23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time September 6, 2020

<u>FOCUS:</u> Love your neighbor as yourself.

Our readings today work together to teach us about the real obligations of the law, which include gently correcting one another so that our communities may be in harmony. Paul explains how we must do this, and do all things, with love. and Jesus promises to remain with us always.

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

In the first reading, the Lord tells Ezekiel that he will be held responsible for the death of the wicked one if he does not speak out to dissuade [him] from his way. Paul writes that the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. In the Gospel, Jesus gives instructions for correcting another, gives authority to bind and loose, and promises where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.
