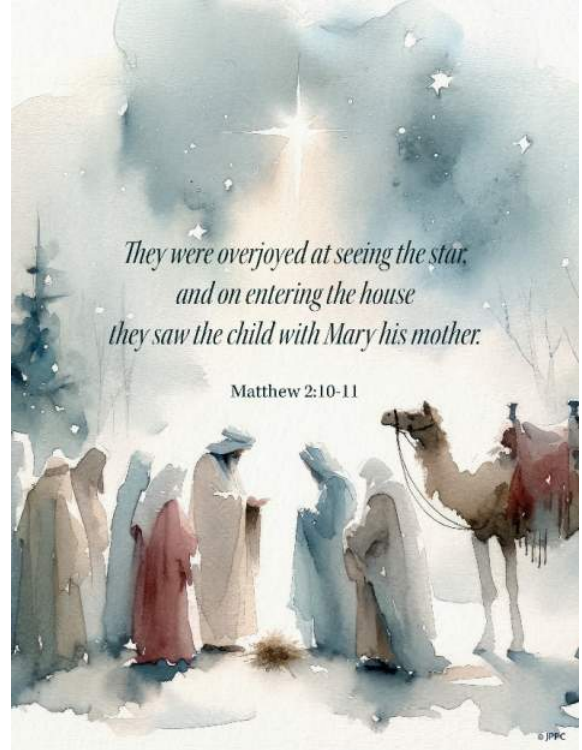

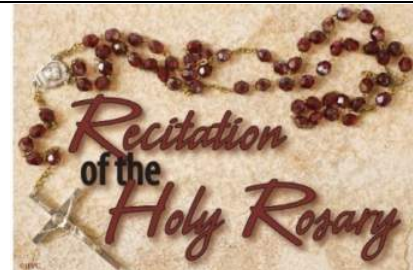

Cry, the Beloved Country
- Deacon Jim Casa

Over the past two decades of Sacred Heart Parish's 'read the book - see the movie' projects, we have explored important themes in literature and society. In *Dead Man Walking*, it was the death penalty and the Christian response; in *Still Alice*, it was Alzheimer's disease and dementia; in *The Grapes of Wrath*, it was the exploitation of the American poor; in *The Diary of Anne Frank*, it was antisemitism and the Holocaust; in *Dolores Claiborne*, it was domestic violence, to mention a few. For the coming winter project, our focus will be racial inequality in Alan Paton's powerful novel of South Africa, *Cry, the Beloved Country*.

Published in 1948, *Cry, the Beloved Country*, is the deeply moving story of a Christian pastor, Fr. Stephen Kumalo and his son, Absalom, set against the background of a land and a people torn by racial injustice. Paton's novel is a classic work of love and hope, courage and endurance, born of the dignity of the human condition. Indeed, *Cry, the Beloved Country* is a story that has the capacity to change hearts and minds. It is a story of the power of redeeming love and forgiveness.

New Republic magazine calls it "the greatest novel to emerge out of the tragedy of South Africa, and one of the best novels of our time."
Published during a period of heightened racial tensions at the dawn of apartheid in South Africa, *Cry, the Beloved Country* contributed to global awareness of the country's internal struggles. Paton's poignant prose and exploration of human suffering and compassion transcend the novel's specific historical context, making it a timeless reflection on redemption and hope.

So, do place *Cry, the Beloved Country* on your Christmas gift wish-list and begin reading this awesome story. For the major award nominated movie, we will gather on Sunday, March 2nd, to see the film version of the novel, starring James Earl Jones and Richard Harris, and then enjoy an open discussion.

Living the Good News Today

"We saw His star at its rising..."

One of the longer Christmas Carols is the hymn "We Three Kings," which tells the story of the magi "following yonder star" to see the newborn King. Jesus was born in Roman-occupied Palestine, where the emperor allowed the token presence of a Jewish king (Herod), but leaving no doubt that the Hebrews were under the jurisdiction of the imperial Romans. Interestingly, there had already been two centuries of trade route use that spanned the Mediterranean countries from the west all the way to China in the east. This would later be called the Silk Road.

Scripture scholars believe that the magi came from Persia (Iran), where they probably served as Zoroastrian priests. Many of the magi were learned and accomplished astrologers. There were no powerful telescopes during their timeframe. What did the naked eye see when looking at the heavens in the darkness of the desert expanse? What prompted them to follow the star to wherever it would lead them? Were they curious about ancient prophecies, even if they were not their own? How would this change their lives forever?

From St. Matthew's Gospel reading, we know that the star led the magi to Bethlehem in Judea, arriving in nearby Jerusalem and declaring: "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? **We saw His star at its rising and have come to do Him homage.**" Just imagine what local people were thinking as they observed these Gentile foreigners visiting their surroundings in search of a newborn king! Were they incredulous that people who were not Jewish would make such a long and difficult trip to satisfy their curiosity? What had convinced them to come with the intention of doing Jesus homage?

In the pattern of our days, the stars begin to appear as the sunset darkens the skies around us. Amateur astronomers know that constellations change with the seasons as the Earth moves around the sun and open windows for us to the many facets of the universe. Would we be willing to follow a star to see where it leads us?

One of my favorite missionary evangelization stories is the account of the French Jesuits ministering to Native American tribes in North America not long after their founding by St. Ignatius of Loyola. While working with the Huron and Wendat people in Saint Marie among the Hurons (Canada), St. John de Brebeuf, SJ, wrote a carol in their language called "*Jesous Ahatonhia*," which was translated into English in 1926 by Jesse Edgar Middleton. The carol enabled the Native people to understand in common terms what the visits of the shepherds and the magi meant at the birth of Christ.

These words from "The Huron Carol" capture the reverence of the homage that was done by the magi:



The earliest moon of wintertime
Is not so round and fair
As was the ring of glory
On the helpless Infant there.
The chiefs from far before Him
knelt
With gifts of fox and beaver pelt.

"Jesus your King is born, Jesus is born, In excelsis gloria."

More than two thousand years later, what are the gifts of our present time that we would offer as homage to the King?

The word "epiphany" captures the manifestation of something wondrous. At the birth of Jesus, angels visited the shepherds in the fields and announced the birth of the Savior. They were filled with wonder. For the magi, a star would rise to show them the way to the newborn king. When the star which they had been following settled over the place where the Child was, they were overjoyed. The first extraordinary encounter of Gentiles with the Messiah took place because God wanted the Good News to be revealed.

In his "Urbi et Orbi" message for Christmas 2023, Pope Francis asked us to turn our eyes to Bethlehem and listen to the first faint cries of the Prince of Peace:

"Jesus Christ is also the way of peace. By His incarnation, passion, death and resurrection, He has opened the way that leads from a world closed in on itself and oppressed by the dark shadows of enmity and war, to a world that is open and free to live in fraternity and peace. Brothers and sisters, let us follow that road! Yet in order to do so, to be able to walk behind Jesus, we must divest ourselves of the burdens that weigh us down and block our way. What are those burdens? What is that dead weight? The same negative forces that prevented King Herod and his court from acknowledging and welcoming the birth of Jesus: attachment to power and money, pride, hypocrisy, falsehood. These forces hold us back from going to Bethlehem; they exclude us from the grace of Christmas and they block the entrance to the path of peace."

All over the world, there is a longing in people's hearts. This longing can only be satisfied by the love of God, which is offered to all people who have faith that God is always there for us. After the birth of Jesus, God's plan of salvation unfolded by the public ministry of both St. John the Baptist and Jesus, carried on by the apostles and disciples who knew Jesus personally. All of those first followers, including St. Paul after his conversion, understood how the reign of God would fulfill the words of Psalm 72:

"All nations shall serve Him."

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

It truly is “the most wonderful time of the year” and this story of the Visit of the Wise Men is yet another lyrical element of the Christmas story. Into the drab stable cave come these Gentile visitors from the Orient richly dressed in vibrant colors. Whatever is of gold in their garb catches the light of the fire there. We can also hear the tinkling of the bells on the camel harness as the stately animals make their moves. They are a stark contrast to the locals gathered.

Analyzing Matthew’s story, a bit makes us wonder. How many visitors were there? Three or thirteen? After all, it’s the number of gifts they brought that makes us compute the group size. Along the way, these exotic visitors became the Three Kings. Tradition further conferred names on them: Caspar (who is made black), Balthazar and Melchior in the Western Church.

Their gifts became highly significant. Gold highlights the kingship of Jesus. The frankincense His divinity. The Myrrh, an embalming fluid no less, stands for Christ’s redemptive suffering. We can see that this story is more than meets the eye.

Remembering that Matthew wrote his gospel for Jewish converts to Christianity, we must recognize his main point: Jesus came for Gentiles as well as Jews. He is the designated Savior of all mankind.

This last aspect of the story had to be a challenge for Matthew’s readers. They had a long tradition behind their generally accepted belief that Yahweh God had chosen

them as His people. That is true even in our own time. But this was a choice that had to call for expansion. Otherwise, God is rendered too small. Believers in the myriad Gentile gods had to know that paradise was an option for them that entailed belief in the one supreme Lord.

We contemporary believers must maintain an immense respect for the children of Abraham. After all, as the Roman Canon declares: “Abraham (is) our father in faith.” The baby Jesus came to us as a Jew. The Blessed Mother and St. Joseph were good practicing Jews. So were most of Our Lord’s closest early followers. Anti-antisemitism has no place in a Christian heart. That evil threatens the beautiful poetry of this feast on this first Sunday of the new year. The axiom is true: “Wise men still seek Him.”

“We three kings of Orient are
Bearing gifts, we traverse afar,
Field and fountain, moor and mountain,
Following yonder star.”

Rev. Peterson’s Reading & Gospel Summary

Reading I: Isaiah 60: 1-6

All parts of the world will process to Jerusalem. There they will rebuild the city in prosperous times.

Reading II: Ephesians 3: 2-3a, 5-6

The author recounts Paul’s role in announcing the divine plan. Its main point is the new inclusion of the Gentile world.

The Gospel: Matthew 2: 1-12

Jesus’ birth is inserted into the political and social context. The wise men represent the Gentile world coming to Christ.
