

Confirmation Service Ideas/Examples

The following service projects were done by Confirmandi in the previous years and can be adapted to fit your schedule:

- mentoring younger children at the local school, religious education class, library, Special Olympics (**can be done at home with a sibling or family member over Facetime**)
- visiting elderly in hospitals or retirement communities (like Virtua Rehabilitation Center or Brookdale Senior Living) or helping an elderly neighbor or family member (**make cards or inspiring posters for patients in retirement communities or rehabilitation care or help rake leaves for an elderly neighbor or grandparent**)
- organizing a clothing drive or food drive for items to be collected and then donated to an organization (Good Counsel Homes, St. Vincent de Paul, Christine's Hope for Kids, Burlington County Animal Shelter, First Way, Code Blue Shelter)
- preparing food and dropping the meal off to the TASK (Trenton Area Soup Kitchen), Extended Hands Ministry or a neighbor going through a difficult time due to an illness or death in the family
- working on projects at home to help organizations like Hug Wraps, Newborns in Need or Samaritan Hospice

Rewarding experiences have been shared and we hope you are inspired, too:

"The best parts of my service was to serve the elderly and listen to them.... I learned that comforting is very important. I comforted elderly just like how Jesus comforted others." LC

"My favorite part of my activity was cheering the athletes with disabilities. I say that because I really enjoyed seeing the athletes with disabilities laugh and look happy. I enjoyed that because of giving them my time, they had a smile on their face." GM

"Jesus always thought about others before himself. As an American teenager, sometimes I am selfish, self-centered, and don't think about others as often as I should. These volunteer experiences helped me to think and do for others." IH

"Seeing their faces so happy and thankful, made me happy. The most difficult part was seeing how much people needed help. " NS

"Jesus made sure that everybody had faith and trusted in him. By giving all these supplies for the children, I am hoping that they will have hope in Jesus and that their mothers may believe as well. Jesus also supplied others with what they needed, whether it be spiritually or physically. I hope that by giving these children what they needed, the mothers would understand that people still care for them and pray for them every day." CC

"During our visit to TASK, I witnessed many people in need and who are struggling. Many of them have no job, family or home. It makes me realize how grateful I am for my family and home." CF

Important Notes Regarding Service

Volunteering with the St. Vincent de Paul Society -

Each year we have many families inquiring about children serving with the SVDP Society for Confirmation service. Please note that, due to the needs of the SVDP Society, volunteers must be committed to regular, ongoing service; as such, unless a family is committed to this (children must have an adult present in order to volunteer in the pantry), it is best for a child to offer his or her service in another way or participate with the Mini Vinnies.

Other ways to contribute -

If there is an organization with which your child would like to volunteer but cannot due to age restrictions, encourage him or her to be creative and find other ways to support the work of that organization. For example, even if you are unable to make the necessary commitment to be a St. Vincent de Paul volunteer, you could hold a bake sale or canned food drive to raise money for the SVDP food pantry.
